STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE

In today’s Gospel: “As he passed by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen. Jesus said to them: Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men. They abandoned their nets and followed Him.”



For the first disciples, their commitment to discipleship of Jesus was complete and unconditional. They placed God first in their lives. The commitment of the first disciples us leaves us with the question: What will it take for us to place God first in our lives?

As we reflect on our spirituality of stewardship, we ask ourselves how much of our time, talent, and treasure is given to making this world a bit better, making a difference in people’s lives? Our stewardship story revolves around gratefulness, and our desire to give back to God in our service of one another.

As we prayerfully reflect on our stewardship of treasure, what kind of pledge can we make to the Church that reflects our desire to place God first in our lives? What percentage of our income are we willing to share in support of the ministries of our parish?

In praying over the radical response of the first disciples who left everything to follow the Lord, does my stewardship of treasure reflect a desire to place God first in my life? Yes, many of us are like Jonah in the first Scripture reading in that we are reluctant disciples of the Lord. In many ways, we are reluctant to think in terms of budgeting a percentage of our income as a tithe to the Church. So, today as we identify with the reluctant Jonah and are challenged to the radical response of the first disciples, may we prayerfully consider what portion of our treasure we are called to give back to God, back to the God who has blessed us in so many ways.

As your pastor, you have my assurance that I will increase my stewardship of treasure in support of our parish life. The way I tithe is through automatic recurring monthly donations – ACH or electronic funds transfer. If this works for you, online recurring giving, especially during these Covid days, is so valuable in our parish budgeting. See our mailing this week for more information on this way of giving.

One of the mantras of my life is that we will never regret the generosity we witness to in the building of our faith community. I ask only that you give as you are able. But for those of us who are capable of increasing our giving a bit, you will be blessed by our loving God, and you will never regret your generosity. Both the Church of the Holy Spirit and St. Joseph’s are blessed communities. We have been given much, and, as we all know, to whom much is given, much will be required.

Brothers and sisters:

I should like you to be free of anxieties.

An unmarried man is anxious about the things of the Lord, how he may please the Lord.

But a married man is anxious about the things of the world, how he may please his wife, and he is divided.

An unmarried woman or a virgin is anxious about the things of the Lord, so that she may be holy in both body and spirit.

A married woman, on the other hand, is anxious about the things of the world, how she may please her husband.

I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction.

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught.

We'll examine his life, surroundings and shorter writings, including First Thessalonians, Galatians, Philemon and Philipians. Each Wednesday our gathering will



Pope Francis has decreed that 2021 is the Year of St. Joseph in his Apostolic Letter, *Patris Corde*. This is the year of St. Joseph for two reasons, according to Pope Francis: the first is that it is the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of St. Joseph as the patron saint of the universal Church; the second is that Pope Francis felt compelled to write about St. Joseph during the ongoing pandemic, a time when we recognize that our lives are woven together and sustained by ordinary people—people like Joseph. St. Joseph is often referred to as the “hidden presence” in the life of Jesus. This study will explore the heart of St. Joseph and its impact on Jesus and ourselves as Catholics.

In the United States, up to 40 percent of all food goes uneaten each year, at an annual cost of \$218 billion. It's a problem that costs the average family of four at least \$1,500 per year and results in massive amounts of wasted water, landfill use, climate pollution and other environmental damage. ELECTRONIC FUNDS TRANSFER: THE ENVELOPE ALTERNATIVE

What is Electronic Funds Transfer?

Electronic Funds is an arrangement you make to have funds moved electronically from your bank account to Holy Spirit Church or St. Joseph's Church. In other words, it's a non-cash, non-envelope way to make your Sunday contributions to the parish without any paper changing hands.

How does it work?

You fill out the form below to tell us how much you wish to contribute to the parish each month. If you wish, you can also specify an additional contribution to the Church Maintenance Fund and/or in the case of St. Joseph, the cemetery fund all on this same form. Then on the 2nd or 4th Friday of the month (depending on the date you choose) your bank will automatically transfer that amount from your bank account to the parish's bank account. You will see the transaction on your monthly bank statement.

Why should I consider this?

You benefit from the convenience of not having to write checks or trying to find envelopes at the last minute. Instead, you will have made a conscientious decision to plan your regular giving to support the parish. Also, you will help the parish save on the cost of mailing envelopes and bank charges for processing checks. Both you and the church also enjoy greater security, as fewer people are involved in handling cash or checks.

Do I have to change my bank?

No! The electronic funds transfer is done with whatever bank you presently use and our bank.

If I want to stop using this procedure, how do I do that?

This is as simple as a phone call to Patrick Vogt, our Accounting Manager. You can discontinue at any time with a week's notice. If you wish to suspend your payments, this can be done by a phone call as well, 585-586-8089.

How do I sign up?

Below is the form that we ask you to fill out and return to us. You will need to attach a **VOIDED CHECK** from your present Bank Account so we can process your contribution correctly. That is all! If you have further questions, please contact our Accounting Manager Patrick Vogt at 586-8089. We will treat all matters confidentially.

AUTHORIZATION FOR ELECTRONIC FUNDS TRANSFER

I AUTHORIZE the Church and the financial institution named below to initiate entries to my checking/savings account. This authority will remain in effect until I notify the Church in writing at least 10 days before the regularly scheduled payment date to change or cancel it.
