Corpus Christi

—*Reflection by Fr. Michael Gazzingan*

Our first reading from the Book of Exodus today speaks about blood and sprinkling in blood. “Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar.” It is quite hard for us, modern people, to understand this ancient ritual. In the Old Testament, our ancestors considered blood as a sign of life, a sign of commitment and a sign of bonding with God and with others. As modern people we no longer use blood for those same reasons. Personally, I feel weak and fainting when I see fresh blood, any blood. When I have blood tests, I become more prayerful!

Our second reading Christianizes the Old Testament ancient practice of the use of blood. The reading explains that human blood or the blood of animals is only temporary but the blood of Christ is forever. Jesus is God and man and the shedding of His blood brings us eternal life.

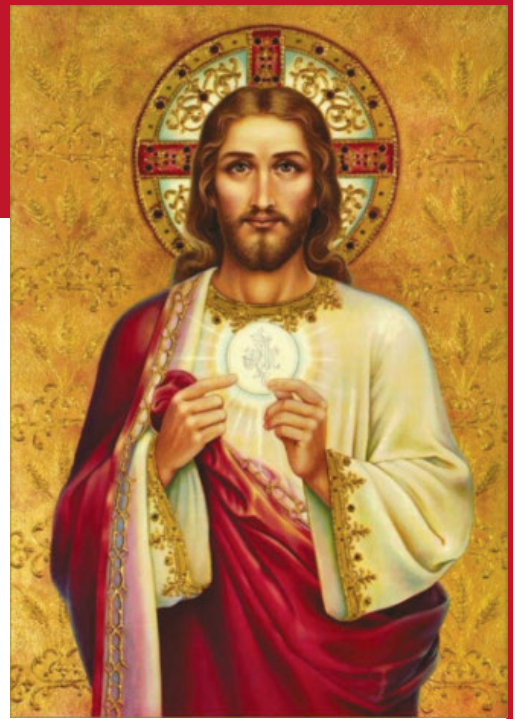
The Gospel today relates to us what happened in the Last Supper of Jesus with his disciples. During that Last Supper, Jesus took bread and said, “This is my body...” Then to the cup, “This is my blood. Let us take note that he did not say, “This bread symbolizes my body, this cup represents my blood.”

Jesus becomes truly present in the Eucharistic Sacrifice. Some early Christians left the faith because they did not understand the meaning of the real presence. At that time there wasn't any vocabulary or Philosophy or Theology to explain the “real presence.” In Roman Catholicism and some other Christian churches, the doctrine, which was first called transubstantiation in the 12th century was introduced. This doctrine aims at safeguarding the literal truth of Christ's presence while emphasizing the fact that there is no change in the empirical appearances of the bread and wine. While the substance of the species, the bread and wine, is changed, their appearance and characteristics remain.

While some of the early believers left because of their lack of understanding of the real presence, there were some who embraced this teaching as a part of faith. When Jesus makes Himself present to us in the Eucharist, it allows us to develop a deep and personal relationship with the living God. This would not be possible if the Eucharist is only symbol and not reality. So those who believe that Christ is truly present have a different relationship with God.

When we live in a personal and close relationship with Jesus, our way of living the Christian life is different. We will learn to love the Holy Eucharist more than ever because it is personal encounter with the living God. We are thence more inspired to attend and consciously participate in the mass. We will begin to look at the mass as it is truly a thanksgiving for the gift of relationship with God. We hunger for Jesus more and thirst for him. We will no longer see the mass as an obligation to fulfill but an occasion to satisfy our spiritual needs and desires.

Today as we celebrate this Solemnity, let us rejoice in the presence of the Lord. Let us deepen our love with the living God. Let us be aware of how much He loves us. May we respond every day with our own love, giving thanks for the gift of this Eucharist and rejoicing in the presence of the Lord.

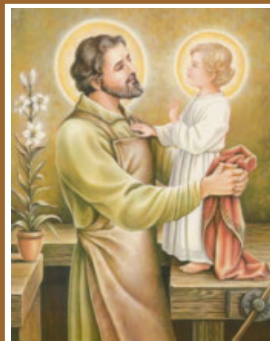

We have now begun the fourth quarter of this fiscal year. Thank you for your continued support of the mission and ministries of our parish. For the month of **APRIL** our average weekly collection was **\$22,735**. You also generously donated to various important causes in our **APRIL** second/special collection at **\$12,147 (\$3,037/week)**

This brings our **APRIL** weekly average to **\$25,772**.

We budgeted our Sunday Offertory income (minus special collections) for the current fiscal year (*44 weeks x \$22,000*) at **\$968,000** and received **\$1,034,000 (+\$66,000)**. We will use the extra income for the continuing maintenance and improvements to our parish campus buildings and grounds. As you know, we are dependent upon your practice of good stewardship to fulfill our parish mission. The love these gifts represent will enable us to continue the work we must undertake here at Saint Nicholas and Saint William Parish. Your generosity helps us more than you can imagine.

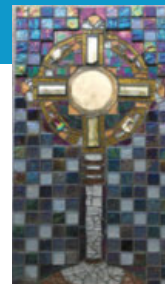
Have You Completed Your Initiation?

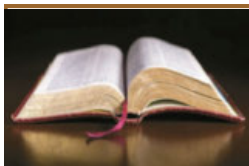
sick and homebound

HUNGER KNOWS NO SEASON

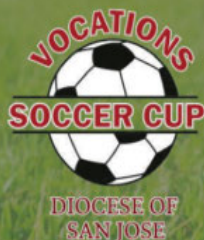
