Good Morning World. It is August 9th, Monday of the nineteenth week in ordinary time. August 9th is the memorial of Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. The readings for today's mass (including an audio version) may be found at usccb.org. The first reading is from Deuteronomy 10:12-22

SAINT TERESA BENEDICTA OF THE CROSS' STORY

A brilliant philosopher who stopped believing in God when she was 14, Edith Stein was so captivated by reading the autobiography of Teresa of Avila that she began a spiritual journey that led to her baptism in 1922. Twelve years later she imitated Saint Teresa by becoming a Carmelite, taking the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross.

Born into a prominent Jewish family in Breslau, Germany—now Wroclaw, Poland—Edith abandoned Judaism in her teens. As a student at the University of Göttingen, she became fascinated by phenomenology—an approach to philosophy. Excelling as a protégé of Edmund Husserl, one of the leading phenomenologists, Edith earned a doctorate in philosophy in 1916. She continued as a university teacher until 1922, when she moved to a Dominican school in Speyer; her appointment as lecturer at the Educational Institute of Munich ended under pressure from the Nazis.

After living for four years in the Cologne Carmel, Sister Teresa Benedicta moved to the Carmelite monastery in Echt, Netherlands, in 1938. The Nazis occupied that country in 1940. In retaliation for being denounced by the Dutch bishops, the Nazis arrested all Dutch Jews who had become Christians. Teresa Benedicta and her sister Rosa, also a Catholic, died in a gas chamber in Auschwitz on August 9, 1942. Pope John Paul II beatified Teresa Benedicta of the Cross in 1987 and canonized her 12 years later.

REFLECTION

The writings of Edith Stein fill 17 volumes, many of which have been translated into English. A woman of integrity, she followed the truth wherever it led her. After becoming a Catholic, Edith continued to honor her mother's Jewish faith. Sister Josephine Koepfel, O.C.D., translator of several of Edith's books, sums up this saint with the phrase, "Learn to live at God's hands." Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross is a Patron Saint of: Converts to Christianity and Europe (franciscanmedia.org)

"Love and serve the LORD, your God, with all your heart and all your soul."

That was the instruction from Moses to the children of Israel.

Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross expressed it, "Learn to live at God's hands." It was her way of saying she wanted to love and serve the Lord with all her heart and all her soul.

Saint Teresa was an extremely intelligent woman. Her intellectual pursuits led her away from the religion of her family. But, in time, they also led her to a relationship with Jesus.

The religion of her family and her relationship with Christ also become the combination that led Saint Teresa to witness to these elements of her life though a martyr's death in a gas chamber at Auschwitz.

For Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, it was living at God's hands. It was her way of loving and serving the Lord with all her heart and all her soul.


Sometimes it can be a struggle to know how to live at God's hands. It can be a struggle to know the exact details every day of how to love and serve the Lord with all our heart and soul.

The life and example of Edith Stein/Teresa Benedicta of the Cross provides a template. The daily use of her God-given gift of intellect led her to a relationship with Jesus. It wasn't her intent or her goal. But the daily living out of what she had been given was her path of holiness, without her even knowing it.

The daily living out of her relationship with Jesus led her to the great witness of her faith through martyrdom. Again, that was not her intent or her goal. But her faithfulness to the daily little things of her faith led to her sainthood in heaven.

World, use the gifts that God has given you so as to love and serve the Lord. And wherever each day leads you, trust that you are at God's hands and live each day from your relationship with Jesus.

May Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross pray for us to be faithful to our journeys.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP WWMD?

WWJD bracelets were all the rage about 25 years ago in Christian circles. I've always wondered if a WWMD bracelet might not make just as much sense, and maybe more. What Would Mary Do?

I would argue that Mary was the most exemplary steward who ever lived. Her answer was always "Yes." Yes, Lord, I am Your handmaiden. Yes, I will visit Elizabeth, and help her in the last difficult months of pregnancy. Yes, I will bring my son up in the Mosaic law and present him at the Temple of Jerusalem. Yes, I will give him to the crowds and to public ministry. Yes, I will offer him on this Cross, if it is Your will.

Yes, yes, yes.

Well, I can't be like Mary, we think to ourselves. There's an intimidation factor with the Blessed Mother and Catholics sometimes — one that almost exceeds that of Christ. Perhaps it's because we are in awe of the fact that she was not divine in any way — she was a mere creation, like us — but somehow, she always had the courage to say yes. How could she do it, when we find it so hard?

Well, God certainly lavished on Mary extraordinary graces. Her lack of original sin liberated her to conform her will to God's.

But God is impatient to give us, too, all the graces we need to be a steward in the example of Mary. He's waiting for us simply to ask. Just as in Adam we died, so in Christ — through Mary — we live.

What can we say yes to today, in Mary's example?




