



# ADVENT



HOPE. LOVE. JOY. PEACE.

### **What is Advent?** Sunday, November 28, 2021 - Friday, December 24, 2021

Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36). Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.

Advent devotions including the Advent wreath, remind us of the meaning of the season. An Advent calendar can help you fully enter into the season with daily activity and prayer suggestions to prepare you spiritually for the birth of Jesus Christ. ([uscgb.org](http://uscgb.org))

As a little kid, Advent, for me, was about getting ready to celebrate Christmas. Advent Calendars, Advent Wreath, being allowed to listen to Christmas music (which meant putting a 33 1/3 LP on a record player), bits of decorations starting to go up, hearing the readings at Church, singing "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" at mass - it all said, "Get ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus!"

Then a priest spoiled it for me.

It was somewhere around 7th or 8th grade that the priest, at a First Friday school mass, talked about not only preparing to celebrate that Christ had come almost 2000 years ago, but that He was going to come again.

So now Advent had a different perspective. Instead of preparing to celebrate the coming of Jesus a long time ago, it was also to prepare for Him to come again. So it was a looking ahead as well as a looking back.

It gets more complicated.

In high school, the parish started its first youth group. And it was during a youth group meeting just before Advent started that we were told about a new focus for Advent.

Advent was looking back and looking ahead. And now we were told that Advent was looking around at the present moment.

Jesus came. Jesus is going to come again. But Jesus is called Emmanuel, a name which means God-with-us. So now we were being told to use the season of Advent to see where Jesus is in our daily lives.

The priest called it "Closest Moments." Where did we "see" Jesus in our day? Where did we feel His presence? When and how did we feel closest to Jesus?

And then it got even more complicated.

My first year in the college seminary, during an Advent Day of Reflection, the presenter used Matthew 25 as the scripture for a reflection on Advent.

We have Advent looking back, looking ahead, looking around in the present moment. And now, as a lens for looking around in the present moment, we were to look for Jesus in the hungry and thirsty, naked and homeless, sick and imprisoned.

Advent had become a time of compassion and charity.

My new understanding of Advent was a long way from my understanding as a child - preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus.

But it really wasn't that far away at all.

For the birth of Jesus a long time ago in Bethlehem brought to the world a Savior who was Emmanuel, God with us, who was with us in the poor and suffering, and would never abandon us even to the end of time when He would come again in glory.

It was all there, World. It just took me a lifetime of a faith journey to come to see it and to understand it and to continue to try to live it.

It has been a great year thus far in Physical Education at St. Pius X elementary school. We have been working on several different skills in the gym with a wide range of activities from PK3 all the way to fifth grade.

PK3-Kindergarten students have already come a long way thus far, and it is only November. Our young friends have all been participating and following directions in the gymnasium. PK4 and Kindergarten have shown great improvement with learning the structure of the class, respecting their peers and teachers, sitting still and listening when others are talking along with following directions. We have made good use of the soccer field for some kickball and soccer, as well as Capture the Ball. Sportsmanship has been important as well, as we have several team and individual competitions in class. With the weather turning, we will be utilizing the gym more and more. We are doing cooperative games currently and it's nice to see the students work together as a team to complete tasks. They make adjustments nicely and talk about things if they go wrong and how to make them right.

Our Kids Heart Challenge will be taking place in February this year and will be here before you know it. Last year, an enthusiastic fifth grader earned a higher prize which was a pair of awesome socks and has worn them every dress down day. I hope to see a lot of them this upcoming spring!

### **INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK**

Sometimes, especially when life gets overwhelming and difficult, we can find ourselves feeling a bit downhearted and miserable. Wallowing in this uncomfortable darkness seems to be our norm and it's difficult to see a way out of, or through, this experience. If we listen carefully enough, we will hear God's voice calling out deep within, beckoning us to seek out its source and discover the inner calm and peace that can prevail over the darkness of despair. Faith tells us that God has already begun the creation of a good work in us and is with us, bringing it to completion, until Christ Jesus comes again. It is this light of God's glory for which we are asked to pave the way and straighten the paths of our lives so that it can shine. With all that life can ask of us and bring to us, it is our task to constantly discern what is of value. So that we do not get so weighed down by things that we no longer see, or feel, God's salvation. ©LPi

### **A MOMENT WITH TODAY'S SCRIPTURES**

St. Ambrose shares some wisdom on our need to prepare the way and open the door for Christ. "You see that when the Word of God knocks hardest on your door, it is when his hair is wet with the dew of the night. In fact, he chooses to visit those who are in tribulation and trial, lest one of them be overwhelmed by distress. So, his head is covered with dew, with drops, when his body is laboring hard. It is important to keep watch so that when the Bridegroom comes, he is not shut out. If you are asleep and your heart is not keeping watch, he will go away without knocking; but if your heart is alert for his coming, he knocks and asks for the door to be opened to him." When life gets overwhelming and difficult and we find ourselves feeling a bit downhearted and miserable, these words can bring great comfort.

We sometimes choose to remain stuck in our uncomfortable darkness and being stuck becomes our norm. In this time of self-focus our hearts are closed to the graces and life God desires to give us. Wrapped in the robe of mourning and misery, we fail to see the mercy, justice, and love the Bridegroom wants to bring. If we take seriously the need to prepare the way for Christ and open our hearts in preparation for his visit, we can hear God's gentle voice calling us deep within. It beckons us to seek out its source and discover the inner calm and peace that can prevail over the darkness of despair. Sometimes our darkness is so dark that it may seem unsurmountable. Trusting in the spiritual friends who journey with us, and God's promise may bring a glimmer of light even when it is most difficult to keep our hearts' doors open. Sometimes, the only light in the darkness is found in trusting the faith of others both past and present.

We have to trust that God has already begun the accomplishment of good work in us and that humanity is on an incredible journey to something wonderful and awesome. God is not done. When we open the doors of our hearts, straighten the paths of our lives, and prepare the way, Jesus can come with God's simple gifts of peace, grace, and joy. Life throws a great deal at us. It is easy to get tired and confused. We have to train our hearts to keep watch, discern what is of value, and forge ahead. Not allowing ourselves to become so weighed down by things and brought out of focus is a tremendous goal to achieve this Advent season. God is knocking. Answer the door. You will see and understand life in ways you never thought possible before. ©LPi

## EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

### God's Personal Assistants

If you have ever planned a large-scale event, whether it's a musical performance or a religious conference, you may have dealt with someone's personal assistant. Possibly this person would be a representative of the keynote speaker or the master of ceremonies for the local bishop; perhaps it's even the staffer of a local politician or the lackey of a well-known musical act.

Personal assistants are masters of stewardship — overseeing things in their boss' absence. They prepare the way. This person's job is to get everything ready for the person in charge, so that when he or she shows up — whoever he or she is — it's smooth sailing for them to do whatever it is they need to do: sing, speak, pray, mingle, what-have-you. It's usually a big job full of little things, a gig where attention to detail is key.

God is the guest of honor in our life, the keynote speaker, the main event. And what He wants — what He needs — to do is to change our hearts. Constantly, over, and over, and over again.

We are all His personal assistants in this endeavor. We need to prepare the way of the Lord, to make straight His paths. We need to make everything ready so that when He shows up — however He shows up, whether it's in the form of a neighbor in need or a burning bush right in front of us — everything is ready for Him to do His job.




