



The Creed

How often do we attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and just zone out and lose track of where we are in the Mass?

Do we realize what we are saying after the silence following the homily? I admit that some of my homilies have probably put more than a few people to sleep, but we need to pay attention to what we are called to proclaim.

Many years ago, I used to train the altar servers at another parish. I would practice with them on a weekly basis, and we would walk through the entire Mass. I would stop before the Creed and tell them to pay attention to what they are saying. I would tell them, if you do not believe what you are about to say, don't say it. If you do not believe it, come and talk to me in private so we can walk together and find what is keeping you from believing in what we proclaim in the creed. I offer that to all who read this.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 185, states:


"Whoever says 'I believe' says 'I pledge myself to what we believe.' Communion in faith needs a common language of faith, normative for all and uniting all in the same confession of faith."

186 From the beginning, the apostolic Church expressed and handed on her faith in brief formulae for all. (1) But already early on, the Church also wanted to gather the essential elements of its faith into organic and articulated summaries, intended especially for candidates for Baptism:

This synthesis of faith was not made to accord with human opinions, but rather what was of the greatest importance was gathered from all the Scriptures, to present the one teaching of the faith in its entirety. And just as the mustard seed contains a great number of branches in a tiny grain, so to this summary of faith encompassed in few words the whole knowledge of the true religion contained in the Old and New Testaments. (2)

- 187 Such syntheses are called 'professions of faith' since they summarize the faith that Christians profess. They are called 'creeds' on account of what is usually their first word in Latin: *credo* ('I believe'). They are also called 'symbols of faith.'"

The Keynote speaker was Ramona Trevino, the Outreach Director of the International association of 40 DAYS FOR LIFE. Her inspirational speech before approximately 2500 persons, described her transition from a former manager of a Planned Parenthood abortion facility to a member of 40 DAYS FOR LIFE organization.

She credited the prayers of 40 Days for Life participants praying outside her abortion facility with helping her change her life.


