## **History of White Mass**

The tradition of the White Mass in the United States finds its origins in the development of the national Catholic Medical Association in the early 1930s.

From its inception, the medical profession has been understood as a healing profession, a way in which Christ's work continues upon the earth. Moreover, since the apparitions at Lourdes in the late 19th century, the plight of the infirmed, and those who care for them, have taken on renewed appreciation in participating in the mysteries of Christ's own life.

The White Mass, so named by the color worn by those in the healing profession, gathers health care professionals under the patronage of St. Luke to ask God's blessing upon patient, doctor, nurse, and caregiver alike.

### Do No Harm

With the advent of ever increasing challenges to clinical norms, Catholic physicians are being pushed to treat patients beyond the dictates of their conscience, especially in light of the primary mandate to do no harm to patients. Research is becoming more and more politicized thus making it increasingly difficult to find reliable evidence based medicine as our guide. It is these challenges that makes the Catholic Medical Association so important to assist physicians, in forming their conscience with a body of colleagues equally committed to seeking truth in the application of their profession.

The Catholic Church has always made decisions slowly, which allows for all ideas to be vetted and nowhere is this more important than the treatment of the body, mind and soul of our neighbor. That is why the development of ethical and religious directives are promulgated through the United States as approved by the Catholic Bishops.

## **Imperative to Pray**

As most of us take our healthcare seriously, it is important for us to pray for faithfulness in physicians to treat every aspect of the human person in line with gospel truths revealed to us by our creator. The pressures are great on medical professionals from both patient desires and governing bodies to make exceptions from what we know to be true. We often remind ourselves that the right choice is rarely, if ever, the easy choice to make. Please pray at Mass today for patients who are troubled by their illnesses or medically treatable situations and for the clinicians tasked with providing them the best care according to Christian principles and, most of all, charity.
