Praised be Jesus Christ!

Just three brief but important announcements this week:

1. **SLIGHT CHANGE TO DAILY MASS SCHEDULE** -- I'm really encouraged by the good attendance at our weekday Mass here at the Cathedral, so I am a little reluctant to make any adjustments. But I also know that prior to the COVID lockdowns, the Mass schedule here included two days during the week in which Mass was celebrated in the morning, instead of at 12:10pm.

With me being the only priest officially assigned here to the Cathedral, I'm finding that I need one day during the week that I can use to run errands, visit family and friends, and just be able to get away for the better part of a day. So what I am proposing is that **starting on August 31st, weekday Mass on TUESDAYS ONLY will be celebrated at 7:30am instead of at the usual time of 12:10pm. The daily Mass schedule will remain the same (12:10pm) on all the other weekdays.**

2. **MORE CONFESSION TIMES** -- Also starting that final week of August (the week of August 29th) I would like to significantly increase our confession schedule during weekdays. Specifically, I plan on being available for confessions from 11:30am until noon before every 12:10 weekday Mass. This means that full confession schedule here at the Cathedral would be as follows:

Monday: 11:30am until noon
Tuesday: no confessions
Wednesday: 11:30am until noon
Thursday: 11:30am until noon
Friday: 11:30am until noon; 4:45pm until 5:30pm
Saturday: 2:30pm until 3:30pm

I hope people throughout Monroe County can benefit from this

3. **FAITH FORMATION SIGN-UPS** -- I'm so grateful to Karen Stevens for helping me to piece together an "in-person" religious ed. program here at the Cathedral, after having an online-only program last year due to COVID. Karen worked in this role here at the Cathedral several years ago, and she has been extremely helpful in getting us up and running again. We are still in the early stages of planning but we would like to begin taking sign-ups. The program will start Sunday, September 19th and take place most Sundays from 10:15am until 11:15am. This will allow a family to have their child(ren) enrolled in the program and also attend either the 9:15am Mass (beforehand) or the 11:15am Mass (afterwards).

Sign-up forms are available in the Cathedral narthex, or families can enroll online via the link on our website.

Please note: Confirmation is a two-year program which starts in 8th grade. The Sacrament of Confirmation is generally administered by Bishop Matano to 9th graders at the end of that second year of classes. Confirmation classes will also take place at the same time as Faith Formation: Sundays from 10:15am until 11:15am.

**Try the three "Rs" and a "C"
Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Compost**

- **Get your money back — return empty beverage cans and bottles**
Don't lose the nickel deposit you paid when buying a soda or other carbonated soft drink, beer, water (that doesn't contain sugar), or wine product. When consumers don't redeem their bottles and cans, 80% of those unclaimed deposits are remitted to NY State and the beverage distribution keeps the other 20%.
- **Compost food scraps and yard waste**
It's all about recycling the nutrients and returning them to the soil to be used again. Learn more about composting at home. If you can't compost at home, look for a food scraps drop off spot or residential collection service.
- **Hang a blackboard**
Use it for phone messages and reminders, instead of leaving paper notes.
- **Stop junk mail**
Contact solicitors and advertisers to get off mailing lists.
- **Don't toss it wash it**
Use cloth napkins, washable plates, cups and silverware. Serve condiments from recyclable or reusable containers.
- **Forgo coffee pods**
Popular single-serve coffee pods aren't recyclable or biodegradable. If you don't want to give up the convenience of using coffee pods, buy a reusable pod to fill with your own coffee and you'll save money too. Save the grounds for composting and rinse out the pod so it's ready for the next time.
- **Recycle your old cell phone or donate it**
More than 425 thousand cell phones are retired in the US every day! NYS law requires all wireless service providers that offer phones for sale to accept old cell phones for reuse or recycling. Phones can also be donated to domestic violence support programs such as Hopeline Cell Phone Collection or the military.

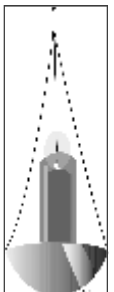
