Message from the Pastor

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

I find it amazing that the readings integrate the Prophet Isaiah's marriage imagery with the inauguration of Jesus' ministry at a wedding feast and with St. Paul's articulation of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. The image of a marriage feast summons further biblical images of the fullness of the messianic era signified by wine and abundance (see Amos 25:6-8; Hosea 2:19-24; 14:7; Isaiah 25:6-8; 54:4-8; 62:4-5; Jeremiah 2:2; 31:12).

The readings remind us that when we are faithful to what Jesus wants us to do, we may find that miracles occur; we may just need to fill our stone jars with water. God will do the rest. That is our hope as we take steps, one by one, through this life. We need to trust and place ourselves in the care of Jesus. The Gospel account of the wedding at Cana is filled with imagery that can enrich us as we place ourselves in that location. We can be astonished, just like the headwaiter in today's Gospel, that God changes us as well when we do what Jesus asks. Savor this passage from St. John's Gospel and place yourself at the wedding in this time of prayer. Enjoy the abundance of love Jesus has for us. The next time you are at Mass, marvel at the miracle that takes place there as ordinary bread and wine are transformed into the Real Presence of Jesus.




