

The Holy Family is Our Family

It seems natural for us to focus our attention on the Holy Family of Nazareth during the



prayerful person, full of grace but as a wife to Joseph and mother of Jesus, she faced the same basic routine chores that wives and mothers experience in

Christmas Season. After all, Christmas is a family celebration. The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph are projected before us so that we can recommit ourselves to the act of living within the family circle. To live family life well is neither automatic nor easy. It requires effort and practice; it is an art. The teaching of the Church clearly affirms that the family is the basic cell of both the Church and society. This day then, we find ourselves invited by the Word of God to recommit ourselves to the art of Christian family life but we cannot do that realistically if our understanding of the Holy Family or of our own family is unreal. We run the risk of romanticizing the Holy Family of Nazareth. We forget they lived human life as we do.

Jesus, the Son of God, was born into a family. We see him as a baby in the crib but we must not forget that as he grew, he passed through all the stages from infancy through childhood and adolescence into adulthood. Joseph is the model for husband, fathers and workers. He was a just man, a holy man but we should not forget that he experienced the reality of work as a carpenter; blisters on his hands, aching muscles, long days and fatigue. He loved his family and wanted to provide for them, but it was not always easy to do so. And Mary—yes, she was a reflective and

every age and generation.

The Holy Family is a model of Christian family life for us. They loved each other well, but they did not always understand one another. Tension, anxiety, lack of complete understanding, coupled with trust in God, loyalty and respect were all part of the Holy Family's life. These are a part of our family life too.

If we are to recommit ourselves to the art of Christian family life, we must fashion a realistic and holy attitude towards Christian family life; the family life of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. We can blend prayer, relationship to God, respect in the way we look at each other, and loyalty into our family life and stick by each other no matter what.

Yes, it's the Christmas Season, a family time. It is good that God turns our thoughts this week to the art of Christian family life by pointing to the Holy Family of Nazareth and inviting us to model our family life after theirs in prayer, respect and loyalty. Our family may not be a perfect one but it will be well-lived because it will be rooted in Christian realism and holiness.

Gospel Lk 2:41-52

Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.





Reminder on Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) (sometimes referred to as "IRA Charitable Rollovers) as a Way to Donate to St. John's Parish

In December, 2015, the IRA QCD Legislation was signed into law permanently.

Under the legislation, donors aged $70\frac{1}{2}$ or older can contribute <u>up to</u> \$100,000 from their IRA's directly to qualified charities without having to pay income taxes on the money.

Here is a quick recap of the IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution rules. Gifts qualify under the law if:

- The donor is age $70 \frac{1}{2}$ or older on the day of the gift.
- The donor transfer up to \$100,000 directly from their IRA to one or more qualified charities. This opportunity applies only to IRA's and no other types of retirement plans.

- The donor does not receive any goods or services in return for the rollover gift in order to qualify for tax-fee treatment.
- The gift/check must be dated on or before Dec., 31, 2021 to qualify this year.
- The gift needs to be sent directly to the charitable organization which also has to be the payee for the gift.


