

Good Morning World. It is June 11th, Friday of the tenth week in ordinary time. Today the Church celebrates the Solemn Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. The readings for today's mass (including an audio version) may be found at usccb.org. The gospel is from John 19:31-37

SOLEMNITY OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back at least to the 11th century, but through the 16th century, it remained a private devotion, often tied to devotion to the Five Wounds of Christ. The first feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated on August 31, 1670, in Rennes, France, through the efforts of Fr. Jean Eudes (1602-1680). From Rennes, the devotion spread, but it took the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) for the devotion to become universal.

In all of these visions, in which Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary, the Sacred Heart of Jesus played a central role. The "great apparition," which took place on June 16, 1675, during the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi, is the source of the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart. In that vision, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary to request that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated on the Friday after the octave (or eighth day) of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them. The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all mankind.

The devotion became quite popular after St. Margaret Mary's death in 1690, but, because the Church initially had doubts about the validity of St. Margaret Mary's visions, it wasn't until 1765 that the feast was celebrated officially in France. Almost 100 years later, in 1856, Pope Pius IX, at the request of the French bishops, extended the feast to the universal Church. It is celebrated on the day requested by our Lord—the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi, or 19 days after Pentecost Sunday. (Fr. Richard Heilman, romancatholicman.com)

Margaret Mary shared the experience of her visions of Jesus with a Jesuit priest, Father Claude de la Colombiere. The story has been passed down that Father de la Colombiere first had doubts about the authenticity of Margaret Mary's visions. He asked for a sign. He said to Margaret Mary that the next time Jesus appeared to her, he wanted Jesus to tell her what he had confessed in his last confession. Claude knew that only three people would know what he had confessed. He himself, the priest to whom he confessed and Jesus. So if Margaret Mary could tell him his sins, he knew that she was truly talking with Jesus. The next time she visited with him, Claude asked her what Jesus had said about his sins. Her response was, "Jesus told me to tell you that he has forgotten them already." Claude knew that this was truly the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, not only to forgive our sins but to also forget them. He was reduced to tears and was convinced to help Margaret Mary spread devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

My experience as a confessor has shown me that people have difficulty forgiving themselves for their sins. Sometimes people can believe that God does indeed forgive them their sins, but they struggle to forgive themselves and they struggle to let go of their sins. Sharing the story of Margaret Mary and Claude will often help a person to forgive themselves and to let go of their sins.

World, no matter how serious our sins, no matter the pain of our sins, no sin is greater than the love of God that comes to us through the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

God forgives you, World.
Please accept God's forgiveness
and please forgive yourself.

Prayer Before an Examination


Dear Lord, as I take this exam, I thank you that my value is not based on my performance, but on your great love for me.



Ite ad Joseph

150 years ago, Blessed Pope Pius IX declared St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To celebrate the anniversary, Pope Francis has declared this a year of St. Joseph. In honor of this special occasion, I asked parish council if I could share some information that I have recently learned after reading an excellent book, Consecration to St. Joseph, by Father Donald Calloway. Many wonders are attributed to St. Joseph. Over the few weeks, I hope to share some of them with you.

First, there are many colleges, churches, and shrines named after St. Joseph. One of my favorites is St. Joseph's in Lockport, NY. This is where I was baptized, received my first communion, and my confirmation. In the front of the church, the resurrected Jesus is shown in a large mural. Above the picture are the Latin words *Ite ad Joseph*, which means "go to Joseph." This is great advice that we all need to follow. Joseph protected Mary and Jesus. He will protect us too!

St. Joseph is called "the delight of the saints." St. Maximillian Kolbe said, "with the exception of our loving Mother, St. Joseph stands above all the saints." After learning about St. Joseph, I could not agree more. An example of someone who also felt this way was St. Andre Bessette who grew up in Montreal. His father died when he was 9 years old, and his mother died when he was 11. Bessette became an orphan. He said that he had a strong devotion to St. Joseph since his parents died. He always wanted to become a priest but was not able to because he had poor health and was a poor student. He became a lay brother, and is known today as Brother Andre. He served as a humble porter for more than 40 years. Thousands of people would visit him and write letters. His message was this: When you go to Joseph, keep it simple. Ask St. Joseph, "if you were me, what would you do in this situation?" This humble, uneducated man went on to build the preeminent shrine to our Blessed Mother's husband, St. Joseph's Oratory, in Montreal, which I myself hope to visit once the borders reopen.

I have often heard Father Paul say that St. Joseph is a powerful saint and intercessor that we have access to in our lives. Let him help you.

Why has Pope Francis proclaimed this the year of St. Joseph? I think it is because Joseph is the protector of Jesus and Mary---the Holy Family. Joseph also can be the greatest protector of your family.

St. Joseph, pray for us. Protect us with your paternal care. Help us to imitate you with your faithful devotion. Lead us to the bosom of Mary, so that we may be touched by Jesus.

A MOMENT WITH TODAY'S SCRIPTURES

As we look at our lives and world events, do we ever find ourselves wondering if God is sleeping? We would miss opportunities to learn how to drink more deeply of life, treasure its complexity, irony, and beauty and fully engage ourselves in surrendering to the love of our Creator. It is easy to walk on the surface of life without immersing ourselves in its messiness. Life has to burn its way through us in order to bring us to a place of secure trust. It's unfortunate that some prefer a shallower journey.

That's the balancing act that comes with faith. It is not God's job to prevent us from encountering the torrential rains and winds of life. Many believe that if faith is done the right way, that God will provide for smooth sailing. That's not how it works. God permits us to ride out the difficult stuff knowing that the storm will eventually be calmed. Do we not have faith that God will do this? True faith trusts in the steadfastness of God's love when the seas are calm and when they are choppy. God's unconditional loving presence shines through all of it and endures forever. Knowing this allows us to put our boats out into uncharted waters without hesitation. 

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

Waking God

A show of hands, ladies and gentlemen. Have any of you been given the silent treatment and had absolutely no idea why?

On the flipside, have any of you have sworn you're not going to demean yourself by explaining, for the thousandth time, that you need extra help with the kids before soccer practice, or that you feel ignored when your spouse doesn't ask how your day went?

But sadly, love doesn't give you the ability to read minds. And in the end, we learn the lesson again and again, we have to verbalize our feelings, our needs, our wants. Expecting your partner to anticipate your needs is guaranteed to end badly.

It's the same with God, even though, oddly enough, He *does* have the ability to read minds. But He still desires us to explain ourselves to Him, doesn't He? "I'm feeling scared of this." "I'm really worried about that." "God, I think I need x, y and z. Help me. Please."

Jesus slept on that boat, as it was tossed and turned by the waves, until his disciples woke him. "Why were you sleeping?" they ask. Well, geniuses, he was sleeping because they hadn't woken him up yet. They had wasted time cowering in fear, waiting for him to act. They gave him the silent treatment and they didn't even know it.

God doesn't desire us to verbalize our needs as a way of keeping us submissive. He's not that petty. What He desires is the communication — that's what really counts. That act of opening yourself up, of becoming vulnerable, of relying on Him, trusting Him. If it feels like God is asleep in your life, ask yourself this, have you tried waking Him up?




