St. Pius X Pastor's Pastoral Page (Facebook) *Saturday, September 18, 2021*

Good Morning World. It is September 18th, Saturday of the 24th week in ordinary time. The readings for today's mass (including an audio version) may be found at uscpcb.org. The gospel is from Luke 8:4-15

"Knowledge of the mysteries of the Kingdom of God has been granted to you; but to the rest, they are made known through parables so that they may look but not see, and hear but not understand."

It's a language thing, again. There's a word (para)indicating blindness ("but not see") that is often used in the New Testament as a metaphor for blindness at different levels - physical blindness and spiritual blindness.

The parables are used to convey a message. Some get the meaning right away. Some need further explanation.

There are those who may or may not get the meaning of the parable. If they do get the meaning, they refuse to acknowledge it. If they do not get the meaning, they refuse to look for the meaning.

The disciples are seeking the meaning of this parable. They wanted to know. They wanted to "see" what it means.

There are times when I ask a question and, upon receiving the answer, can honestly respond, "I thought that's what it would be."

There are other times when I ask a question and, upon receiving the answer, respond, "Wow, I never would have thought of that."

World, there are times when you have a real gut sense of what God is "saying" to you, and you just don't want to go there. There are times you have no clue and keep asking and asking what God is trying to say to you.

You can ask God for the grace to see and understand. You can be in the darkness of "not seeing" by choice.

Seeking to "see" or refusing to "see" - It's up to you, World.

Do you see that?

Fulfilling Our Mission

The opening days of school are in the books. While we have made some minor changes to our programming, the opening week was an overall success!

We are thrilled to be bringing back some in-person events, albeit slowly. Due to ongoing challenges in the community regarding the pandemic, we have decided to take things slowly, beginning with our Parent Information Night. This is an opportunity for parents and caregivers to visit their child's classroom, meet their teacher and learn about the daily routine and curriculum. Last year, we this was a virtual event, so this is a very exciting opportunity to make the connection between school and home even stronger.

We also continue an even greater focus on the mission of Saint Pius Tenth School. One of the most important tenets of our mission statement reads, "Saint Pius Tenth School establishes an environment that enables understanding and acceptance of the values of cooperation, honesty, self-discipline, service, and respect for others."



One of the ways that we will continue to focus on this piece, and in carrying out the message of Jesus, is through a new Social Emotional Learning program called *Caring School Community*. This program is a comprehensive, research-based social and emotional learning (SEL) program that builds school-wide community, develops students' social skills and SEL competencies, and enables a transformative stance on discipline.

This CASEL SElect program promotes positive behavior through direct teaching of responsibility, empathy, and cooperation, creating settings where students feel heard, known, and cared for. Students become intrinsically motivated to contribute productively to a community they feel invested in, and where they know they matter.

The leadership team of our Diocese of Rochester schools began to look at this program last spring, and all of our schools participated in training over the summer. We began on our first days of school with an even greater sense of growing our community where it is known that all are valued and respected.

As a reflection on the last school year, and the end of the prior school year, we asked what we might have done differently. Moving forward, research and practical experience have determined that when being strategic and intentional in priority setting, the two most important components of any program of learning are building community and foundational skills instruction. These focus areas are key to accelerating the incredibly rich and measured learning that we have continued to foster, even throughout the challenges over the last months. *Caring School Community* is a positive addition in making this even more evident in our building.

Welcome Back!!

The weather is getting cooler, the sun hangs a little lower in the sky, and graduation parties, days spent on the boat, barbecues, weddings and the like no longer dominate our calendars. Before we jump into the "busy-ness" that autumn brings (schoolwork, Faith Formation, fall sports, planning for the upcoming holidays, etc.), we can pause for a moment to reflect on who God is to us. Maybe the Holy Spirit will encourage us to share that with someone else, who will then share their vision with us. And our image of God will grow just a tiny bit more.

The little ones are those who may have left their former views behind, perhaps even their former lives to follow Jesus and believe in the Beatitudes as God's world vision. They are the poor, the marginalized, the women and men at the well, the Zacchaeus' looking for Jesus from a tree, the blind who want to see, and the lame who want to walk. They are the lepers who have been told that they are unclean, and the ones who have learned that suffering and death are nothing to fear. These are all of the little ones. Jesus gathers and protects them as a shepherd guards his sheep. Whoever causes one of these little ones to sin deserves the greatest wrath. A MOMENT WITH TODAY'S SCRIPTURES

What are the little ones? They are the poor, the marginalized, the women and men at the well, the Zacchaeus' looking for Jesus from a tree, those mired in sin, the blind who want to see, and the lame who want to walk. They are the lepers and the different ones who have been told that they are unclean, and the ones who suffer from abuse and grave injustices and oppression. They are children who want nothing more than to be loved and enjoy celebrating their innocence. These are all the little ones and they are all vulnerable. Life already brings them burdens, we don't need to add to them.

St. Oscar Romero said, "When the church hears the cry of the oppressed it cannot but denounce the social structures that give rise to and perpetuate the misery from which the cry arises." Why are so many people still so gravely hurting? We have the resources and the means to make things better. We choose not to. There are still those things called greed, pride, lust, apathy, jealousy, gluttony, and anger that prevent us from seeing each other and people to be loved and not objects to be used. Is this how God intended things to be?

God loves what is good and upright. It doesn't matter who did it or where it came from. In God's eyes, the end result is always faith, hope, and love. Those will always unite a person with God. We fill our lives with many things that are not good either for ourselves or for others. All of us have to work to discover what it is, exactly, that leads to the world's brokenness. There are people, systems, and ideologies in place that foster oppression and injustice rather than equity and fairness. Sadly, our complacency can be the greatest evil. Turning a blind eye, ignoring the truth, and believing that we are helpless to fix so great a problem, does little to move us closer to the kingdom of God. As members of the Body of Christ, we cannot condone anything that keeps people in misery.

As it is said, charity begins at home. Perhaps a good place to start is with our own households and making sure their foundations are properly laid. ©LPi

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP Breaking the Stewardship Mold

Have you noticed how we always tend to pigeonhole one another — and ourselves? “I could never serve on the Parish Council. That’s for Rick and Ellen and that whole group of people who have done it for years.” “Greg takes care of faith formation in the parish — he always has. He doesn’t need my help.” “I can’t afford to give the big bucks like those families who sit up front can. My offering wouldn’t matter even if I did increase it.”

Thinking like this is a good indication that we aren’t in conversation with God about what His will is for our lives. If we have already decided what we are and are not meant to do, we aren’t likely to pray over it, to discern it.

We have to be open to the spirit of the Lord wherever it leads us, regardless of what we or others have come to expect from us. We human beings come to believe that we are such good judges of what others can offer — or what we ourselves can offer. But God has plans for us to which we aren’t privy. God calls everyone to serve Him in the way that pleases Him best, and only He can decide what that is. Everyday Stewardship demands a continual accounting of who we can be, what we can offer — even if it’s outside our comfort zone, even if it’s something that never occurred to us before.

There’s only one Person who can tell us what God wants from us. Do we even think to ask Him?


