NOTES FROM GOD'S VINEYARD.

ANTICIPATING THE RESURRECTION On the second Sunday of Lent in each Lectionary cycle, the Gospel reading proclaims the story of Jesus' Transfiguration. This event is reported in each of the Synoptic Gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke. This year, in Lectionary Cycle B, we hear Mark's report of this event. The Transfiguration occurs after Peter's confession that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' prediction about his passion. After this, in each of these Gospels, there is also a discussion of the cost of discipleship. In his Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of Jesus' Resurrection. In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, Jesus instructs the disciples to keep secret what they have seen until after the Son of Man has risen from the dead. The disciples' confusion continues as they wonder what Jesus means by rising from the dead. The disciples cannot possibly understand Jesus' Transfiguration until they also witness his passion and death. We hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration early in Lent, but we have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we anticipate Jesus' Resurrection, even as we prepare to remember Jesus' passion and death.

THANKSGIVING MISSION ACCOMPLISHED Father Alvin noted in one of his journal books that at the beginning of the year (January) he reflects on the basics of faith, the ABCs so to speak. For him, St. Paul and his missionary journeys allow him to return to the fundamental call of Christ to spread the Good News of God's love especially to the poor and vulnerable. As he celebrates 30 years of being a priest, Father Alvin embarks on an actual journey to the Philippines and Mexico in thanksgiving for the gift of priestly ministry. Father Alvin has since returned from a wonderful thanksgiving mission that involved the rudimentary vocation of Christian life: faith, care for fellow human beings, formation and spiritual growth, family, friends, cultural festivities, food, and many other activities filled with fun and joy. Father Alvin appreciates the help of individuals and groups in accomplishing the goals: Futures Project, Knights of Columbus, Maureen Dutil, Pablo Romo and family, Sarah Wilson with catechism and Confirmation teachers, staff members, friends and all parishioners of St. Francis Solano.

2º Domingo de la Cuaresma

Iluminación para la esperanza en nuestra vida debe ser la experiencia de la Transfiguración. Pedro, Santiago y Juan acompañaron a Jesús, subieron a lo alto del monte para ver la manifestación de que Jesús era Dios. Fueron testigos de que junto a Jesús estaban Moisés y Elías, que conversaban con él y que eran los portavoces de la ley y los profetas. Para admiración de ellos, de una nube salió una voz que decía: *"Este es mi Hijo, el Amado, escúchenlo"* (Marcos 9, 7). Escuchar a Dios en la actualidad es difícil, estamos muy distraídos con tantas cosas. Debemos apagar el celular para darnos cuenta de la magnitud del mensaje de hoy.

Es una gracia, un don, el saber escuchar. Será por eso la insistencia de Dios en este domingo de que escuchemos al Amado. Jesús intentaba ayudar a sus discípulos a entender el mensaje de su Pasión, pero, era difícil para ellos. La Transfiguración indica la esperanza de que después de pasar por el Viernes Santo vendrá la resurrección. Hay que pasar por el sufrimiento para merecer la Gloria prometida. ¿Cómo escucho la palabra de Dios? ¿De qué modo la hago mía y la vivo? El Papa Francisco sobre este Domingo nos dice que *"La Fiesta de la Transfiguración del Señor nos recuerda que estamos llamados a vivir el encuentro con Cristo, para que iluminados por su luz, podamos llevarla y hacerla brillar en todas partes, como pequeñas lámparas del Evangelio que llevan un poco de amor y de esperanza"* (08-06-2021). ¡Escuchemos la voz de los marginados y hagamos algo por ellos!

Notas Del Viñedo de Dios

ANTICIPANDO LA RESURRECCIÓN. El segundo domingo de Cuaresma en cada ciclo del Leccionario, la lectura del Evangelio proclama la historia de la Transfiguración de Jesús. Este evento se relata en cada uno de los evangelios sinópticos: Mateo, Marcos y Lucas. Este año, en el Ciclo B del Leccionario, escuchamos el relato de Marcos sobre este evento. La Transfiguración ocurre después de la confesión de Pedro de que Jesús es el Mesías y la predicción de Jesús sobre su pasión. Después de esto, en cada uno de estos evangelios, también hay una discusión sobre el costo del discipulado. En su Transfiguración, vemos una anticipación de la gloria de la Resurrección de Jesús. En cada uno de los relatos de la Transfiguración, Jesús instruye a los discípulos a mantener en secreto lo que han visto hasta que el Hijo del Hombre haya resucitado de entre los muertos. La confusión de los discípulos continúa mientras se preguntan qué quiere decir Jesús con resucitar de entre los muertos. Los discípulos no podrán entender la Transfiguración de Jesús hasta que también sean testigos de su pasión y muerte. Escuchamos la historia de la Transfiguración de Jesús a principios de la Cuaresma, pero tenemos el beneficio de la visión retrospectiva. Al oírlo, anticipamos la resurrección de Jesús, incluso mientras nos preparamos para recordar la pasión y muerte de Jesús.

MISIÓN DE ACCIÓN DE GRACIAS CUMPLIDA. El Padre Alvin anotó en uno de sus libros diarios que a principios de año (enero) reflexiona sobre los fundamentos de la fe, el ABC por así decirlo. Para él, San Pablo y sus viajes misioneros le permiten volver a la llamada fundamental de Cristo a difundir la Buena Nueva del amor de Dios, especialmente a los pobres y vulnerables. Mientras celebra 30 años de ser sacerdote, el padre Alvin se embarca en un viaje real a Filipinas y México en acción de gracias por el don del ministerio sacerdotal.
