Praised be Jesus Christ!

I don't think that I need to reiterate just how important strong Eucharistic devotion is to the life of any parish, and I rejoice that *this parish is one that is falling deeper and deeper in love with our Eucharistic Lord!* I'm like a proud Father when I notice all sorts of genuine acts and examples of true Eucharistic piety amongst our parishioners (sometimes in quiet, but very real ways), or when I sense that someone has come to a more profound place in their spiritual life. It is my constant and fervent desire that our three churches become like *beating hearts of Eucharistic faith* and conduits of intercession and grace flowing from our tabernacles out to the hearts of all those in our communities—especially those who are fallen away, those who are far from the Lord, and those most in need of our prayers.

But the more that we grow in Eucharistic love and amazement, the more that we should *feel* in our hearts that those two brief moments at Mass in which I elevate the Sacred Host and the Chalice at the time of the consecration are just not enough! And in one sense, that is precisely what adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is: a prolonged loving gaze upon our Eucharistic Lord that "extends" that glorious moment of adoration already contained within the Mass itself.

[I know that I return to this theme very often, but I never apologize for repeating any admonition that has to do with either: 1) reverence for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament of the altar; and 2) filial devotion to Our Blessed Mother Mary.]

Please do your spiritual life a favor and stop in for some quiet, personal prayer during one of our adoration times. I'm especially interested in encouraging people who have never before taken advantage of this opportunity.

How to Use the All Souls Envelopes

We still have several weeks until November, but I already need to start planning ahead for All Souls Day (November 2nd). The envelope companies that we use for our weekly collection always include a specific envelope for All Souls Day in which you can write the names of deceased family and friends to be "remembered at the Masses celebrated on All Soul's Day."

Every single year in the past I've run into problems with these envelopes for two reasons: 1) The regularly scheduled parish Mass on All Soul's Day usually already has a specific intention requested for that Mass; and 2) Many of these envelopes are only filled out and turned in *after* All Soul's day has already come and gone, and so there is no way that I can "retroactively" remember those intentions at a Mass that is already in the past!

In previous years, this has just meant a lot of extra work for us making sure that the All Souls intentions that we receive get celebrated properly and justly, in accordance with Canon Law.

So this year, to avoid any confusion...

Anyone who would like to use the All Souls envelopes provided by our envelope company should be aware of the following conditions:

- 1. All of these envelopes MUST be turned in through the regular parish collection or received through mail on or before Sunday, October 29
- 2. The intentions received on the envelopes will be grouped together into a **collective Mass intention** (meaning that a single Mass will be offered for all of the received All Souls intentions).

- 3. This Mass will be offered as an evening Mass at **7:00pm on All Soul's Day** itself (November 2nd).
- 4. Those not wishing to be included in this collective intention are free to schedule regular individual Masses throughout the year to be offered for the souls of their loved ones, as is usually done.

Just to be clear, by no means I am trying to discourage the use of these envelopes for All Souls Day. I love All Souls Day and want to take full advantage of the benefits of this great feast day! I just want to make sure that people are fully informed as to precisely how these All Souls envelopes are used, so that you can plan accordingly.




Mom's Prayer Group
