Dear Parishioners and Friends

Last Wednesday, Bishop Matano confirmed 66 of our teens at St. Lawrence Church, Greece. A big congratulations to them!

This year the candidates completed an online retreat (Project YM). They couldn't meet face-to-face with clergy, so the Director of Faith Formation Michelle Andrews-Smith and FF Assistant Paulette Foggetti requested that each candidate answer a few questions, which I had an opportunity to personally review. They even included a photo of each student, and I was able to recognize some of the faces at the ceremony and to put some new faces to names. I was delighted to learn more about their FAITH and some points of view about our religion, the Roman Catholic Church and the Sacrament of Confirmation, names which they had chosen and the people whom they admire.

During each Mass this weekend I'll ask them to stand, so we can congratulate them. You will find their names also on page 5.

Below I'd like to share some of the questions each candidate answered, and I'd like to ask you to reflect on them, recalling to your memory your own confirmation day.

Is it your desire to receive the sacrament of Confirmation and become a fully-initiated member of the Catholic Church?

What has been the most important thing you have learned about God and his Church these last few months?

How have you seen God working in your life throughout the preparation process? What is your prayer life like?

Do you embrace the teachings of Jesus Christ and the demands of discipleship?

How has your belief deepened these last few months?

What are some teachings of the Catholic faith that you struggle with? How do you deal with uncertainty and doubt?

Does your life in the Church impact you moment by moment, or do you still separate what you do in church from what you do in school (or work) and home?

Why did you choose the saint name you chose? How you will commit to imitating this saint's life in your own life?

Who are the people you admire for their Catholic faith? What qualities about them do you admire? What is something you want your sponsor to help you with on your faith journey?

I hope that in answering the above questions your reflection will likewise enrich your faith. Enjoy your answers.





FAITH FORMATION

Parents are the primary teachers of faith for their children. The goal of our Faith Formation program here at St. Louis Church is to support and encourage the development not only of your child/ren, but the entire family's growth in our Catholic faith. We look forward to partnering with parents to "pass on the faith" to their child/ren through our Faith Formation and Sacramental Preparation Programs, Youth Ministry, as well as Middle and High School Youth Groups.

Tuesday (4:30-5:30 p.m.) Faith Formation Classes:

These classes are held throughout the school year for children who are in Kindergarten—5th Grade in Public School.

Sunday (10:00-11:00 a.m.) Faith Formation Classes:

These classes are held throughout the school year, and are for children who are in Kindergarten—9th Grade in Public School. Classes are held between our Sunday Masses so that your family can attend Mass before or after class.

First Penance and First Eucharist Sacramental Prep:

The age of reason (when a child knows right from wrong) is about age 7, or Grade 2. For that reason, children are accepted into these preparation programs in 2nd Grade (or later), but must have completed 1 full year of religious education immediately prior **and** be enrolled in the current year of Faith Formation*.

Confirmation Sacramental Prep (2-Year program):

This program is for students who are in 8th grade or higher. Students must have completed 1 full year of religious education immediately prior (grade 7) **and** be enrolled in the current year of Youth Ministry*. Registration is required yearly for both years of preparation.

** Weekly classes are not required for students enrolled in Catholic schools, however, they must enroll and complete the sacramental prep program(s) in order to receive sacraments.*

CASE TRAINING

Dear Volunteers,

As you know, the Diocese of Rochester, as well the whole Catholic Church, is dedicated to the protection of our children and vulnerable adults. In a statement available on the DOR.org website, our Bishop states: *As the Shepherd of this Diocese, I will continue to work unceasingly to ensure that our parishes, schools and every entity connected to our Diocese are safe and holy environments for all.*

This is our unceasing work at St. Louis Church as well.

The Diocese recently reviewed its policies and who is required to complete the CASE training and has determined that ALL volunteers, in any capacity, ought to complete it, as you can read in their policy below:

In accordance with the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People promulgated by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) in 2002 and revised in 2018; all Volunteers, Employees (including: Clergy, Seminarians, Deacons, Woman Religious and Lay Employees) who work or volunteer in the Diocese of Rochester and its affiliated employers must complete MANDATORY training: Creating a Safe Environment Training (CASE – Volunteers), Safe Environment Training (SE – Employees), acknowledge the appropriate (Volunteer or Employee) Code of Conduct, and complete a Background Check prior to volunteer service or working within the Diocese. These must be renewed every 3 years.

We thank you so much for your service and ministry over these many years, and we humbly ask that your ministry continue! We don't want such a minor thing as a mandatory CASE training detract from the beauty of what you do when you come to minister every weekend.

We are not permitted to hold in person trainings at this time and for the foreseeable future, but the training is available online. You can complete it in the comfort of your own home! If you do not have a computer, you can arrange a time to come into the Ministry Center to complete the training on one of our computers. As well, if there is enough interest, the Diocese of Rochester has agreed to host a training session at the Diocesan offices, where you will complete the training on a computer provided by them while tech support is nearby to help with any difficulties.

If you have completed this training for another ministry and would like to know if your training is still up to date, please contact the staff member overseeing your ministry. They would be happy to look in our database.

Please note that the training for teen volunteers who are under 18 has also been updated. Background checks for minors are not required, but they must complete an online video and a code of conduct.

The day begins at 8:45am and concludes at 3:00pm . During your time with us, our priests are available for confession and/or conversation and will offer mass at the closing of our day.



Funeral Pre-Planning

“In Christ the hope of blessed resurrection has dawned, that those saddened by the certainty of dying might be consoled by the promise of immortality to come. Indeed, for your faithful, Lord, life is changed not ended, and, when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in heaven.” (from the Roman Missal Funeral Rite)



There are various reasons why someone would want to pre-plan their funeral liturgy. They may want to be involved in selecting readings and music that are particularly meaningful to them in life or that would speak strongly to their family in their moment of grief. They also may want to take some of the burden of decision making off the shoulders of their loved ones. Whatever the reasons, St. Louis Church has resources and recommendations to help you make your final arrangements in advanced. We can keep your files on record and changes can be made at any time.

Now and at the Hour of Our Death: A Catholic Guide to End-of-Life Decision-Making

By the Catholic Bishops of New York State

Advances in medical technologies bring with them new means of curing disease and living longer, healthier lives than ever before. But they can also be the source of heightened patient anxiety about a needlessly prolonged, painful and expensive dying process. Medical advances bring with them new and complex questions with regard to medical treatments and moral decision-making.

Our Catholic faith offers both a long tradition of reflection and Church teaching to help guide us through these multifaceted issues. It is important not to let the struggle over such questions eclipse what should be transcendent and grace-filled moments in the dying process: attending to spiritual needs, healing broken relationships, and saying good-bye.

Difficult decisions about the use of medical technology at the end of life may be made easier if we take the time to express our wishes about end-of-life treatments before illness strikes. This guide is designed to explain the moral principles of Catholic teaching with regard to end-of-life decision making and to outline the options that exist in New York State for advance care planning.
