Pentecost in the Old Testament

There are three major pilgrimage festivals in Judaism: *Pesach* (Passover), *Shavuot* (Weeks or Pentecost), and *Sukkot* (Tabernacles, Tents or Booths) when all Israelites who were able would make a pilgrimage to the Temple in Jerusalem, as commanded by the Torah.

Three times a year you shall celebrate a pilgrim feast to me. You shall keep the feast of Unleavened Bread. You shall also keep the feast of the grain harvest with the first fruits of the crop that you sow in the field; and finally, the feast of Ingathering at the end of the year, when you collect your produce from the fields. Three times a year shall all your men appear before the LORD God. (Ex. 23:14-17; cf. Ex. 34:22-23; Lev. 23)

All three of these feasts required that "first fruit" offerings be made at the temple as a way of expressing thanksgiving to God. The Feast of Firstfruits at the time of the Passover included the first fruits of the barley harvest. The Feast of Weeks was in celebration of the first fruits of the wheat harvest, and the Feast of Tabernacles involved offerings of the first fruits of the olive and grape harvests.

Observe the month of Abib by keeping the Passover of the LORD, your God, since it was in the month of Abib that the LORD, your God, brought you out of Egypt by night. You shall offer the Passover sacrifice from your flock and your herd to the LORD, your God, in the place the LORD will choose as the dwelling place of his name. (Deut. 16:1-2)

You shall count off seven weeks; begin to count the seven weeks from the day when the sickle is first put to the standing grain. You shall then keep the feast of Weeks for the LORD, your God, and the measure of your own voluntary offering which you will give shall be in proportion to the blessing the LORD, your God, has given you. (Deut. 16:9-10)

You shall celebrate the feast of Booths for seven days, when you have gathered in the produce from your threshing floor and wine press. For seven days you shall celebrate this feast for the LORD, your God, in the place which the LORD will choose; since the LORD, your God, has blessed you in all your crops and in all your undertakings, you will be full of joy. (Deut. 16:13 & 15)

Shavuot, the plural of the Hebrew word *sheba* or *shibah* meaning "week" or "seven", tells that this festival happens exactly seven weeks (i.e., "a week of weeks") after Passover. In biblical Greek it is called *Pentecosté* due to its timing after Passover. *Pentecosté* meaning "fifty" in Greek and *Shavuot* occurring fifty days after the first day of *Pesach*/Passover.

This counting of days and weeks expresses anticipation and desire for the giving of the Torah. On Passover, the Israelites were freed from their slavery in Egypt; on *Shavuot*, they were given the Torah and became a nation committed to God.

During rabbinic times the *Shavuot*/*Pentecosté* festival became associated with the giving of the Law at Mount Sinai, which is recounted in the Torah readings for the festival. The traditional Scripture readings are from Exodus 19 and 20, preparing for and receiving the Ten Commandments. It was also customary during *Shavuot* to read the Book of Ruth - the story of the redemption of Ruth is set during the barley and wheat harvests.

El Pentecostés en el Antiguo Testamento

Hay tres fiestas de peregrinaje del pueblo hebreo: *Pesach* (La Pascua), *Shavuot* (Las Semanas or Pentecostés), and *Sukkot* (los Tabernáculos, las Tiendas o Cabañas) cuando todos los Israelitas que podían hacer una peregrinación al Templo en Jerusalén, según lo ordenado por la Torá.

Tres veces al año me celebrarán fiesta. Guardarás la Fiesta de los Panes sin Levadura. También guardarás la fiesta de la siega de los primeros frutos de tus labores, de lo que siembres en el campo, y la fiesta de la cosecha al fin del año cuando recojas del campo el fruto de tu trabajo. Tres veces al año se presentarán todos tus varones delante del Señor Dios. (Ex. 23:14-17; cf. Ex. 34:22-23; Lev. 23)

Las tres fiestas requerían que se hicieran ofrendas de "las primicias" en el templo como acción de gracias a Dios. La fiesta de la Pascua incluyó los primeros frutos de la cosecha de cebada. La fiesta de las Semanas incluyó los de la cosecha de trigo, y la fiesta de los Tabernáculos incluyó los de la cosecha de olivo y uva.

