Praised be Jesus Christ!

It was heartwarming for me to see such strong attendance at our Diocesan Respect Life Mass, held last Sunday here at the 11:15 Mass with representatives attending from all over the Diocese. Our Diocesan Respect Life Mass kicks off the annual commemoration of October as Respect Life Month in all the Dioceses of the United States.

The Second Vatican Council called attention to a sad list of contemporary attacks against human life which plague modern societies:

[W] hatever is opposed to life itself, such as any type of murder, genocide, abortion, euthanasia or wilful self-destruction, whatever violates the integrity of the human person, such as mutilation, torments inflicted on body or mind, attempts to coerce the will itself; whatever insults human dignity, such as subhuman living conditions, arbitrary imprisonment, deportation, slavery, prostitution, the selling of women and children; as well as disgraceful working conditions, where men are treated as mere tools for profit, rather than as free and responsible persons; all these things and others of their like are infamies indeed. They poison human society, but they do more harm to those who practice them than those who suffer from the injury. Moreover, they are supreme dishonor to the Creator (Gaudium et Spes, 27).

No doubt more items could now be added to the list or identified with greater specificity (i.e. proliferation of internet pornography, new trends in racist ideology, a whole host of novel bioethical problems, etc). It is part of the prophetic role of the Church in every generation to alert the consciences of believers to these indignities and stir up bold responses and solutions in the public square—particularly spear-headed by the laity. This includes seeking solutions in justice at the level of public policy.

At the same time there is for us a constant temptation to reduce our perspective on life issues and view this list as just a series of "policy issues" to be battled out in the political sphere. For us as believers we ultimately profess that the *root cause* of attacks against life comes from SIN—both original sin and personal sin. We are all wounded by sin's effects in us. And unless that wound is treated by grace and by the saving message and power of Jesus Christ, it will continue to fester into any number of social maladies that even the most well-intended and well-organized social programs will have only limited effect to curb.

Christ said: "I came that they might have LIFE and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). In Him we have the source and pattern of that abundant life that we seek to defend from conception until natural death, and also the wellspring of grace which directs us to the eternal life with God forever in heaven. As St. John Paul II said in the opening sentence of his 1995 encyclical letter: "The Gospel of life is at the heart of Jesus' message. Lovingly received day after day by the Church, it is to be preached with dauntless fidelity as "good news" to the people of every age and culture."

In the following weeks, we'll unpack a few more themes relating to how it is that we live out the "Gospel of Life."

Our goal this year is the same as last year, to provide Thanksgiving meals for 200 families in the Cathedral neighborhood. \$10,000 in Aldi's gift cards will enable us to achieve that goal. We would greatly appreciate receiving all donations by November 15th




We continue to follow Diocesan guidelines and we still are **NOT** permitted to have our font filled with Holy Water. For those who would like Holy Water, you can bring




