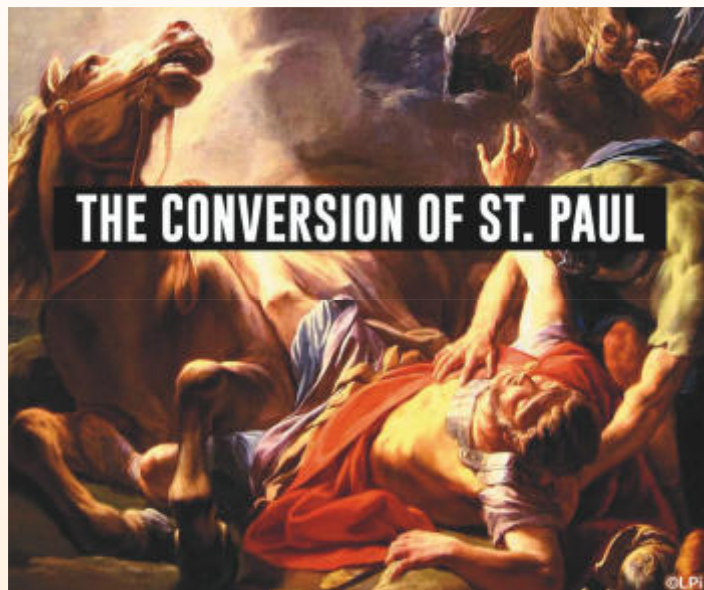

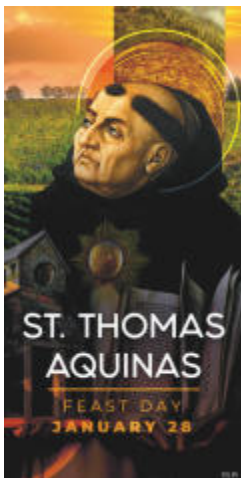

**Examples of Our Faith**

**St. Thomas Aquinas | January 28**

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order is St. Thomas Aquinas His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The *Summa Theologiae*, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas

## Sunday, January 23 Third Sunday of Ordinary Time

### First Reading Neh 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly, which consisted of men, women, and those children old enough to understand. Standing at one end of the open place that was before the Water Gate, he read out of the book from daybreak till midday, in the presence of the men, the women, and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the book of the law. Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the occasion. He opened the scroll so that all the people might see it—for he was standing higher up than any of the people—and, as he opened it, all the people rose. Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered, “Amen, amen!” Then they bowed down and prostrated themselves before the LORD, their faces to the ground. Ezra read plainly from the book of the law of God, interpreting it so that all could understand what was read. Then Nehemiah, that is, His Excellency, and Ezra the priest-scribe and the Levites who were instructing the people said to all the people: “Today is holy to the LORD your God. Do not be sad, and do not weep”—for all the people were weeping as they heard the words of the law. He said further: “Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks, and allot portions to those who had nothing prepared; for today is holy to our LORD. Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the LORD must be your strength!”

### Gospel Lk 1:1-4; 4:14-21

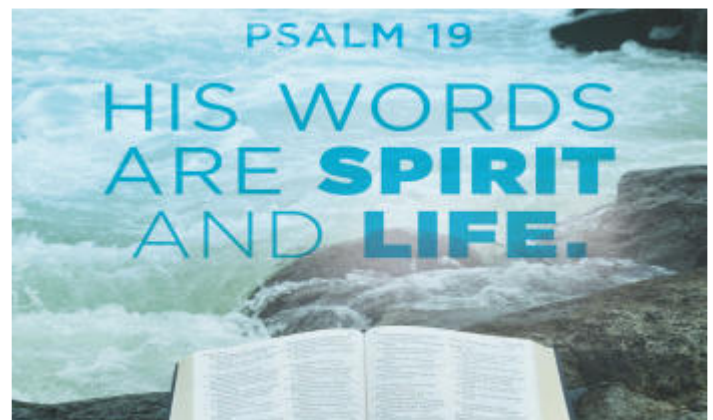
Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received.

