



You Can Play an Important Role in Our Stephen Ministry



Christmas is upon us, and each of us, whatever their calling in life, stands in front of the manger with our fellow pilgrims, and beholds the love that loved us first.

Indeed, this past week has seen the winter solstice where the hours of daylight reached its lowest point this year, and in an astronomical anomaly not seen in about 800 years, Saturn and Jupiter appeared close enough that very day to form a light in the heavens some have dubbed the "Star of Bethlehem."

Reflecting upon this Christmas and the days of Advent that preceded it, I call to mind the thoughts that Father Paul has offered at the beginning and throughout this season. That is, we were called to prepare for this Christmas Day, to rethink our lives. We have been very well conditioned to think of another season, Lent, as one of preparation, mortification and the like. We may take it for granted that this is so, and perhaps it may give us difficulty in seeing Advent in the same light. Perhaps in addition to Fr. Paul's reflections, we can look at the words of the Carmelite Saint Edith Stein (Teresa Benedicta of the Cross).

Edith Stein's work, "The Mystery of Christmas," synthesizes these ideas into a cohesive whole. Consider the following: "The Star of Bethlehem shines in the night of sin... The shadow of the cross falls on the light that shines from the crib." Much like our own world that prefers the ways of darkness to that of the light, she continues "his (Simeon's) prophecy announced the Passion, the fight between light and darkness, that already showed itself before the crib."

In terms of our spiritual progress, "the way from Bethlehem leads inevitably to Golgotha, from the crib to the cross." Each of us will be asked to walk the way of the cross (to each their own path) as the way back to the One who loved us first.

In October, 1998 Pope John Paul II, would, at Edith Stein's canonization, reflect upon her life of grace and state that "the manger and the cross belong together."

St. Edith Stein would come of age in Germany in the first half of the 20th century. In 1916 she earned her doctorate in philosophy, and taught at the University of Freiburg. Originally from an Orthodox Jewish family, she renounced her Judaism only to find faith once again in Catholicism of the 1920s. In 1934 she entered the Carmel of Cologne (taking the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross) amid the anti Semitic oppression of the Third Reich. With no safe haven to flee she would be arrested by the Nazis, and in 1942 would perish in the gas chambers of Auschwitz, during the pit of darkness that was the Holocaust. Today, and always her life of grace shines as brightly as any of the stars in the heavens. God love you and be with you and bless you abundantly this Christmas season and always.

Fifth grade at Saint Pius Tenth School is an exciting one— students are finally the “big kids”, they get to participate in more experiences and they are role models for the other students. Arrival and dismissal times look different this year and younger children look to the fifth graders for guidance. We are reminded everyday of our blessings and gifts, what we have to offer and our effect on others. Most of all, Saint Pius Tenth School helps children to remember their faith and that they will never walk alone.



A MOMENT WITH TODAY'S SCRIPTURES



Tragedy and disappointment are inevitable. What sees you through this? There will be challenges, changes, unexpected circumstances, interrupted plans, hurts, and injustices experienced by every human being at some point in their lives. We will be asked to adjust our plans, change course, and even encounter suffering and death. Where do we learn all of the lessons we need to live life well? Some of them we learn along the way but much of what we bring to life, positive and

negative, comes from our early beginnings, our families. This is our early world and provides the blueprint for how we see the bigger, more inclusive world, which unfolds before us.

Our families of origin can be sources of grace, heartache or a combination of both. Families are intended to be pivotal in providing us with proper social structure and understanding, a support system, lessons about relationships and communication, and the unconditional acceptance and love we so desperately crave. They can also determine whether we have an accessible and healthy relationship with God. Many of life's challenges can literally bring us to our knees and require that we possess a strength of character that resides well beyond the superficialities of our world. At some point we will all need three coping gifts that can be given to us only by God: faith, hope, and love. Our families help us learn that we are not the ones responsible for their creation, but God!

Our experience of early family life colors all of our relationships and what we expect to achieve from life in general. Resolving conflicts, dealing with difficulty and suffering, celebrating accomplishments, prioritizing our needs, listening to God's call, understanding relationships, understanding disappointment, learning about the virtues and living a centered focused life are all lessons our families either succeed in teaching or do not. To succeed, as God has designed and ordered our world, is to discover his presence and then trust that Presence. The Holy Family can teach even the most dysfunctional family how to best use God's gifts of faith, hope, and love to find him and do his will.
