God and the Good Strong Wind

My only real memory of the Mackinac Island ferry was the physical sensation of the wind against my face. I remember, distinctly, that it hurt.

It surprised and confused me because wind had never felt painful before. Looking back now, I realize that it wasn't just the wind but the spray from the waves that crashed against the side of the ferry — that was what produced the sharp, biting sensation on my skin. But I couldn't have known that then, because my eyes were clamped shut. I refused to open them, even if I had, I would not have seen much, because my long hair was blown straight across my face.

I was four years old, and it was, in the immortal words of Winnie-the-Pooh, a very blustery day as my family made our way to Mackinac Island. I remember thinking I was going to die. I'm positive now that it wasn't really all that dramatic, but at four years old, you're awfully scared of a good strong wind.

Deep inside, aren't we all, really?

I think of the apostles who cannot recognize Christ — their friend — because he is doing something new. Something impossible. They are so sure he is a ghost, a sinister thing — children are always frightened of what they cannot understand.

And even when he reassures them, still Peter is not convinced. He demands, essentially, a miracle. He demands that Christ make him do what only Christ can do.

And even when the miracle takes place — he walks on water, he defies physics — still he is human. Scared, doubtful, distractible. No match for a good strong wind.

Question:


If we have a separation of church and state, how should faith influence the way we act in society, especially for those who have a role in the government?

Answer:

No matter who we are, our inner lives affect the way we interact with the world. In the United States, we have freedom of religion. That means there is no official state-sanctioned religion. This does not mean that our faith is a private affair with no impact on public life! We have the ability to freely exercise our religious beliefs in accord with our conscience. Not only do we have the option to do so, but we also have the responsibility.

We're called to imitate Christ in every area of our life, not compartmentalize our faith. This means acting with respect and honoring the common humanity all we encounter. It means recognizing the person behind the politics. It also means standing up for the truth of human life and dignity and advocating for just policies that serve the common good. The Vatican has produced a "Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church." It contains more detailed exposition of how our Catholic faith relates to various aspects of public life.

CASA ALITAS

MINISTRY

For nearly 10 years, Casa Alitas, with the help of a few dedicated staff, hundreds of committed volunteers, and the support of Catholic Community Services (CCS), has provided



invaluable humanitarian aid to the 250 - 300 refugees and asylum seekers who are brought to them every day by ICE and Border Patrol. Most are families:

parents, children and pregnant women; most are from Central America and Mexico. They have traveled here over several days or weeks, often spent weeks or more at the border, and then spent 2-14 days in detention before being released. They have come to join their families that are already in America and have a pre-set court date before they arrive at Casa Alitas.

We, at Santa Catalina, have generously supported Casa Alitas with financial donations, clothing, a sock and underwear drive and providing items for and assembling activity kits for children. Exciting things are going on now at Casa Alitas! In addition to what we have done in the past, we have additional opportunities to assist. On October 7th - 8th, we are planning a parish-wide activity kit and school supplies drive (followed by assembly of kits). The kits are used to entertain the children while their parents are filling out paper work and handling other important items. Because some children will be staying here and attending Tucson schools, we will be adding additional school supplies and backpacks to the kits. In January, we plan another sock and underwear drive.



We need your help!! When I asked the Casa Alitas Volunteer coordinator their greatest need, she said without hesitation, volunteers! To that end, we are planning half-day immersion visits to the sites which will include an opportunity to see firsthand the needs and how one could best assist. We also want to organize weekly or biweekly opportunities for volunteers to meet at

the church and car pool down to Casa Alitas to volunteer. Volunteers typically spend a few hours to a half day and offer support by providing hospitality, (distributing clothes, toiletries, and food, working with children's activities, laundry, etc.) as the guests await their journeys to reunite with family across the country.

HOW TO REPORT ABUSE

1. Call 911 to make a police report.

2. If the abuse happens in any other state, call the Police or Sheriff's Office in the specific area of that state.

3. Call the Victim Assistance Program of the Diocese of Tucson 1-800-234-0344 and/or the Office of Child, Adolescent and Adult Protection at 520-838-2513.
