Praised be Jesus Christ!

I'm sure that many people in the Rochester area are well-aware of the uptick in crime and vandalism that has plagued our city for the last several years. Car thefts, destruction of property, and other types of basic criminal activity—often committed by minors as young as 12 to 16 years old—has become almost common place. Our current judicial system seems incapable of providing sufficient deterrence to this massive problem, and it is affecting homeowners and local businesses all thorough Monroe County. It seems that even many of the police agencies and private security companies do not have the authority to provide sufficient direct intervention during incidents-in-action or which have just occurred.

Unfortunately, we here at the Cathedral are not immune to this rampant societal problem, and over the course of the past year there have been several incidents that have taken place in our own parking lot or on the nearby streets. It pains me to hear that these occur when people are just trying to worship God in Holy Mass or attend a parish event.

I also refuse to allow a few morally corrupt individuals deter us from our mission to be a beating heart of prayer and worship at the spiritual center of our Diocesan church. Despite everything, I still believe that you are safer in our parking lots than you are driving to Mass on the roads (statistically speaking).

But I don't want to leave the impression that we are doing nothing to try to prevent and protect our parishioners in the midst of these difficult times. Let me fill you in on some of our efforts:

- We set up a site survey with member of the RPD to give us recommendations on how we can better secure our property
- We replaced and upgraded our video cameras that face out to the main parking lot and the entrance under the awning
- We have had conversations and regular email communication with the police captain responsible for the Lake Section of the RPD, informing him about incidents and begging him for whatever additional police assistance he can give
- Our parish council just this week sent a letter to our local Councilmember, telling him of concerns and asking him to use whatever authority he has to provide greater protection and deterrence
- And finally, we have utilized a small team of incredibly generous parish volunteers who watch and survey the parking lots during Masses and events to the extent that they are available.

This brings me to two simple requests:

Request #1 - Just exercise basic caution when walking into Mass. Don't wander alone in such a way as to look to become an easy target. Walk in with others and be cognizant of those who might require assistance (especially the more senior members of our community).

Request #2 - If you own a Kia or a Hyundai vehicle, please use an anti-theft steering wheel lock, even if your car has been updated with the new enhanced security features. Due to certain social media trends, those particular types of vehicles are uniquely targeted, and the steering wheel lock provides a measure of deterrence.

Request #3 – I would like to add additional members to our "Vigilance Team" who might be interested in providing a watchful eye during Masses and other functions. The main focus is on deterrence and assistance. You would serve almost in the function of a parking lot "usher." Any volunteers would attend a session with a retired police captain associated with the Diocese, who would give you pointers on what to do and not to do. If you are willing to help...please let us know! I would be so grateful for your assistance.

Finally, I entrust the parish to the special protection of St. Michael the Archangel. We have now completed three consecutive years of the sung St. Michael Novena, so I have real confidence in his spiritual protection over us.
