Good Morning World. It is December 5th, the Second Sunday of Advent. The readings for today's mass (including an audio version) may be found at uscgb.org.



The gospel is from Luke 3:1-6

A point of reference is an indicator that orients you generally. For example, a surveyor will start with a point of reference in marking out the path of a future road.

Which, by the way, is a good example, considering the gospel today talks about roads.

Imagine, if you would, having to build a road through a place of mountains and hills and valleys. There is a road there already, but it winds its way around and needs to be made straight and smooth.

What would be a point of reference for building this road?

The first point of reference would be the starting point. From where will this road begin? What city or village or town is the origination of this road?

The next point of reference is the ending point. What city, town or village will be the destination point of this road?

Then, as the road is built through all these mountains and hills and valleys, the surveyors and engineers keep looking back to where they're coming from and keep looking ahead to where they're going. And they build the smoothest, straightest road they can between these two points.

This season of Advent reminds us of our point of reference.

God.

What is our origination point?

God.

God made us. God formed us and fashioned us. God knew us and knitted us in our mother's womb. God even made us in God's own image.

What is our destination point?

God.

Jesus said that there are many rooms in His Father's house. Jesus said He is going to prepare a place for us and then come back to take us to Himself so that where He is, we may also be.

As we navigate the winding roads of life, we can keep looking back to where we came from and keep looking ahead to where we are going to keep us on track.

And if we need the assistance of an on-site surveyor and engineer, we turn to Jesus for His direction and guidance, since He also is the starting point and destination point.

It can be as simple (and please note that I said simple, not easy) as asking, "Does this seem to come from God?" Or, "Does this lead me to God?" Or the classic, "What do I think Jesus would do?"

World, there are definitely a lot of mountains and valleys on this journey of life. There are certainly many twists and turns to our journey of life and faith.

But if we keep looking to our points of reference, as well as to our on-site Person, Jesus, our journey will definitely be made straighter and smoother.




A MOMENT WITH TODAY'S SCRIPTURES

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

The Well That Never Dries Up

Depending on how your mood is today, the words of Paul will hit you differently. “Rejoice always,” he tells us. Well, if your football team is poised to win this weekend or next, maybe you’re really feeling this vibe. But if you’ve got a long slog at work ahead of you this week and a to-do list that only seems to grow and never shrink, it may make you grumble. “Rejoice always? Always? When I’m tired? Cranky? When I’m sick of doing and giving? Thanks, Paul. I’ll be sure to scribble that phrase on a Post-It and stick it to my dashboard for when some entitled punk inevitably cuts me off on tomorrow’s morning commute.”

When we feel this way, we know it’s time to head back to the well. Think of all the places in Scripture where God compares His love, His mercy, His salvation to water. And not just any water — living water, water that moves. God’s strength is not a stagnant puddle sure to evaporate and disappear. It’s water you can keep coming back to. It’s water that never dries up.

Which is good news for us, because we never stop failing to do what we should, never stop failing to feel the joy and the compassion and the selflessness we are called to. We need a source of living water if we are going to ‘rejoice always.’ To be everyday stewards, we need a well that never empties.

The fountain of salvation never dries up. There is always more there for us to draw from. It’s a sign of His commitment — so let us, in turn, be committed to Him.




