“As I Walk This Way”

Dear Parishioners,

In a past article I mentioned that we have 80+ funerals at each of our churches in a given year. Most funerals we have are for parishioners and some are for people who do not have a connection to a parish. With the challenge of travel due to COVID 19, many times families request that the funeral Mass be live-streamed. This allows people to watch the funeral Mass regardless of their location. It has been said that funerals are “seminars for the living,” in that it is a time to come to a deeper understanding of life, death and faith. I believe that a funeral provides a time to remind people of God’s love for them and to encourage them to recall that they are not alone but that the Lord is with them.

The wonderful thing about our live-streaming is that this focus on the value of faith is transmitted from our two churches in Rochester, New York to people around the world. At any given funeral Mass there may be five to 1,000 people watching on social media. The ministry of caring for the grieving and praying for the dead also provides an opportunity to encourage people in their faith journey.

I wish to thank all the people who minister at the many funeral Masses we have in our cluster. Without the work of so many people working together to plan, live-stream, sing, and offer hospitality, these funeral Masses would not be the beautiful celebrations of the Lord’s death and resurrection. And thank you to all parishioners, your support of the parish makes this outreach possible.

When God Whispers

“You don’t need to shout. My hearing works just fine.”

Are you a parent that has used that one on your kids? I’m not sure at what age they realize that the volume of their voice doesn’t correlate to the likelihood of receiving a favorable reply — it might be sometime in the teenage years, when the talking slows down altogether.

But I’ve got to admit, it would be nice if God always gave us a loud and dramatic sign when He wanted something — the booming voice and the torn-open heavens (“This is my beloved Son!”) really get the message across. Some-

times I find myself envious of the Apostles, who were able to witness such things in person. The fact of the matter is, in the year 2021, God is more likely to speak in a whisper than in a shout. The prophet Isaiah forewarns that Christ himself will not be a noisemaker — for all his preaching, he will not cry out or shout to bring forth justice to the nations. His way is altogether different than that.

We are not the Apostles, and we do not have the privilege of seeing the Holy Spirit descend on Christ like a dove. But here’s the good news: God doesn’t need to shout. Our spiritual hearing works just fine. We just have to be listening.

Let’s wake up each morning ready to hear God’s whispers throughout the day. Let’s make a conscious effort to invite those whispers into our hearts, where they can become a catalyst for grace in this world.






The most recent report at the time of this bulletin printing shows **308 households have pledged \$ 71,326, taking us to 66.95% of our \$106,530 Goal.**
