St. Pius X Pastor's Pastoral Page (Facebook) *Monday, April 5, 2021*

Good Morning World. It is April 5th, Monday in the Octave of Easter. The readings for today mass may be found at usccb.org. The gospel is from Matthew 28:8-15

Friends, in today's Gospel, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary encounter the risen Jesus. I know that I have harped often on this theme, but I do so only because the Bible harps on it—and also because the culture tends so thoroughly to miss the point. I'm talking about the meaning of Easter. Many people agree with David Cameron, the former Prime Minister of Great Britain, who once said that the message of Easter is "kindness, compassion, hard work, and responsibility."

Now don't get me wrong: I'm for all of those things. But so is, I would guess, any decent person from any religious or non-religious background. Buddhists, Muslims, Hindus, Jews, fair-minded atheists and agnostics would all sign on for those values.

None of it is getting anywhere near the heart of what Easter really means. What Easter means is that Jesus of Nazareth, who claimed throughout his public life to be speaking and acting in the very person of God, and who was brutally put to death by Roman executioners, rose bodily from the dead. That's what it's all about.

A Reflection of the Year

As I reflect on the last year, one word keeps coming to mind – WOW!

I suppose that could be the end of my reflection, given all that we have been through! At

times, it seems that it has been 10 minutes, and at other times, it seems like 10 years.

I can think of no one that has not been touched in some way by all that has transpired over the last 12 months, either physically, emotionally, or socially, and while there is so much negative, I can not help but be inspired by all of the positive.

As a school, we have been faced with some pretty challenging circumstances. There are no classes for “pandemic planning” in teacher or administration preparation programs, but look what we have done! I can not give enough credit to the faculty and staff of Saint Pius Tenth School, John Falk (our building maintenance ace), and the wonderful “One and Done” project volunteers for ensuring that we would do whatever it took to start the year with five-day, full-time instruction. With that said, I would like to share with you some results of the phenomenal work that our teachers and students have been doing.

As a component of our Math and Reading programs, we utilize the “iReady” data-driven instruction program as a tool for both instructional and assessment purposes. Each school year, our students take three diagnostic assessments (beginning, middle, and end of year) to measure benchmarks and growth.

Anticipating the learning loss resulting from missing the final three months of last school year, we thought it would be incredibly difficult to recover and begin to build again. Nope, not at Saint Pius Tenth School, and really all of our Diocesan schools. I share with you the following good news: overall, our students in Grades K – 5 improved an average of 4 points on the reading diagnostic between October and February, and on the Math diagnostic the same grades improved by an overall average of 15.5 points. Congratulations to all! This is truly something to celebrate!

We look forward to finishing the school year in the same strong fashion as it began. I take that back...we look forward to finishing the school year in an even stronger fashion than it began. After all, we are Saint Pius Strong!



Imagine this dynamic, powerful, compassionate, piercing, embracing, loving, propelling, penetrating, absorbing, and enveloping, transforming presence of God flowing into the very depth of our souls. It is God's mercy that allows blood to flow through our veins. It is God's mercy that forms every atom of our being and leads us to what is true. God's mercy reveals all superficiality and falsehood, and lays bare all distortions, empty promises, weakness, and sin.

Eye Has Not Seen

They say seeing is believing. But if you've ever ordered a pair of pants online, you know that's not always the case. Whatever the photos promise us, what looked like a perfectly nice shade of navy blue on our computer screens comes in the mail as an unusual shade of blue green that only appears in the giant box of Crayola crayons.

The Apostle Thomas, who couldn't bring himself to accept that Jesus had risen from the dead without seeing him, is such an utterly relatable figure in the Gospels. Thomas is still reeling from a loss — not only of his good friend but his Lord, who was taken prisoner and crucified before his eyes. Thomas is guarding himself. He's not believing the hype. He's going to be the only judge of what is real and what is fiction.

Would any of us be any different? We've all had those thoughts. Can we believe it all — Jesus, salvation history, the Eucharist — when we haven't seen it with our own two eyes?

That's when we need to remember that those two eyes were absolutely positive they had ordered a pair of navy blue pants.

It's easy for us to sit back stroking our chins in judgment at Thomas, "you didn't believe the testimony of your friends!" But do we accept the testimony of our friends? The saints, the popes, the Church fathers themselves?

Sometimes the things that are most worthy of believing can't be seen with the naked eye.




