Very soon we will be sending out Year End Statements to those who have given recordable contributions to the Cathedral Community during the past year (2024). Included with this mailing will also be the Annual Parish Financial Report.

In light of this upcoming mailing, I would just like to offer a few comments here in the bulletin about the current state of our parish finances.

- 1. CMA I am happy to announce that several weeks back we successfully reached our parish Catholic Ministries Appeal goal. I'm thrilled by the generous contributions and the timely completion of this important Diocesan initiative. THANK YOU! If you intended to make a contribution but have not yet done so, you still have a few more months to do so—keeping in mind that 50% of any additional contributions are returned directly back to the parish!
- 2. **Offertory/Collection revenue** I am also happy to say that over the course of the past year, we have successfully been meeting or exceeding our budgeted collection.

However, I have to add a few caveats:

- We were *deliberately conservative* in our budget estimates last year in terms of collection revenue, so I would have been rather concerned if we weren't able to meet those projections.
- Our collection revenue at the Cathedral has, for years, been *insufficient by itself to cover operating expenses*. We rely on semi-annual withdrawals from our investment account (known in the Diocese as "Stable Patrimony"). But the rate at which we have been withdrawing this money generally exceeds the rate of investment performance, and therefore we are "living beyond our means" on a year-by-year basis.
- Another significant portion of our annual operating revenue (over 40%) comes from rental income from the former school building and former convent across the street.
- 3. Purpose of parish giving Obviously parishes cannot "keep the lights on" without a steady and generous stream of collection income. I'm grateful for every contribution that comes in, of whatever size, and I strive to be a good steward of those gifts—avoiding unnecessary expenditures, making prudent physical plant and staff decisions, etc. However, keep in mind that all of this is in service to the true mission of the parish, which is the glory of God and the salvation of souls. Unlike almost any other charitable giving, your contributions to the parish are uniquely tied to the mission of the Church, and therefore have a value and a necessity (even for your own spiritual life) that extends well beyond dollar and cents!




