Good Morning World. It is March 15th, Monday of the fourth week of Lent. The readings for today's mass (including an audio version) may be found at [uscgb.org](http://uscgb.org).

The gospel is from John 4:43-54

"Faith in the Face of Cynicism"

"What an odd exchange in today's Gospel. First the man asks for his son's healing. Then Jesus seems to reprimand him: "You people won't believe unless you see signs." The man appears to disregard Jesus' words and says, "Sir, come down before my child dies." To which Jesus replies, "Go home—it's done."



What just happened? Jesus speaks as if he is surrounded by unbelief, and the man responds by demonstrating his faith in Jesus' power to heal. I wonder if Jesus' first response issues from frustration; perhaps he has experienced too much cynicism from people, is weary of their demanding that he prove himself with signs and wonders. Or perhaps Jesus is expressing surprise that this man, out of so many, has persistent faith.

In a cynical world, the voice of faith can sound small and insignificant. Thousands of voices—on social media, in our families, in the news—sound the alarms. They tell us the world is ending, that we are victims of expansive conspiracies, and that we can trust no one (except, of course, a certain leader or movement). Our declaration that God's goodness continues to work throughout creation can get lost in the hysterics.

While segments of society grow ever more fearful, vengeful, violent, and self-focused, our openness, compassion, and creative love feel like foolish acts of vulnerability. Are we willing to speak faith into the whirlwind of panic and antagonism? Will we persist in bringing our needs to Jesus, believing that his enduring love surpasses and heals all?" ~Vinita Hampton Wright

I echo Vinita Hampton Wright's wondering about Jesus' response to the royal official's request.

Jesus got a lot of guff and pushback over what He was saying and doing. The people, including the religious leaders asked for proof (signs) of His authority to speak and act as He was doing. And no proof was enough.

Was this a reaction to all the "non-acceptance" of the message?


The man was a royal official. Jesus had bad press with people in authority - civil and religious. Was Jesus surprised that someone of the man's standing would approach Him, asking for help? Did Jesus react because of His history?

Did Jesus respond as He did as a setup for the miracle? Sometimes Jesus knew what was in people's mind and hearts. Did His response help the man just come right out and present his request?

The royal official was not deterred. He loved his child. He believed Jesus could help.

World, let us not be deterred by anyone or anything. May we persist in our faith that Jesus loves us and that Jesus, the Divine Physician, is a healer.

Jesus, we believe.

The second graders have been so busy! They have been working nonstop building their skills in ELA and math and are doing a fine job of it!

We have been working so hard on finding the main idea and supporting details in a variety of informational text in ELA, Science, and Social Studies. We have been using our highlighters to identify key information for quite some time now, and the students are becoming more independent with this skill.

Paragraph writing has become the norm, and we are continuing our focus on adding as much detail as possible to develop strong, interesting paragraphs.

In Math, we are practicing 3-digit addition and subtraction. We have learned strategies to help ourselves

How do we convince people that God's law is written upon their hearts? God is wedded to God's people. This is a simple and fundamental fact of life. Yet, many ignore this truth and carry on as if they, or humanity as a whole, are the center of the universe. As a grain of wheat has to fall to the ground and die in order to become what it really is, we too must die to our secular images and ideas of ourselves so that we can become who God really made us to be. If all of us kept our focus on God's deep bonded love with human beings, indeed with our very self, then there would be no need to teach others this fundamental life lesson. They would simply know this truth, as Jeremiah tells us. Somehow, perhaps through original and personal sin, we have lost sight of this reality. We have lost our way and our axis. It is time to find our way back, to learn the virtue of obedience, to pay attention to what God is saying and become aware of the Divine Love that is the reason for all creation. Then, even in our darkest hour when all may seem to be lost, we can say as did Jesus, the model of obedience, "Father, glorify your name," By this perseverance, people can come to know the Lord and what God has done.

**A MOMENT WITH TODAY'S SCRIPTURES**

Any good teacher or parent will tell you that once a lesson is really learned it doesn't need to be taught again. When we internalize things we have learned, they become a part of who we are and influence how we perceive and interact with our world. The same is true for the law God has written upon our hearts. Once humanity learns this lesson, we will simply know it to be true and act accordingly. Sometimes, it is hard to get people to learn the lessons they need to learn. They are often distracted, disinterested, conflicted, misdirected, or just too stubborn and unable or unwilling to see what is right before their eyes. Understanding that God is in a loving and committed relationship with those fashioned and formed in God's own image, seems like such a simple lesson to learn. But history and experience has proven that it is not.

We struggle with faith, especially when that faith asks us to learn something very particular about ourselves. We must, like a grain of wheat, fall to the ground and die. Because God's DNA is at the very core of who we are, there are specific pearls of wisdom that must be acquired before we can live a full life. One very powerful lesson is that it is not the task of the world to tell us who we are and what has meaning, but God. For many, death is not an opportunity for greater life but a permanent ending to the life they have known. Jesus knew every dimension to what it means to be fully human because he was! He knows the joys, limitations, sorrows, frustrations, wonders, suffering, opportunities, and joys of the human experience. Jesus can teach us a wealth of knowledge and life's lessons from his example, especially obedience.

When we accept the law God has placed in our hearts and gain wisdom from it, then when we suffer we learn to listen more attentively to the Voice behind that law. We naturally flee to our Creator for inspiration, consolation, hope, direction, and comfort as we navigate through this time of darkness. We will not need to run from it, subdue it, fight it, or be overcome by it because we will know, having internalized this profound lesson before, that God will bring new life. God's law is love and love never fails. Even in the moments of Jesus' deepest despair, he glorified the name of his Father. What he learned allowed him to put everything in perspective and be obedient to the tender, loving Voice that echoed within. As Lent quickly winds down, may we learn the same! Then, may we gain the fortitude and wisdom to help others see what is right before their eyes.



## EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

### When Our Own Hour Comes

We parents know that it's tricky, tackling the topic of fear with our kids. We want them to know that it's okay to be scared, that it's something we all feel from time to time. We want them to understand that bravery isn't the absence of fear, but the choices we make in persevering despite that feeling.

Most of all, we want to model the right kind of behavior for our kids. Whatever our scary situation is — illness, a job loss, life changes — we want them to see us make a choice to face that fear head-on.

Jesus seems to be the parent who is gently broaching the topic of fear with his children. A great sense of foreboding hangs over these readings. Jesus knew what was coming. He knew it was going to be hard, both for him and for his followers, who did not have his courage. Even he admits to being "troubled" and he speaks of "the time of judgment." There is the dramatic raising of Lazarus, the talk of how a grain of wheat must die in order to bear fruit, the depiction of Christ as an obedient student of his own suffering.

"Yet what should I say?" he asks them. "Father, save me from this hour?" But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour."

This week, Christ gives us a very parental gift: He shows us his fear, and he shows us how to conquer it. He challenges us to embrace the purpose for which we came to this hour — whatever that hour may hold.