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all.

He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

*The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.*

Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, “Today this Scripture

### Chairperson's Comments: Parish Council

**Secretary: Christine Paoletti** has graciously accepted the position of Secretary to the Parish Council. Jill will be her back up.

**ChristLife:** Please be aware of the upcoming opportunity to experience Following Christ starting in January. Some of you may have participated in this segment of the ChristLife program in the past, after Discovering Christ. Please consider yourself invited. Whether you participate again or for the first time, Following Christ is designed to help you grow closer to and deepen your faith in Our Lord and Savior. The program will roll out as follows:

- Tuesday evenings January 11 - February 22, 2022, 6:30-8:30 PM, includes dessert and beverages
- Retreat day: Saturday, February 12, Time TBD, meals provided, free will offering accepted for meals.
- Note that the program may be elongated if cancellations for weather are required.
- COVID protocols are followed. Social distancing in place for group discussion.

**CMA – 2021 thru 2022:** This year's CMA campaign started on October 4, 2021 and continues thru May 31, 2022. Our goal this year is \$81,886. Fortunately, our goal has been lowered from last years \$87,757. We had 370 donors last year when we reached our goal. That averages out to be \$237 per donor.

As of January 7, 2022 – we have raised \$76,952.00 which is 93.97% of our Goal. So far, we have had 344 donors for an average of \$224. We are still below last year's average of \$237 but we are getting closer. However, we are only \$4934 short of reaching our Goal. This is amazing.

**Angel Tree:** There were 9 organizations that we are supporting. 190 Angels in total. We raised \$7,455.

- Journey Home Hospice - \$600

- St. John's Families - \$430

Another great job by the team that organized this and by the entire Parish.

**Christmas Wreaths:** As a final note for the Christmas wreaths, we sold 77 wreaths and St. John's made \$530.25. Steve Seely and his wife Gail did a wonderful job in producing the wreaths. I hope everyone enjoyed their wreaths and maybe this will be a bigger event next Christmas. Steve will be looking to incorporate a pre-order system that may start in September.

**Fr. Peter's Update:** Happy New Year to all.

The Catholic Church is declining in church attendance. We have lost a number of priests and vocations. Some areas of the diocese have closed churches. The 4 parishes of EG/C, in addition to St. Lawrence, have formed a task force to think about our future in terms of areas of collaboration between parishes such as staff sharing and sharing Mass schedules in view of the declining number of priests. For example, here at St. John's we have a large capacity for church attendance but we never fill to capacity which may be similar to other parishes. We will be selecting 2 people to represent St. John's as we move through this process to see what we can do for each other into the future. The faithful are encouraged to pray for priest vocations. With the current climate in the church, it is difficult to find new vocations and even laity to serve in the church (as choir members, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, etc.).

Thanks to all who made our Christmas so special. Marcia, Tod, Choir members, decorators and all who attended our services.

**Certificates of Appreciation: Sharon Miller**

reported one pending nomination and a bulletin announcement should be out soon.

**Liturgy Committee: Tod: Feast of St. Blaise** on Feb 3, we will do the blessing of the throats on Feb 5-6. We need another volunteer for each Mass.

- **Hands of Christ** on Feb 15 and 17 at St. Lawrence, Mateo Tifone is receiving this award from our parish.
- **K of C** have requested Feb 28 to do a holy hour to include rosary, exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Litany of St Joseph from 7-8 PM and is open to the community.
- **Ash Wednesday** is approaching. **Stations of the Cross** will be led by each Ministry again this year. Wednesdays during lent the Stations will be prayed after morning mass.

**Pastoral Ministry/Homebound Outreach**

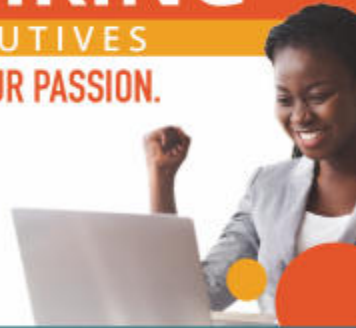
