

Good Morning World. It is June 19th. Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi. The readings for today's mass (including an audio version) may be found at usccb.org.

The second reading is from 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

There is an old saying, "Seeing is believing."

Well, I know what the intent of the saying is - I won't believe until I see.

But, at the point of seeing, it is not believing. It has become knowledge.

"Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1)

At His last supper with His apostles, Jesus took bread and said, "This is my body..."

It still looked like bread, smelled like bread, felt like bread and tasted like bread. But He said it was now His body.

Not seeing was requiring believing.

It was, on a smaller scale, the same thing that was going on with Jesus and His physical body.

"They said, 'If you are the Messiah, tell us,' but he replied to them, 'If I tell you, you will not believe, and if I question, you will not respond." (Luke 22:67-68)

The people could see that Jesus was a human being, just like themselves. Head, arms, legs, feet, hands, hair, eyes, ears, nose and mouth. They could not "see" that He was God. What they could not see with their eyes is what required their faith.

It requires faith to believe that the bread and wine have become the Body and Blood of Jesus.

If you struggle to believe that the bread and wine are truly become His Body and Blood, spend time in prayer talking with Jesus about it. He's the one who said it.

If you do believe that the bread and wine are truly become His Body and Blood, spend some time in prayer talking with Jesus about what that should mean in your life.

Either way, World, spend some time in prayer talking with Jesus about what you see, what you believe, and what that should mean for you in the way you live your life.

INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

God calls us in the midst of ordinary things. Often only looking for God in the dramatic, spectacular, the ritual or the sacred places, we miss that He is walking beside us. Every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling to us, "Follow me." Sometimes, we are too distracted to hear this call. Other times, we would rather ignore it or pretend it wasn't heard. God, however, is very persistent. Whether we fine tune our hearing to receive this invitation now or when we close our eyes in death, we need to make a choice. The choice involves leaving some things behind and moving forward, taking risks. Choosing to keep focused and single-minded, the lens we then use to see our world and one another is God's, not our own. Life is no longer about what is important or matters to me but what matters to God. We acquire a new filter and are asked to use that filter to make choices, establish priorities, and determine what direction we will take, and how to love. Once we accept God's invitation, we cannot keep looking back to what was left behind, only forward to the surprises yet to come. ©LPi

A MOMENT WITH TODAY'S SCRIPTURES

And to another he said, "Follow me." In every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling us. We can easily get distracted and not hear it or simply ignore it, pretending it wasn't even heard. When we do hear it and favorably respond, there are some conditions that must be met. Jesus makes it clear that once we say yes to his invitation, we must stay focused and forge ahead. We cannot keep looking behind or worry about unfinished business. There are some tasks, and discipleship is one, that require our full devotion.

There are many "masters" vying for our attention. We need something or someone to give us direction. Human nature requires it. Our motives and actions reveal what has our allegiance. It is tempting to give ourselves to masters that lure us with intriguing promises. When given the choice between a "master" that promises worldly success, abundant wealth, status, privilege, and security versus a "master" that asks for self-sacrifice, hardship, suffering, ridicule, and death, to whom do we go? While the promise of immediate pleasure is enticing, there is always a catch. For all that secular masters can promise, they always keep us looking behind, checking on ourselves, second guessing choices, calculating options, and being slaves to excessive worry. Our guard can never come down. Only one master really promises life: Jesus Christ. Hearing his call, we either trust him or we don't.

Saying yes to following Christ does come with a risk. But it also comes with the brightness of future hopes and dreams. There is no need to keep looking behind. Sins are forgiven and regrets serve no effective purpose. God is not there. He's moved beyond all that stuff. God is in the today and the tomorrow and what he can continually do with our daily affirmation to follow Him. All we need to do is be obedient. St. Gianna Molla is credited with saying, "The stillness of prayer is the most essential condition for fruitful action. Before all else, the disciple kneels down." Begin with prayer. We will not only hear God's call but find the courage to trust that He will guide us where we need to be. God uses us in the most ordinary of ways through the simple daily expression of our lives.



ST. IRENAEUS

Can you imagine sitting at the feast of the Apostles? St. Irenaeus was born in Asia Minor - now Turkey -- and was tutored in Christianity by St. Polycarp, himself a disciple of St. John the Evangelist. Irenaeus caught the missionary zeal and became a priest sent to Gaul (modern day France). Following a persecution by the pagan Roman emperor Marcus Aurelius, Irenaeus replaced the martyred bishop in the region. His trials were not over, however. The heretical sect of Gnosticism spread to Gaul. Gnostics proclaimed a secret, spiritual knowledge available only to a few. Irenaeus researched the Gnostic texts and exposed the falsehoods they taught, such as denying the divinity of Christ. His book Against Heresies is still being published today, over 1800 years after his death. May St. Irenaeus intercede for our own quests for greater understanding!

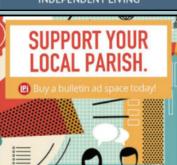
