

Repentance as a necessary means to bear good fruits

—Reflection by Fr. Johannes Busch

People are in shock: How is this possible? Why did God allow this to happen? An unbelievable thing occurred: the faithful in the temple, in the most sacred place in all of Jerusalem, were killed! However, their constatation does not last long, they soon find an explanation: those murdered in the temple are the ones to be blamed. Whoever dies like this must have committed a very grave sin! That is why God punished them in this most cruel way!

This way of thinking was very common in Jesus' time. It is an idea of God that we find throughout the Old Testament: If one follows all of God's commandments, God blesses his or her life - in return, if someone does not follow God's plans, if someone sinned, he or she will be punished. In ancient Rome this was summarized with the simple words Do ut Des: I give so that you give. This is why illnesses at Jesus' time were to be understood as a punishment by God. Jesus, however, makes clear that God does not work like that! If I'm fine, if I've never had an accident, if, unlike other people, I'm still alive, it's not a reason to feel superior. On the contrary: Nothing one achieves in life can be taken for granted. If you are fine, it's a great gift from God!



I often think about how lucky I have been to have been born in Germany: I never had to worry about money for my studies because they were free, I grew up in one of the safest countries in the world with one of the best social networks in the world. Yet, that was not my merit. I was just lucky to be born there. And this is true not just when it comes to the country of origin, but for so many things in my and our life: If I am healthy, it might be because of a healthy lifestyle. However, many others take care of themselves and still get sick or die. If I have a good job, it may be because I have invested a lot of time in preparing myself. However, others have worked just as hard, and they do not even have the very basics to survive! The dead in the gospel did not die because they had more sins than the others! This could happen to anyone: the people in Ukraine, Yemen, and wherever there is conflict are experiencing this: Suddenly your house can be hit by a bomb or your husband can be shot dead in the street. Death can come at any time: in war, in a car accident, in illness. Jesus in today's Gospel reminds us: We are all sinners, and that is why we all need to repent.

Have you ever asked yourself the following question: If you were to die today, would you be ready to go and present yourself before God? Do you have enough "good works" to offer Him? Or do you feel the need to repent more? I am sure most of us would say "yes" to the last question.

Yet, the question arises, how can we repent? Repentance is more than just correcting a mistake or changing a bad habit. Repentance goes deeper than that. Repenting means above anything else turning to God. It means feeling how much we are loved by God and, consequently, to bear fruit! Just as the fig tree must bear fruit, so we, too, must bear fruit.

The fruits are the consequence of an attitude that recognize that what I am, I am, because God loves me. And there are many fruits that we bear once we realize this love: A fruit can be to have mercy on one's own mistakes, but even more so on the mistakes of others. A fruit can be to trust that God guides my life. A fruit can be to see my fellow men as beloved sons and daughters of God. A fruit can be that I stop being arrogant. A fruit can be that those around me feel welcome.

With his words, Jesus wants to encourage us to take repentance seriously during the time of Lent. If we think that God does not care about our repentance, we are wrong. That would mean not accepting his message or not taking it seriously. God is patient with us, indeed, but at the same time we are called to not only accept his love but also to act accordingly in order to bear abundant fruits.

Scrutinies with the Elect

On the Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent at the 8:00 am Mass, we will celebrate the rites of penance and purification with our Alison Raleigh, preparing to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. The purpose of these rites is to uncover all that would lead her away from Christ, so that she might

be able to come to a full Christian life. The support of a parish community is vital to this process. At the same time, these brief rites call us, the baptized, to uproot the sin in our lives to be more faithful to our baptism. We will be using Cycle A Readings.



No Baptism during Lent - In keeping with our parish tradition, the Sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated through the 40 days of Lent. Baptismal catechesis continues for parents and godparents of those children who will be baptized in the spring and summer. Contact the Parish Office to begin this preparation.


SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT - Jesus offers the parable of the fig tree to further illustrate this truth. The owner of the orchard came searching for fruit on a fig tree he had planted in his orchard. Finding no fruit on the tree after three years, he told the gardener to cut it down. But the gardener intercedes and asks for one more year to cultivate and fertilize the tree, hoping it would bear fruit in

the future. The fig tree was not dying; it simply wasn't doing much of anything at all. Can this be said of us and our lives as well?



We are all familiar with the three traditional actions of Lent – prayer, alms, and fasting. One action that combines all three is the Catholic Relief Society (CRS) Rice Bowl. We invite each household to pay attention to what we eat and

eat less, and combine this with prayers of thanks before meals, and prayers for the hungry. Consider taking home a Rice Bowl kit prepared by Catholic Relief Services. Learning how our simple actions make a big difference for many others worldwide. 75% of the Rice Bowl collection goes to help our overseas programs that provide relief and build sustainable programs for many under-resourced people. 25% of the Rice Bowl collection supports grants for parish programs in our diocese that feed the hungry. We will collect your Rice Bowls starting on Palm Sunday.

The season of Lent is a time to reflect on how we spend our time carefully. Do we make God our first priority, tending to our spiritual growth and sacramental life with diligence? Do we give the next priority to our loved ones, focusing intentionally on them each day without distractions from phones, screens, or thoughts of work? If not, now is the moment to repent of our waste of time or misplaced priorities on our use of time. God is merciful but just. Let's turn to Him and ask Him to make our lives fruitful while we still have time.

Fr. Andrew Dalton is a Catholic Priest of the Legionaries of Christ and an International Shroud speaker. He is a Professor of Theology at the Pontifical University Regina Apostolorum in Rome where he teaches Biblical Theology of the Passion of Christ. Fr. Dalton is a Board member of Othonia, an international organization that educates the public about the Shroud of Turin.



The presentation was developed by Othonia, a research group of the Science and Faith Institute of the Regina Apostolorum Pontifical University located in Rome, Italy.


