### Pastoral Perspectives

Alleluia! The Lord is Risen! Alleluia!  
Jesus dies in silence. And we can let ourselves be humbly scandalized by that silence, just as we can be scandalized by the seeming triumph of evil, pain, and suffering in our world. God's silence can forever scandalize us: in the Jewish holocaust, in ethnic genocides, in brutal and senseless wars, in horrible terrorists' attacks, by the relatives and friends whom cancer has taken from us; in a pandemic that has taken so many lives.

Where is God in all this?

God's answer is in the resurrection of Jesus and the perennial resurrection of goodness within life itself.

Despite every appearance, in the end, love does triumph over hatred. Peace does triumph over chaos. Forgiveness does triumph over bitterness. Hope does triumph over cynicism. Fidelity does triumph over despair. Virtue does triumph over sin. Conscience does triumph over callousness. Life does triumph over death. And good does triumph over evil.

God's silence can be trusted, even when we die in that deafening silence; that we can live in faith, love, forgiveness, conscience, and fidelity in spite of everything that suggests that they aren't true. This will bring us to what is deepest inside of life and love because God vindicates virtue. God vindicates conscience. God vindicates forgiveness. God vindicates fidelity. God raised up his Son Jesus. And will raise us up if we can remain faithful, even in the darkness, even in the silence.


#### Our Mission Statement

### Scripture Study for Next Sunday

Next Sunday, April 11, 2021, is the Second Sunday of Easter. The readings will be: Acts 4:32-35; 1 John 5:1-6; and John 20:19-31.

The Easter Season continues for six weeks until the feast of Pentecost on May 23<sup>rd</sup>. Throughout these 50 days of Easter, we hear readings from the Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel of John.

John's Gospel invites us to focus on the "Paschal Mystery," that is, the dying and rising of Jesus Christ. This "mystery" is the core of our Christian faith; Jesus died and rose from the dead. He is Savior. He is Lord. The readings from John's Gospel also invite us to reflect on what it means to truly *believe* in the risen Christ. In next Sunday's passage, Jesus inspires belief when he appears to the disciples in a locked room. But Thomas, who was missing from the room, understandably finds it difficult to believe such amazing news based on the testimony of his friends alone. Jesus gives Thomas what he needs in order to believe; Jesus invites Thomas to put his hands into Jesus' wounds. Might Jesus have hoped that Thomas, or any of the apostles, would have known him well enough by then to simply believe the news of his resurrection? Maybe. But Jesus also understands human nature. He acknowledges the grace, the blessing, that enables those who have not seen to believe.

Our first readings during the Easter season come from the Acts of the Apostles, a sort of sequel to Luke's Gospel. The Book of Acts picks up the story of Jesus' followers after his death and resurrection. It recounts how they received the gift of the Holy Spirit, struggled to understand all that had happened, formed a community, and continued Jesus' mission and presence in the world. The Book of Acts is the story of the Church's earliest days. Because we have been baptized into the Church, it is the story of our ancestors in faith and it is also our story.


