## **St. Pius X Pastor's Pastoral Page (Facebook)** *Wednesday, May 26, 2021*

Good Morning World. It is May 24th. The Easter season officially ended yesterday with evening prayer (Vespers) of Pentecost. We have returned to ordinary time, this being the eighth week in ordinary time. The Monday after Pentecost has been designated by Pope Francis as the memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church. The readings for today's mass (including an audio version) may be found at [uscceb.org](http://uscceb.org).

The gospel is from John 19:25-34

### MARY, MOTHER OF THE CHURCH

By issuing the Decree on the celebration of the feast of Mary, Mother of the Church, Pope Francis wishes to promote this devotion in order to "encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the Church in the pastors, religious and faithful, as well as a growth of genuine Marian piety".

The decree reflects on the history of Marian theology in the Church's liturgical tradition and the writings of the Church Fathers.

It says Saint Augustine and Pope Saint Leo the Great both reflected on the Virgin Mary's importance in the mystery of Christ.

"In fact the former [St. Augustine] says that Mary is the mother of the members of Christ, because with charity she cooperated in the rebirth of the faithful into the Church, while the latter [St. Leo the Great] says that the birth of the Head is also the birth of the body, thus indicating that Mary is at once Mother of Christ, the Son of God, and mother of the members of his Mystical Body, which is the Church."

The decree says these reflections are a result of the "divine motherhood of Mary and from her intimate union in the work of the Redeemer."

Scripture, the decree says, depicts Mary at the foot of the Cross (cf. Jn 19:25). There she became the Mother of the Church when she "accepted her Son's testament of love and welcomed all people in the person of the beloved disciple as sons and daughters to be reborn unto life eternal."

In 1964, the decree says, Pope Paul VI "declared the Blessed Virgin Mary as 'Mother of the Church, that is to say of all Christian people, the faithful as well as the pastors, who call her the most loving Mother' and established that 'the Mother of God should be further honoured and invoked by the entire Christian people by this tenderest of titles.'" There have been, are and probably will continue to be theological debates on the role of Mary, Mother of Jesus, in salvation history. One extreme acknowledges that Mary gave birth to Jesus and then wants to relegate her to the back row. The other extreme emphasizes her role to the point of almost forgetting to mention Jesus.

Somewhere in the middle is room for devotion to Mary as we worship Jesus her Son.

As for her role as the Mother of the Church, who doesn't need a mother?

Some of the theology of her motherhood of the church is explained in the above article.

Mothers bond with their children immediately after bringing them to birth, a bond that is said to be stronger than any other bond between two human beings.

Mothers are protective of their children, yet not hesitating to chasten or chastise their children when necessary.

Mothers love their children with a love that is often compared to the love that God the Father has for His children.

Mothers never take the spotlight, often pushing their children forward to receive any attention or praise that is offered.

Mothers take care to make their children presentable for the world, washing their clothes and scrubbing their faces.

And no matter how old their children get, even as adults, they are always their mother's child.

Mary, Mother of Jesus, Son of God, second Person of the Blessed Trinity.

Mary, Mother of the Church.

Mary, heavenly mother for you and for me.

"Holy Mary, Mother of God, Mother of the Church, my Mother, pray for us all, now and through our entire lives. Amen."



It is easy to get distracted and lose focus, especially when we are being pulled in so many directions. We can not only lose sight of God but one another. Maintaining our well developed and mature relationships with God and one another is essential to continuing to live, healthy, happy, and focused lives. In a message to young people, Pope Benedict XVI said, "the happiness you are seeking, the happiness you have a right to enjoy has a name and a face: it is Jesus of Nazareth, hidden in the Eucharist." What is true for those who are younger is even truer for those who are older. Regardless of how the particulars of life change over time, human beings are still hard-wired to seek the fullness of life and happiness. ### EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

#### We Can Prepare the Upper Room

We all know that person, don't we? Hey, maybe we've even been that person.

"I have a great relationship with God, but I don't go to church regularly. God and I are on good terms. I can talk to Him just fine on my own."

There isn't anything false in these statements. It's important to have an intimate, even conversational prayer relationship with God. But the problem with this attitude is that it implies that churches don't matter. Community worship doesn't matter. Today, we are reminded exactly why that is so untrue. Why we need our parishes, our priests, and each other.

The Body and Blood of Christ — that's what it's all about. If it's not about that, it's not about anything. If we don't have the Eucharist, we're just like the ancient priests, making sacrifices that don't have the power to redeem anybody.

Where do we receive the Body and Blood of Christ? For most of us, it's in our parishes. The altar of sacrifice is also the table we gather in front of, as a family, to become one with Christ in the truest and realest way possible, recreating the scene in the Upper Room over and over again every time Mass is celebrated.

The disciples were commissioned by Christ to prepare the Upper Room for the Last Supper. How can we take up that work ourselves? How can we strengthen the bonds in our spiritual family? How can we serve our parish, always remembering that the table is not meant to be set only for two?


