READINGS FOR THE WEEK

First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17

Naaman said to Elisha, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel. Please accept a gift from your servant."

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

This saying is trustworthy: If we have died with him, we shall also live with him; if we persevere, we shall also reign with him. He is always faithful, for he cannot deny himself.

Gospel Reading: Luke 17:11-19

And one of the lepers, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him.



GOSPEL MEDITATION: GRATITUDE AS AN ATTITUDE

Appreciation is an application for more. Appreciation is a profound expression of satisfaction, reflecting fulfillment in the recipient and motivating the giver to do even more.

When thankfulness is lacking, one may struggle to fully enjoy a gift, especially if they possess a foundation of gratitude. Being grateful magnifies the joy of both the giver and the receiver. It is vital to recognize that those who assist us also have their own needs but choose to prioritize ours. Appreciation opens the door for further blessings. Gratitude, when truly felt and expressed, has the power to transform our lives and deepen our faith.

In the gospel, the leper who returned to Jesus showcased the essence of gratitude. He did not simply fulfill the demands of the Law by presenting himself to the priest; instead, he embraced the grace of healing and expressed his heartfelt thanks to Jesus. This one leper was commended for his gratitude, while the nine others missed the opportunity to recognize the gift they had received.

Naaman's experience exemplifies true healing. Cures may alleviate symptoms temporarily, but true healing, as exemplified by Naaman, brings wholeness. The difference is profound; while a cure addresses mere symptoms, healing transforms the entire being. This transformative power of healing should give us hope and reassurance in our own journeys of faith. Naaman and the leper were not just cured but deeply healed.

The pivotal question emerges, "How can I express my gratitude to God?" It is essential to understand that gratitude transcends monetary contributions; it can manifest in countless ways. Giving is not always about financial gifts; often, it is about taking action and demonstrating dedication. Naaman attempted to offer gold and silver, but his genuine sense of appreciation lay in his desire to worship God in his homeland, which the prophet recog-

nized. Our time, talents, and efforts are the greatest gifts we can offer to others. For instance, we can volunteer at a local charity, use our skills to help those in need, or simply spend quality time with our loved ones. These are all ways to express gratitude to God.

Time is incredibly precious. When we dedicate our time to God, our talents and treasures gain true significance. Without investing our time, our offerings risk becoming mere transactions. Following the Lord is a powerful way to show appreciation for God's blessings. Our testimonies of healing should resonate in our lives. Gratitude is reflected in our actions, not merely in monetary exchanges. And it is our faith that underpins this gratitude. It is our belief in God's goodness and His plan for us that fuels our actions of thanksgiving.

The most valid form of gratitude often lies in our commitment to God—attending to Him and serving His purpose. As the Psalmist asks, "How can I repay the Lord for His goodness to me?" We can respond by raising our cups of salvation and calling on the Lord's name. Many of those healed by Jesus chose to follow Him and share their experiences, thereby creating a sense of community and connection. The ultimate expression of gratitude is to be a disciple and a living witness to God's goodness. Consider how you can embody this commitment to the Lord and share His love with the world. *by Fr. Creeds, Explained!

Most Catholics can recite at least portions of the Nicene and Apostles Creed by heart — but though these are perhaps the best-known two creeds of modern times, Church tradition has yielded many more.

A creed (from the Latin "credo," meaning "I believe") is a summary of the most important articles of faith agreed upon by a group of people who hold them as truth. Tradition attributes authorship of the Apostles' Creed to Christ's 12 Apostles. The Nicene Creed originated at the first worldwide ecumenical council in Nicaea in 325 AD. The Athanasian Creed is another famous statement of belief approved by the Church, this one focusing particularly on the matter of the Holy Trinity.

All approved creeds fulfill Christ's Great Commission to "make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19) and the need for Christians to "always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls you to account for the hope that is in you" (1 Peter 3:15).

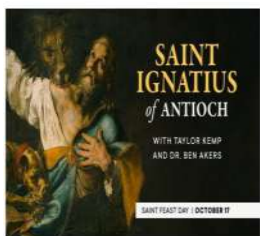

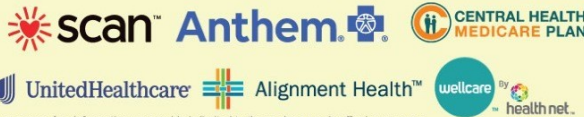
