Good Morning World. It is May 7th, Friday of the fifth week of Easter. The readings for today's mass (including an audio version) may be found at [usccb.org](http://usccb.org). The gospel is from John 15:12-17

"The spiritual life starts at the place where you can hear God's voice. Where somehow you can claim that long before your father, your mother, your brother, your sister, your school, your church touched you, loved you, and wounded you—long before that, you were held safe in an eternal embrace. You were seen with eyes of perfect love long before you entered into the dark valley of life. The spiritual life starts at the moment that you can go beyond all of the wounds and claim that there was a love that was perfect and unlimited, long before that perfect love became reflected in the imperfect and limited, conditional love of people. The spiritual life starts where you dare to claim the first love. 'Love one another because I have loved you first' (see John 4:19)." (Father Henri Nouwen, [henrinouwen.org](http://henrinouwen.org))

Love can be a difficult topic to broach because of the wide and varied experiences people have with love:

Abused by parents  
Neglected by parents  
Only one parent  
Abandoned by parents  
Abused by siblings/other family members  
No friends  
Picked on by school mates  
Never asked out/turned down by everyone you ask out  
Rejected by "first love"  
Cheated on  
Constantly criticized by the one who is supposed to be loving you  
And so on...

When these are the experiences of people around you, it can make you hesitate to begin speaking about love.

If no one dares, however, to speak about love because of the wounds of those around you, how can those around you know there is a way to begin healing, that there is a way to know love?

When a surgery is necessary to heal the body, the actual surgery begins by wounding the body, making an incision to expose that which needs to be healed.

There may be fear, hesitating to expose the emotional and spiritual wounds for fear of hurting even more.

Understood.

But if you want to heal, if you want to move in the spiritual life on your spiritual journey, it has to be acknowledged and addressed.


Some fear that place of hearing God's voice. They are afraid God won't speak to them. They are afraid of opening the wounds and hurting more. They are afraid of what God might say to them.

For even the briefest moment, can you dare to think, can you dare to imagine that there is a God and that this God does indeed love you with a perfect and unlimited love? And when your memory begins telling you, even screaming at you, that those who were supposed to love you didn't love you perfectly (or love you at all) can you quietly hush your memory and tell yourself that God is different, that God loves you perfectly and completely, because God IS love?

World, it takes work to transcend the experiences that are incomplete and less than perfect. It takes work to believe, to hope, to trust. But it is work that must be done if you want to move in the journey of the spiritual life.

## **Puzzles in Pre-K**

From the very first day of school, I build time for doing puzzles into our daily schedule. Whether the students are working on small puzzles by themselves at their table spots or working on a large floor puzzle with a friend, our preschoolers are getting so many benefits from putting puzzles together.

While doing puzzles, students are practicing critical thinking skills and problem-solving as they search for a solution to complete a puzzle. When deciding where a puzzle piece fits, they are considering several things at the same time: Is the piece the correct shape? Do the colors of the pieces match? Does the piece make sense within the picture (does the grass go at the top, does it make sense to put the clouds at the bottom)? What a great way to develop their spatial relationship skills, not to mention concentration!

Playing with puzzles is not only good exercise for the brain, it also exercises the muscles in our hands to develop coordination and dexterity.

Strengthening the fine motor muscles in the hands and fingers is necessary for students to accomplish everyday tasks such as buttoning, zipping, using scissors, and properly gripping writing utensils like crayons, markers, and pencils. Puzzles are also great tools for improving students' hand-eye coordination as they move the pieces around to find where they fit. Hand-eye coordination is important as children learn to catch a ball and as their handwriting develops.

When our students are able to complete a puzzle with no assistance from an adult, they feel a sense of pride and accomplishment which contributes to a positive social-emotional learning experience.

## Ready for an adventure? Come White Water Rafting with us!



### A MOMENT WITH TODAY'S SCRIPTURES



God remains where love remains. When a believer realizes without doubt that God is love, it is a powerful moment. Being able to place our resurrection trust in this fundamental truth allows us to experience God's presence in all of our experiences: the good and the bad, positive and negative, life enriching and destructive events we encounter. It is no wonder

that St. Paul so accurately tells us that it is love that endures all things and lasts. How can God not endure or ever fade away? Because he is God, Jesus also guarded and protected his disciples as the endearing shepherd who always had their best interest at heart.

If we become too immersed in the world, we lose touch with these deeper realities. We can become so preoccupied with preserving what we have created or think that we need, forgetting that it is not building our city that really matters, but God's. Jesus clearly did not belong to the world and, by virtue of his resurrection, he tries to get us to understand that we do not either. The truth brings us to other worldly, more divine places and takes our eyes off of the concerns that often captivate our fears and storm our senses.

Life can easily erode our faith. Think of your life over the last couple of weeks. What challenged your faith and distracted your divine glance? Even being overly stimulated with technology and social media can erode our sense of confidence and cause us to forget who we really are. We need to distance ourselves from the world in order to experience the joy that Christ offers. The world will never like the word of God. It is too challenging and too perplexing. The world mistakenly believes that it can survive on its own. It is a mistaken judgment that may cost people a lot in the end. It is all so very simple: God remains when we love one another. If in all the business of our lives and all that each day brings, the good and the bad, we follow the call and path of love, we will walk with God. 
