Praised be Jesus Christ!

Fasting is fundamentally an act of **self-denial**. We deny ourselves in small ways with regard to food so as to train our wills, which are disordered by sin.

But there is a way in which **self-denial is also a way of feasting**—and I don't mean simply as a preparation for the feasting of the Easter season.

The person who turns from a life of mortal sin by denying **illegitimate desires** can begin to **"FEAST"** upon the true joy of the spiritual life and the life of virtue. It is a wonderful and happy thing to be in the state of grace. Sin gives only the false appearance of happiness and mere temporary satisfaction. But the spiritual life is a joyful, bountiful feast of living the full blessed life of the commandments.

The person who practices regular self-restraint in fasting from food and other **legitimate desires** is even better able to "FEAST" in the things of the Lord. In fact, St. Athanasius actually says that fasting is "feasting with the angels!" Since angels have no bodies (and therefore need no food), we imitate them in some way through fasting as we yearn to contemplate the Lord in prayer in a way that is more and more free from any bodily/sensible consolations.

And finally, perhaps we can say that death and our future resurrections is, in a way, a complete "fast" from this entire fallen world, that allows us finally to see God face-to-face in the eternal **HEAVENLY WEDDING FEAST** of Christ and his bride the Church.




