On Monday, June 6, the Church celebrates the Mother of the church Blessed Virgin Mary as the Mother of the Church.

In 2018 Pope Francis declared that, henceforward, the Monday after Pentecost Sunday will be celebrated as the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. The Memorial will be observed annually and has been added to the General Roman Calendar, the Roman Missal, and the Liturgy of the Hours. The Holy Father's wishes for this new feast day is that it will foster Marian piety and the maternal sense of the Church

The official decree was published in a letter from Cardinal Robert Sarah, head of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments.

In his letter of decree, Cardinal Sarah wrote, "... Mary is the mother of the members of Christ, because with charity she cooperated in the rebirth of the faithful into the Church, while the latter says that the birth of the Head is also the birth of the body, thus indicating that Mary is at once Mother of Christ, the Son of God, and mother of the members of his Mystical Body, which is the Church."

Cardinal Sarah also pointed out that Mary's mission began in the Upper Room as she prayed with the Apostles in anticipation of the coming of the Holy Spirit, as her Son had promised. Pentecost was the birth of the Church – the Mystical Body of Christ. As mother of Christ, the Head of the Church, she also is the Mother of the Church.

"...repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations..."

God wants to include everyone. Even though God's covenant began with Abraham and his descendants.

Jesus' new covenant was to expand to all the nations.

God is sending assistance for this mission to all the nations. God is sending power in the person of the Holy Spirit. If someone is feeling unworthy, ability lacking in giftedness, the Holy Spirit will be with them (in them) providing what is needed to fulfill the Father's will.

"He...was taken heaven."

Even though Jesus was leaving them, Jesus is not abandoning them. He promised to be with them until the end of time.

World, these messages and gifts are with us to this day. And Jesus has not abandoned you. Jesus is with you - and in you - all your days.

What's going on in PE?

Yes, it is that time of year again, time to give the people what they want......time for a Physical Education update! I do have friends and family that will ask "what we even do" in Physical Education class. The answer I give is usually sarcastic, but, in reality, I have high expectations of the students in class and there are several rules in the gymnasium. It has honestly been a fantastic year so far and it only gets better during spring time when we get to enjoy the weather.

After working at Hillside for many years before joining St. Pius, I learned that all kids love to play games and be kept moving. Also, any down time between activities may lead to getting off task. We try to go from phase to phase of class pretty quickly, and when the students do well we can usually get to a fun game that they like playing at the end of class.

Our Pre-K and Kindergarten students have been busy lately with several goals. We have been trying to sit still and listen quietly when the teacher is talking, which can be a tall task at times! They have been getting much better as the year progresses. We have been also playing musical hoops, which is like musical chairs with hula hoops and working on coordination and moving around the gym in our own space. In a few of their classes, students have been given big and small bouncy balls and trying to move around the gym bouncing the ball to themselves and catching it while moving through space.

First and Second graders have been recently playing some fun games outside. We have gotten into some Capture the Ball with second grade, and we also played a ball relay game which involves throwing and catching with teammates down a line. If the ball is dropped, then the group

needs to start over. First graders are improving with their hand-eye coordination and are also trying their best to follow the rules to each game that we play. If we aren't paying attention during games then it may upset the process.

Third grade continues to progress towards higher level activities. They have been working on a lot of kicking lately and we will hopefully move towards kickball by the end of the year once we learn to kick properly and get the rules of the game down. They have also actively participated in throwing and catching games as well as working on locomotor skills.

Fourth grade is a competitive bunch and have played several sports lately. These include team handball and ultimate football for throwing and catching as well as soccer and kickball for kicking lessons. Fourth grade continues to work on being good sports and have improved as the year goes on.

Fifth grade has been doing fine as they prepare to move on to the next chapter of their schooling. They have come a long way in maturing this year and continue to improve their motor skills and development.

INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

The Holy Spirit is the very breath of God and the true source of our power and strength. When we accept that God is the beginning and the end of all things, we open ourselves to receiving this powerful presence. The Holy Spirit alone is the one who teaches us how to pray, who stirs us to lift our eyes to heaven in search of our Creator and opens them to recognize the wonderful gifts of faith, hope, and love God gives us. The Holy Spirit is the one who teaches us how to understand ourselves, God, others, and the world. When we allow God's Own breath to truly take possession of us, we realize that we are meant to become like God and know Him as He really is. This ultimate helper lifts our eyes from what is below to what is above and empowers us to live life with joy and keener vision!

A MOMENT WITH TODAY'S SCRIPTURES

Even though Pentecost is rightly celebrated in late spring, the robust experience of a New England fall can provide a profound metaphor for reflection. A full expression of fall colors is beautiful to behold. But, with all of its majesty and beauty, the observer knows the experience of death is soon to come. Creation will be dark and barren for a while. Pentecost cannot be separated the Before from cross. transformative, life-giving power can bear fruit, we must first die.

Pentecost is all about leaving the lifeless dead wood behind and allowing God, through the power of the Holy Spirit, to create something new. These Pentecost creations happen repeatedly over and over again. The birthing process of the Church is ongoing. God is always bringing life out of death and creating something where there was once nothing. That is why the fall is such an apropos metaphorical season for Pentecost. In order to really receive the gift of the Holy Spirit we have to die to what we once knew and what no longer works.

When fire and wind find their fullest expression, they are in no way gentle nor kind. They have the potential to level anything in their paths. We are experiencing great turmoil in our world, nation, and our Church. Whether the result of circumstance or the work of the Holy Spirit, much of what we knew to be normal and constant is changing. Common systems institutional structures that may have worked for a time no longer do. When the old and familiar need to be left behind, God creates something new. Change and disorder do not need to be our enemies. They always bring opportunities for something exciting and new. What we need is untiring faith, firm hope, and perfect love.

What we need is for the Holy Spirit to enlighten us to see what is important and what we must do. "O Holy Spirit, descend plentifully into my heart. Enlighten the dark corners of this neglected dwelling and scatter there Thy cheerful beams." (St. Augustine) If we experience joy, even in the midst of turbulence, then we will know we are exactly where God needs us to be. If not, then perhaps there is a lesson in the decaying leaves that graciously descend to the ground on a crisp fall day.





A Stewardship Reflection

My church is composed of people like me. I help make it what it is.

It will be friendly, if I am.

Its pews will be filled, if I help fill them.

It will do great work, if I work.

It will make generous gifts to many causes, if I am a generous giver.

It will bring other people into its worship and fellowship, if I invite and bring them.

It will be a church of loyalty and love, of fearlessness and faith, a church with a noble spirit, if I, who make it what it is, am filled with these same things.

Therefore, with the help of God, I will dedicate myself to the task of being all the things that I want my church to be.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

Do You Speak Stewardship?

If you are married, I'm guessing that you know the best way to break bad news to your spouse, whether you realize it or not. Maybe it's simply that you know not to talk about the budget after your wife's football team has lost. Maybe you know your husband will take the news that your sister is coming to stay a little easier if you tell him over his favorite dinner. We do the same thing with our children, our friends, our coworkers — we have all learned the language of the people we love.

The truth is the same in every language, but it's important for us to convey that truth graciously. That's what Pentecost teaches us. The gift of being able to speak in tongues afforded the Apostles a practical skill to spread the Gospel message, but it also served as a powerful symbol of the importance of effective communication. Evangelization can only happen when you're speaking in words a person is able, ready, and willing to hear.

Let's ask ourselves: what is the language we need to speak to share the truth with the person who is standing in front of us? Is it the language of quality time? The language of concern? The language of laughter and friendship? The language of authenticity, of plain talk and frankness?

The Holy Spirit gave the Apostles the ability to speak in tongues, and it seems miraculous when we read about it in the Gospels — but only consider that we all have this same ability, in a certain way. The Holy Spirit can and will show us how to speak the truth, if we only ask.
