February 25, 2024 Second Sunday of Lent

#### Praised be Jesus Christ!

I am typing these words exactly one week after Ash Wednesday—a day of unique "public religiosity" in which we boldly wear the sign of our sin and repentance on our very foreheads for all to see.

There is something edifying, and frankly, "Catholic," about all the clamoring and excitement over ashes. Similar to how the sacraments are Divinely accommodated to our bodily nature as *visible/sensible* signs which convey to us the *invisible* grace of God, so ashes are visible signs, instituted by the Church, which allow us to display our invisible sorrow of heart for our personal sins. I never want to lose, or fail to appreciate, what an incredible public witness this day provides!

But now that we are beyond the first days of Lent, I'd like to reiterate the message that I tried to preach on that day propose just a brief "examination of conscience" for us all as we reflect back upon those ashes that many of us received just over a week ago.

- Did I wear those ashes as a true manifestation of my contrition of heart, or were there also hidden motives of pride or vain glory?
- Am I prepared to follow through with a prayerful and penitential disposition for the remainder of the Lenten season so as to be renewed in my spiritual life when we celebrate Easter?
- If I boldly wear ashes in public as a witness to my faith in Christ, am I also prepared to stand with Him and His Church in holding publicly to all of the teachings of the faith, including those moral teachings which are unpopular or ridiculed by the media culture (pro-life, chastity before marriage, proper use of sexuality within marriage, defending our God-given, biological identity as male and female, etc.)?
- If I longed to receive ashes on Ash Wednesday, do I *hunger all the more* to receive worthily Jesus' Real Presence in the Sacrament of the Eucharist?
- Am I prepared to confess my sins not just generally "upon my forehead," but specifically in kind and in number using the means provided by Christ himself, namely, the Sacrament of Confession—even if it has been a long time since my last use of this Sacrament and I am reluctant or afraid to return?

I offer these reflections not in a condescending tone, but with the confidence that Lent really is an opportunity to renew our hearts and minds, and so beg God's mercy and grace down upon our local parish! Please pray for me, as I pray for you all during this holy season: "Let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep, and say, 'Spare, O LORD, your people, and make not your heritage a reproach" (Joel 2:17).