Observarás el mes de Abib y celebrarás la Pascua al Señor tu Dios, porque en el mes de Abib el Señor tu Dios te sacó de Egipto de noche. Sacrificarás la Pascua al Señor tu Dios con ofrendas de tus rebaños y de tus manadas, en el lugar que el Señor escoja para poner allí Su nombre. (Deut. 16:1-2)

Vas a contar siete semanas. Comenzarás a contar siete semanas desde el momento en que empieces a meter la hoz a la cosecha. Entonces celebrarás la Fiesta de las Semanas al Señor tu Dios con el tributo de una ofrenda voluntaria de tu mano, la cual darás según el Señor tu Dios te haya bendecido. (Deut. 16:9-10)

Durante siete días celebrarás la Fiesta de los Tabernáculos, cuando hayas recogido el producto de tu era y de tu lagar. Siete días celebrarás fiesta al Señor tu Dios en el lugar que escoja el Señor; porque el Señor tu Dios te bendecirá en todos tus productos y en toda la obra de tus manos; por tanto, estarás realmente alegre. (Deut. 16:13 y 15)

Shavuot, el plural de una palabra hebrea *sheba* or *shibah* significa "semana" or "siete", porque este festival ocurre exactamente siete semanas (i.e. "a week of weeks") de Pascua. En la palabra griega, se llama *Pentecosté*. *Pentecosté* significa "quincuagésimo día" y *Shavuot* ocurre cincuenta días después del primer día de la Pascua.

Este conteo de días y semanas expresa la anticipación y el deseo por la entrega de la Torá. En la Pascua, los israelitas fueron liberados de la esclavitud al faraón; en *Shavuot*, se les dio la Torá y se convirtieron en una nación comprometida al Señor.

Durante los tiempos rabínicos, el festival *Shavuot*/*Pentecosté* fue asociada con la entrega de la Ley en el Monte Sinaí, que se relata en las lecturas de la Torá para el festival. Las lecturas para *Shavuot* son de Éxodo 19 y 20, preparándose y recibiendo los Diez Mandamientos. También era costumbre durante *Shavuot* leer el Libro de Rut. La historia de la redención de Rut sucedió durante las cosechas de cebada y trigo.

In the New Testament, the coming of the Holy Spirit happened during the feast of the *Shavuot/Pentecosté*:

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. (Acts of the Apostles 2:1-4)

For Christians, on that day, the law received in Old Testament is now inscribed in their hearts. And the prophecy of Jeremiah is fulfilled:

See, days are coming - oracle of the LORD - when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant I made with their ancestors the day I took them by the hand to lead them out of the land of Egypt. They broke my covenant, though I was their master - oracle of the LORD. But this is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel after those days - oracle of the LORD. I will place my law within them and write it upon their hearts; I will be their God, and they shall be my people. They will no longer teach their friends and relatives, "Know the LORD!" Everyone, from least to greatest, shall know me - oracle of the LORD - for I will forgive their iniquity and no longer remember their sin. (Jer. 31:31-34; cf. 2 Cor. 3:2-6)

En el Nuevo Testamento, la venida del Espíritu Santo ocurrió durante la fiesta de la *Shavuot/Pentecosté*:

