Praised be Jesus Christ!

On Tuesday we begin the month of the Holy Rosary. I have always challenged my parishioners:

If you have been away from the practice of praying the rosary (or have never prayed it before) — commit to the daily prayer of the rosary for at least the month of October.

I'm sure there are all sorts of lists online like: "10 Reasons to Pray the Rosary" or "7 Ways the Rosary Will Change Your Spiritual Life" — and they are probably all helpful.

If I had to make my own quick list off of the top of my head (as I'm doing right now), I would say something like the following:

- 1. While a private devotion, and therefore not strictly essential to faith or the spiritual life, it must certainly be *that* private devotion most universally and repeatedly lauded by Popes, Bishops, Saints, and renowned spiritual authors for at least the last 500 years.
- 2. It seems to be a means uniquely chosen by God and endowed with special graces to bring about the repentance of sinners, the grace of true contrition, increased fervency in the spiritual life, an abundance of blessing upon those for whom we are praying, the gift of final perseverance at the hour of death, conversions to the Catholic faith, and various forms of spiritual protection upon the Church and the world.
- 3. It teaches beginners in prayer how to pray by giving them a **structured method**, and it is a familiar comfort in the lives of those who already have that stable prayer life.
- 4. It is such a distinctively Catholic prayer and as such is almost a recognized symbol of the Catholic faith to those both inside and outside of the Church that it seems appropriate for all Catholics to know how to pray it, to have a rosary on their person at all times, and to pray it regularly. It is, therefore, an expression of the unity of the Church throughout the world now and across generations of believers through history.
- 5. It is credited as *the* **spiritual means of victory** for the Catholic forces at the Battle of Lepanto (1570) one of the most important battles in Christian history, which kept Christian civilization in Europe from essentially collapsing under Islamic invasion. Today the remnants of the same western civilization are in equal need of protection, not only from a modern gradual Islamic replacement, but also from an oppressive secularism that has grown like a cancer from within. The **rosary continues to be spiritual protection for the Church**.
- 6. By extension, the rosary is a formidable and amazing spiritual weapon in the battle to protect our own soul from mortal sin and hell.
- 7. It really does teach us to love Jesus more! In part because much of the rosary consists in meditation on the mysteries of the life of Christ. But also, I think, by giving us a share in the absolutely unique and maternal love of the Blessed Virgin Mary. No one has ever loved Jesus more than Mary (and no one has ever loved Mary more than her own Son).
