

# Living in the Spirit

For years now, the Fourth Sunday of Easter has been designated as Good Shepherd Sunday. If you have a Catholic Calendar, you will also notice it is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, and of course, it is Mother's Day. There are many themes to focus on, many areas



calling for our attention. Every year on the Fourth Sunday of Easter we hear some portion of the 10<sup>th</sup> chapter of John's Gospel. Sometimes we hear Jesus saying that he is the gate and the gatekeeper, who calls his own by name (Jn. 10:1-10.) Sometimes Jesus identifies himself as the Good Shepherd, who lays down his life for his sheep (v. 11.) Sometimes, as we hear this weekend in verse 27, Jesus says, "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me."

But how do we hear the voice of God?


How do our children, youth, and young adults hear the voice of God and follow?

This past week the pastoral staff was conducting interviews of our Confirmation candidates as directed by the diocesan guidelines. Speaking strictly for myself, these interviews provide insightful and privileged moments. I fully enjoy hearing the voices of the young members of our community as they reflect and strive to verbalize the significance of the sacrament they are about to celebrate, the value of sacraments in their life, and faith in general. This year I was deeply struck by some of their responses. Some see Confirmation as a steppingstone in their overall education and formation in the process of growing up. Many do well in school, most are engaged in sports which are placed at a high priority above everything else. With great support from family, extended family and friends, they have a clear vision of where they are heading and what they would like to become. Some can provide clear answers to questions about sacraments and the gifts of the Holy Spirit but admit quite frankly, "my family doesn't go to church very often." Some, too many in my estimation and more than in previous years, face numerous challenges in their capacity to learn, in the ability to form close relationships and friendships, and in experiencing life in a faith filled community. Some grieve the loss of a parent or close relative that has impacted their life. Others struggle with relationships in blended families and their own gender identity. The mother and grandmother in me wishes I could just hug these kids and let them know how special they are and what a precious gift from God.

Today, I believe as a community of faith we have a special mission, a duty and an obligation, more than that, a vocation, a call, to which we must respond. All the baptized answer one and the same call: to bring the presence of Christ into the world – in other words, to be Christ for others, especially for our young people. We are called to give witness to all those whose lives we touch, so that through out words and actions Christ's love may be revealed. Our common vocation is to overcome the challenges distress of this world in every act of love, heart by heart and moment by moment.

May our hearts be filled with the voice of Christ who calls us and bids us to follow – to love as Christ loves.


including families, parishes, schools, religious congregations and other institutions, to participate in this crucial work. Let's pray for this mission using some of the words from *Laudato Si*':

# **Answering God's Call: Becoming Catholic**



God has placed within each human heart, the desire to come to know, love, and serve God. Roman Catholics have responded to this divine call by embracing the Catholic faith. For us, to be all that God created us to be means that we live a life of faith based on the Gospels and we do so as members of the Catholic Church.

There are others, as their lives unfold, that begin to wonder if God is not calling them to come to know God through the Catholic faith. The Church calls these people "Seekers" or "Inquirers" and has

established a process by which they may discern if God is calling them to be Catholic. This process is named the **R.C.I.A.** (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). It is a journey that involves learning about Catholicism and the community of faith they wish to join. Members of the community of faith or parish have an important role in accompanying these Seekers on this journey. Parishioners are asked to pray for them, to role model what it means to be a Catholic

disciple of Christ, and to take an active role (when possible) in the process by attending sessions and volunteering to help the Seekers discuss the readings/Gospel from our Sunday liturgy during our Dismissal Rites.

- The R.C.I.A. process is for anyone who is
- baptized in the Catholic Church, but may not have made First Communion or been Confirmed;
- baptized in another Christian Church, but now desires to become a member of our faith community;
- someone who has not been baptized.

Please pray about whether you are being nudged to explore the Catholic Faith or to invite someone to consider this process. You might even be called to take an active role in helping prepare those who come forward as Seekers.
