The Commandments in the Old Testament

1. According to Jewish tradition, the Torah (the compilation of the first five books of the Hebrew Bible: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy) contains **613 commandments** (in Hebrew, *taryag mitzvot*). The Hebrew word *mitzvah* (singular of *mitzvot*) refers to a commandment commanded by God to be performed as a religious duty. (Wikipedia)

The 613 commandments include "positive commandments", to perform an act (*mitzvot aseb*), and "negative commandments", to abstain from an act (*mitzvot lo taaseb*). The negative commandments number 365, which coincides with the number of days in the solar year, and the positive commandments number 248, a number ascribed to the number of bones and main organs in the human body. (Wikipedia)

The most famous enumeration of the 613 commandments was by Maimonides. (check this weblink: <u>https://www.jewishvirtuallibrary.org/the-613-mitzvot-commandments</u>).

2. Of these 613 commandments, the ones revealed by God to Moses at Mt. Sinai are the most important (cf. Ex. 20:2-17; Deut. 5:6-21).

Jesus, Himself acknowledged the 10 commandments (Decalogue) in his dialogue with the rich man: "If you wish to enter into life, keep the commandments." (cf. Mt. 19:16-20)

In fidelity to Scripture and in conformity with the example of Jesus, the tradition of the Church has acknowledged the primordial importance and significance of the Decalogue. Ever since St. Augustine, the Ten Commandments have occupied a predominant place in the catechesis of baptismal candidates and the faithful. The Ten Commandments state what is required in the love of God (the first three) and love of neighbor (the other seven). (Catechism of the Catholic Church #2064-67).

I encourage you to read the Catechism of the Catholic Church's explanation on each of the commandment to have a better understanding on how to apply them in our daily lives (CCC 2052-2557). This will help us appreciate more the value of the commandments in our journey to the Father.

3. In Mark 12:28 (cf. Mt. 22:36), one of the scribes asked Jesus, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" In this account, it seems that the scholars of the law were divided about which of the many commandments is the greatest.

Jesus replied by quoting what is already in the Hebrew scriptures: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." (Mk. 12:30; Dt 6:4–5) This is the most famous prayer of the Jews.

Shema Yisrael is a Jewish prayer that serves as a centerpiece of the morning and evening Jewish prayer services. (Wikipedia)

And Jesus added, *You shall love your neighbor as yourself.*' *There is no other commandment greater than these.*" (Mk. 12:31; Lev. 19:18)

Jesus is the first one known to have explicitly combined these two commandments. For Him they are inseparable. One expresses the other.

John the apostle said, "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also must love one another. No one has ever seen God. Yet, if we love one another, God remains in us, and his love is brought to perfection in us." (1 Jn. 4:11-12)

Note: Biblical texts are from the New American Bible.

Los mandamientos en El Antiguo Testamento

1. Según la tradición judía, Mitzvá es una palabra hebrea que significa "mandamiento." La palabra se usa en el judaísmo para referirse a los **613 preceptos bíblicos** de la Torá (los primeros cinco libros de la Biblia): Génesis, Éxodo, Levítico, Números, Deuteronomio. (Wikipedia)

Los 613 preceptos bíblicos incluye "mandamientos positivos" para realizar un acto (*mitzvot aseh*), y "mandamientos negativos", para abstenerse de un acto (*mitzvot lo taaseh*). Hay 365 mandamientos negativos que coincidan con el número de días en el año solar, y 248 los mandamientos positivos, un número atribuido al número de huesos y órganos principales en el cuerpo humano. (Wikipedia)

La enumeración más famosa de los 613 mandamientos fue por Maimónides. (comprueben este weblink: <u>https://</u><u>www.jewishvirtuallibrary.org/the-613-mitzvot-</u><u>commandments</u>).

2. De estos 613 mandamientos, los revelados por Dios a Moisés en el Monte Sinaí son los más importantes (cf. Ex. 20:2-17; Deut. 5:6-21).

Jesús mismo reconoció los 10 mandamientos (Decologo). En su diálogo con el hombre rico, el le dijo: "Si deseas entrar en la vida, guarda los mandamientos." (cf. Mt. 19:16-20)

Fiel a la Escritura y siguiendo el ejemplo de Jesús, la Tradición de la Iglesia ha reconocido en el Decálogo una importancia y una significación primordiales. Desde san Agustín, los "diez mandamientos" ocupan un lugar preponderante en la catequesis de los futuros bautizados y de los fieles. Los diez mandamientos enuncian las exigencias del amor de Dios y del prójimo. Los tres primeros se refieren más al amor de Dios y los otros siete más al amor del prójimo. (Catecismo de la Iglesia Catolica #2064-67).

Los animo a leer la explicación del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica sobre todos los mandamientos para saber cómo aplicarlos en nuestra vida diaria (CIC 2052-2557). Esto nos ayudará a apreciar más el valor de los mandamientos en el camino hacia el Padre.

3. Segun San Marcos 12:28 (cf. Mt. 22:36), uno de los escribas le preguntó a Jesús, "¿*Cuál mandamiento es el más importante de todos?*" Parece que los eruditos de la ley estaban divididos acerca de cuál de los muchos mandamientos es el más grande.

Jesús respondió citando las escrituras hebreas: "Amarás al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, y con toda tu alma, y con toda tu mente, y con toda tu fuerza." (Mc. 12:30; Dt 6:4–5) Esta es la oración más famosa de los judíos.

Shemá Israel (Sp. Escucha, Israel) es el nombre de una de las principales plegarias de la religión judía. (Wikipedia) Y Jesús añadió, *"Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo"*. *No hay otro mandamiento mayor que estos.*" (Mc. 12:31; Lev. 19:18)

Jesús es el primero conocido que ha combinado explícitamente estos dos mandamientos. Para Él son inseparables porque uno expresa al otro.

San Juan el apóstol dijo, "Amados, si Dios así nos amó, también nosotros debemos amarnos unos a otros. A Dios nunca lo ha visto nadie. Si nos amamos unos a otros, Dios permanece en nosotros y Su amor se perfecciona en nosotros." (1 Jn. 4:11-12)
