Praised be Jesus Christ!

You may have noticed the "new" holy water fonts that now stand at the principal entryways into the Cathedral. These fonts were a gift to the Cathedral from All Saints Parish in Corning and were originally located in St. Vincent de Paul church (which closed back in 2018). I'm very grateful to the Pastor, Fr. Matthew Jones, for his donation to the Cathedral parish, and I hope that those parishioners who once attended St. Vincent de Paul's church can appreciate that some elements of their parish are being used in other parts of the Diocese. I'm amazed at how well the fonts blend in with the color-scheme of the Narthex!

Naturally, the presence of new holy water fonts brings up the question of the future of the baptismal font—which remains unfilled since the initial weeks of Covid restrictions back in March of 2020. Here are a few things to know about the current situation:

Even before March of 2020, although the font was filled, it was not functioning properly due to damage in the internal structure of the font. Specifically, this damage was within the piping system within the font and under the church that is responsible for sending the overflow water back to the main pump and heater.

This damage has existed for years. But to avoid the amount of cost that such a repair would entail (since the main damage is within the structure of the font itself) contractors reworked the system by cutting out the return line all together, and simply allowing all of the overflow from the font to run directly into the drain. This means that the only way that the baptismal font can currently function is by constantly heating and softening the incoming city water, pumping it down the length of the church into the font, filling the font to overflow, and then allowing the overflow to go directly down the drain. This results in having to dump between 1 and 2 gallons of water down the drain per minute the entire time the font is running—something that is neither financially nor environmentally responsible.

The estimated costs to repair the font are extremely pricey, given the location of the damage itself. It would essentially require the font to be dissembled, repaired, and re-assembled.

Given this situation, and after consultation with Parish Council in meetings during the last year, as well as the unanimous recommendation of our Buildings and Grounds committee, my suggestion is that we go forward with a plan to have the baptismal font removed. My reasoning is as follows:

- 1. Based on consultation with our HVAC company, the cost of removal of the font would be far less than the cost necessary to do these repairs, without even factoring in future depreciation of the font and the cost of general upkeep.
- 2. Full-immersion adult baptisms are so infrequent at the Cathedral that I do not think the large size of the current font is proportionate to our needs. Moreover, in our current situation, I am of the opinion that full-immersion baptisms should be prudently avoided due to public propriety and safe environment concerns.
- 3. The removal of the font would allow liturgical processions at the Cathedral to proceed directly down the main aisle. This would be especially beneficial at weddings, which are numerous at the Cathedral, and currently require the bride to navigate around the font in awkward fashion for her entrance procession.

4. A smaller, noble, and more easily moveable and "cleanable" baptismal font could be acquired for free and re-purposed from one of the closed churches of the Diocese.

For the sake of the brevity required by the bulletin, I had to keep some of the explanations here relatively short. I'm happy to discuss my thoughts at greater length if there are questions or concerns. I wanted to present my thoughts to the parish before taking further steps.

Thank you for your generous donations and support of Joseph's Place. Our next Food Frenzy will be August 20 & 21. We would





Our Next Community Brunch Sunday, August 21, 2022 12:30 - 2:30 pm


Community brunch/dinners were started by the Social Ministry Team


