

From the Desk of Father Peter *The Holy Family is a Sign of Hope to All Families*

This is the Sunday of the year when most people can look out in the church and sometimes see people poking one another during the Scripture readings. In the first reading, parents poke children to remind them that the Scriptures admonish the attitudes of honor, reverence, and kindness. It is an amazing sight to see from the altar.

If we read Scripture carefully, we will find that the Holy Family had their share of troubles and difficulties. Joseph cared for and protected the child and his mother by obeying the will of God without hesitancy. Mary, too, searched for God’s will as she pondered the words spoken to her by Simeon in the Temple, as well as the various events in her life. Both Mary and Joseph obeyed God even when the future was uncertain. Jesus, too, had to learn obedience to his parents. They were worried and concerned about His whereabouts when they lost Him for three days in Jerusalem.

As faithful Catholics we need to remember that the Holy Family too was once a family of immigrants and refugees. Mary—our mother and mother of God, had an intimate understanding of suffering, flight, homelessness, and uncertainty. As Catholics preparing to enter into a new year with our families with all the uncertainties of tomorrow, we have to look at what we have right in front of us as a family, at what we could become, and *stop* measuring it against what we may have lost. We are family; *we are called to share our past and envision our future in Christ.*



God still speaks to us in varied and wonderful ways.

These events help us to realize just how human the Holy Family really was, and how much they have to teach our own families. Through the ups and downs of life, they stayed close to God. We can remember that we have been chosen by God to be part of his family, and have been promised the Holy Spirit to teach, guide, and comfort us. There is no perfect family but this one—the Holy Family. I fondly remember this that someone once said: *Having a place to go— is a home. Having someone to love—is a family. Having both—is a blessing.*

When we are in harmony with God’s will, then we are at peace, and peace will flow into our dealings with each other—family, friends, neighbors, and co-workers. Our actions and our attitudes will reflect our Christian faith if we strive daily to search out and be open to the will of God in our lives. May each family, regardless of circumstances, approach this New Year with a



sense of harmony like the Holy Family and strive to live in peace.

As we celebrate the Feast of The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, this year on December 27, let us be reminded that we, too, **celebrate our parish’s patron saint—St. John, Apostle and Evangelist.**

St. John was born in Bethsaida, and like his brother James, was a fisherman. He was called while mending his nets to follow Jesus. He became the beloved disciple of Jesus. He wrote the fourth Gospel, three Epistles and the Apocalypse. His passages on the pre-existence of the Word, who by His Incarnation became the light of the world and life of our souls, are among the finest of the New Testament.

He is the evangelist of the divinity of Christ and His fraternal love. With James, his brother and Simon Peter, he was one of the witnesses of the Transfiguration. At the Last Supper, he leans on the Master’s breast. At the foot of the cross, Jesus entrusts His Mother to his care. John’s pure life kept him very close to Jesus and Mary. In years to come John was exiled to the island of Patmos under Emperor Domitian, but lived to an old age. — From the *Daily Roman*

SUGGESTION: As a family, take some time to research St. John the Evangelist, the Beloved One, and see what different things you learn about our parish patron Saint. Have your children or grandchildren write a story about what they learned of St. John and share it with Father Peter! Children and adults, don’t stop there—there are so many saints to read about and you will be amazed at how these ordinary people, like us, came to be saints.

Remember, we are ALL called to be saints!

When the days were completed for their purification

 sacrifice of *a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons*, in

 It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he

 parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom

 sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was
 said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to
 Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the
 fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will
 be contradicted —and you yourself a sword will pierce—
 so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."
 There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of
 Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in
 years, having lived seven years with her husband after
 her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-
 four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and
 day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that
 very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the
 child to all who were awaiting the redemption of
 Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of
 the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of
 Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with
 wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

Reminder on Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) (sometimes referred to as "IRA Charitable Rollovers) as a Way to Donate to St. John's Parish

In December, 2015, an IRA QCD Extension was signed into law permanently.

Under the legislation, donors aged 70½ or older can contribute up to \$100,000 from their IRA's directly to qualified charities during 2017 and beyond without having to pay income taxes on the money.

Here is a quick recap of the IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution rules. Gifts qualify under the law if:

- The donor is age 70 ½ or older on the day of the gift.
- The donor transferred up to \$100,000 directly from the donor's IRA to one or more qualified charities. This opportunity applies only to IRA's and no other types of retirement plans.
- The donor does not receive any goods or services in return for the rollover gift in order to qualify for tax-free treatment.
- The gift needs to be made by Dec., 31, 2020 for the gift to qualify this year.




