Eucharistic Revival and Sacraments

I gathered a lot of inspiration from Fr. John's last homily. In his homily he held up his 60-year-old 1st Communion book that somehow managed to with him today, even after 19 different moves. For the past several months, I have witnessed families faithfully bringing their children to sacrament classes on the weekends. Can you imagine the profound love they have for their children? The great sacrifices as a family and commitment! I can't even manage to make it to my tire rotation appointments at discount tires. Seriously. These holy families are the hope and future of our faith. As Fr. John went on to say, every Catholic school he attended is now closed. His old Diocese of Buffalo is closing 1/3 of all parishes this year. The town he was raised in went from 5 parishes to 2, maybe even 1.

Why? Simple. Satan, or as in today's Gospel, Beelzebul. We have heard from many apparitions, saints, and servants, that Satan is out to attack families, the sanctity of marriage and life itself. This is why our St. Paul families and their children need our prayers. As Jesus is instructing the crowds because they thought his "powers" was by a demon, but clearly points out, a demon is successful when they can cause division. The demonic power comes from separation, so it will bring more people to his/her side. *"If a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand."* Anytime there is division, there is a foundational separation and an open gateway to destruction. Division doesn't mean everyone has to agree. Rather, it is beyond a certain agreement or ideology. It is how you allow that to enter your relationships (especially familial) in a damaging way. It is leaving our own ideas and remembering our core beliefs. There are Catholics that allow division between Catholics. Wow – Satan loves that. Jesus' teaching today is so powerful in today's social media divisions.

In our parish staff meeting, everyone could say that they are the only one, or only a few of their family who keep practicing the faith. But there is hope! Why? because in God's wisdom he gave us his only Son, and the covenant that his will NEVER separate his love for us. And because we are in great need to be reminded, God gave us the source and summit of our faith, Holy Communion. We need the Eucharist every day! Every day we need to nourish so we don't become separated, divided, or even allow any other gateway of discord into our life, our family life, and our journey of holiness.

Spend time reflecting on words from St. Paul (second reading). St. Paul's letter is wonderful. We HAVE the same spirit of faith! Everything indeed is for us! "the grace bestowed in abundance on more and more people".

Folks, we have 20 children who will receive their 1st Communion next weekend. And we have another 10 children who will be receiving their 1st Reconciliation. These children will be receiving Jesus Christ himself in Holy Communion. Think about that! NOTHING will separate God's love. As adults we need to be witnesses of faith to our children. We need to demonstrate the abundance that St. Paul is telling us so in turn, we are united in one love, Jesus Christ.

This is your assignment. Take out any pictures, books, or memories from your own 1st Communion! Look and meditate on it. How did this one sacrifice your parents did to show you to God's abundant love. For my 1st Communion, my mother actually sewed my white dress. I was horrified because I wanted to have a new dress like my classmates. Now, it brings tears when I pull it out of the old box. I also possess the 1st Communion book of my husband. I haven't had the courage to discard after he passed.

Friends, the 'blasphemes against the Holy Spirit' is when we deny God and deny his love. This will divide us. If we don't believe in God, the demon is so happy with that division. Let us acknowledge the love from Holy Communion and all the sacraments. This week pray diligently for our children and especially for their families. We need to be united always.