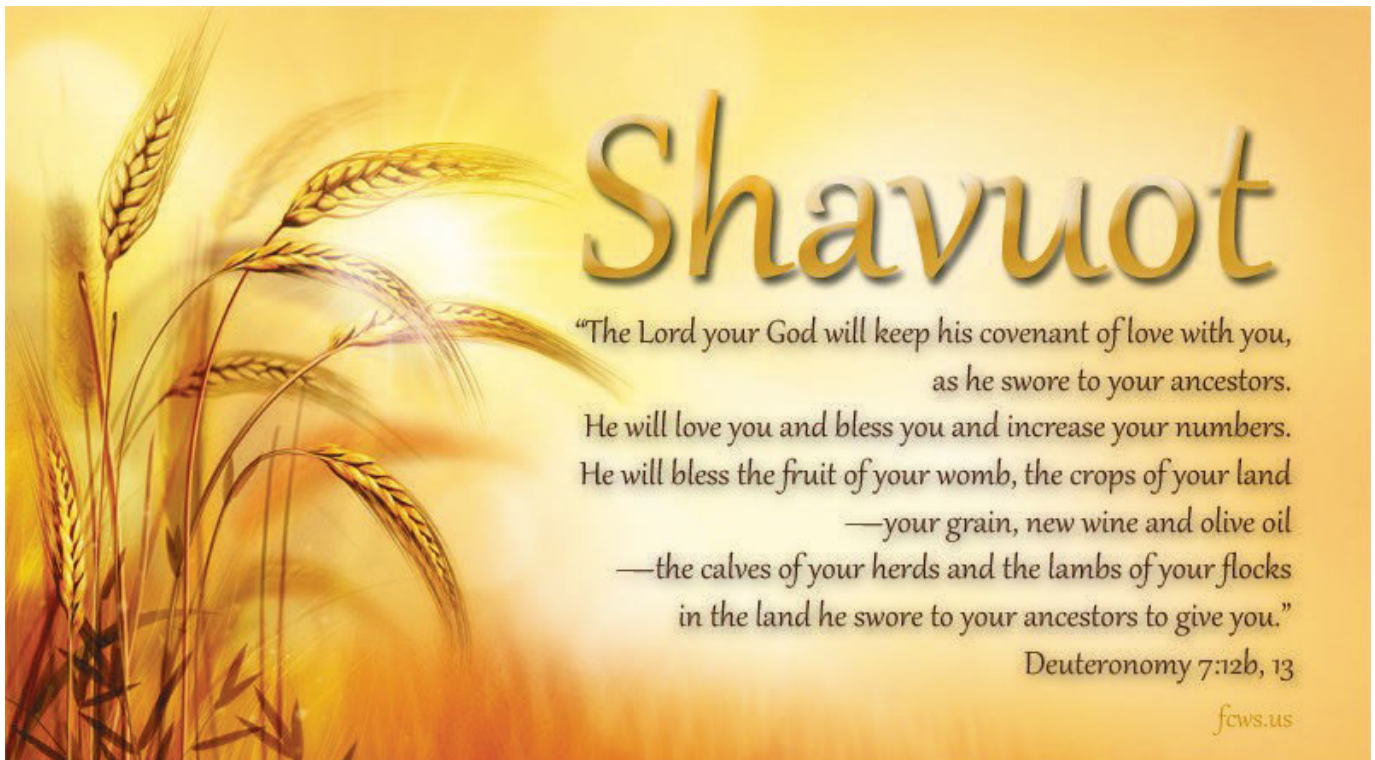
Cuando llegó el día de Pentecostés, estaban todos juntos en un mismo lugar, y de repente vino del cielo un ruido como el de una ráfaga de viento impetuoso que llenó toda la casa donde estaban sentados. Se les aparecieron lenguas como de fuego que, repartiéndose, se posaron sobre cada uno de ellos. Todos fueron llenos del Espíritu Santo y comenzaron a hablar en otras lenguas, según el Espíritu les daba habilidad para expresarse. (Hecho de los Apóstoles 2:1-4)

Para los cristianos, en ese día, la ley recibida en el Antiguo Testamento ya está inscrita en sus corazones; y se cumple la profecía de Jeremías:

Vienen días, declara el Señor, en que haré con la casa de Israel y con la casa de Judá un nuevo pacto, no como el pacto que hice con sus padres el día que los tomé de la mano para sacarlos de la tierra de Egipto, Mi pacto que ellos rompieron, aunque fui un esposo para ellos, declara el Señor. Porque este es el pacto que haré con la casa de Israel después de aquellos días, declara el Señor. Pondré Mi ley dentro de ellos, y sobre sus corazones la escribiré. Entonces Yo seré su Dios y ellos serán Mi pueblo. No tendrán que enseñar más cada uno a su prójimo y cada cual a su hermano, diciéndole: "Conoce al Señor", porque todos me conocerán, desde el más pequeño de ellos hasta el más grande, declara el Señor, «pues perdonaré su maldad, y no recordaré más su pecado. (Jer. 31:31-34; cf. 2 Cor. 3:2-6)

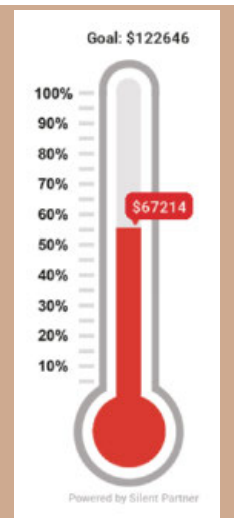
