November 3, 2024 Thirty-First Sunday In Ordinary Time

Praised be Jesus Christ!

This article is a reprint from several years ago, but always important to re-emphasize!

As we continue through this month of November, traditionally dedicated to the Holy Souls, I would just like to touch on a somewhat related topic that sometimes arises in the midst of funeral planning. In August of 2016, the Vatican published a short document designed to remind the faithful around the world about the expectations of the Church with respect to Christian burials.

In terms of content, the document contained nothing new or surprising. It was just the Church, as a good mother, reminding us, her children about our practices in the midst of an ever growing secular and materialist mindset which sees death as the absolute end of the human person.

I would like to summarize the main points of this document:

- 1. First of all, the Church has always regarded the traditional, *full-body burial as the preferred option* for the treatment of the remains of a deceased person. This method of burial most clearly expresses our belief in the future resurrection of that body. It signifies a "sleep of peace" as we await Our Lord's return. I would also add as a priest that having the full body of the deceased allows us to conduct the funeral rites of the Church in the most complete manner—namely with the sprinkling and incensing of the casket, and the draping of the remains with the funeral pall.
- 2. Nevertheless, the Church permits the practice of cremation, so long as the choice of cremation does not represent a denial or rejection of our belief in the resurrection of the body.
- 3. In the event that cremation is chosen, it is very important that *the resulting ashes are also laid to rest in a timely manner in a sacred place—that is, either buried in a cemetery or entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium*. This is essential in maintaining respect for those remains. It is also a show of charity towards the living in that it provides a distinct place where people can go to "pay their respects" toward those remains, to honor the memory of that person, and most importantly, to pray for their soul. In the long term, it prevents the person from being entirely forgotten because a cemetery marker provides a reminder to future generations of the life of that person.
- 4. The Church forbids the growing practice of scattering ashes, or keeping them in the home of relatives. The same is true for dividing the ashes among family members or conserving them in mementos. I am very aware that these practices are common and increasingly popular trends. I think that is why our united, public witness in these matters is so important as Catholics. It is a reminder to all that Catholics "look forward to the resurrection of the dead," as we pray every Sunday in the Creed.


Perhaps there are people reading this article who are thinking to themselves right now, "I never knew that these were the Church's expectations!" Please be at peace. This reminder is meant to inform, not to disturb or anger. I am more than happy to answer any questions or concerns. We are also totally available to assist in the burial of any cremated remains which may still be in need of a distinct place of rest in a cemetery and I understand that Holy Sepulchre cemetery has a variety of ways of accommodating such interment requests.




