### RE-CREATING!



It is my prayer that you and your family have a great time now that July is here. July is a good time to take a few days here and there to get some rest and relaxation. In fact, beginning this Sunday, I'll be off to a retreat and then officially on vacation afterwards for a few weeks. Like in our Gospel reading, we all need to find time each year for a little recreation. Who is better at re-creating us than our Creator? The word recreation implies the time we need to allow God to re-create within us enthusiasm, optimism, and new life in our vocational journeys.

For us to function as human beings, we need time away to “re-create”. If not, we can find ourselves in burnout mode and self-medicate ourselves in unhealthy ways. I think this is why, after a lot of hard work, Jesus tells his disciples in our Gospel reading this weekend that it is time to go off to a deserted place and rest.

After a lot of fruitful and tiring ministry, Jesus says in the Gospel reading that it was time to go off to a deserted place to rest awhile and rejuvenate. Jesus is saying that it is time to renew ourselves in prayer after all the hard work we have been doing. We learn that getting away wasn't that easy for the Lord and his disciples. I find it inspiring that, when the Lord got off the boat and discovered that his time off was canceled, he was able to respond with tenderness and compassion to the crowd that followed him rather than turn away. Jesus knew how to take care of himself by taking retreat time regularly so that missing this one wasn't the end of the world. Jesus took time alone every day to re-create in the presence of his heavenly Father. And he is giving us a good example to follow. A prayer life provides great benefits. This is why, when something unexpected happens and plans get changed, Jesus in his humanity doesn't burn out.

How much better would our lives be if we took time each day to re-create in the presence of God in prayer? How much better would our state of mind be? How much better would our relationships be if we took “time-outs” to pray?

Are we making sure that we get a little time every day to re-create in the presence of the Lord in prayer? I think this is important for married couples, religious, and single folk, young and old to balance our vocations, whatever walk of life we find ourselves in. We are also invited to call to mind the times when our plans for recreation, or life plans in general, have gotten thwarted for some reason like we see in our Gospel reading this weekend. With Jesus, can we respond to these moments in life with compassion? Even the frustrations in life are an opportunity for prayer and to grow closer to the Lord who understands us better than we think.

I am very excited about my trip home to India and seeing my family. Please pray that I have a safe trip and please also pray for the people of India. They are suffering so much right now with COVID and the monsoon flooding. Know that I will pray for you each day while I am away.

### COMING HOME TO MASS IN-PERSON!

The Roman Catholic Bishops of the Upstate New York Dioceses, including our Most Rev. Salvatore Matano, have resumed the obligation to attend Sunday Eucharist:

*“For those who are healthy and not at great risk, the presumption of the faithful should be that, unless they are at an enhanced risk, sick, or caring for others who are at risk or sick, the obligation to attend Mass now resumes.”* They add: *“Anyone who is frail or at risk due to advanced age or medical conditions is always excused from the obligation.”*

On June 15, following NYS reaching the benchmark of a 70% vaccination rate, Bishop Matano rescinded -- with some exceptions -- policies, guidelines and permissions related to the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the administration of the Sacraments during the pandemic.

In the coming weeks, with all appropriate preparations, changes will be implemented gradually to return to as much normalcy as possible at Mass and in our worship spaces.

The announcement from NYS stated: “Unvaccinated individuals continue to be responsible for wearing masks, in accordance with federal CDC guidance.” Therefore, masks and six feet distance are still required for unvaccinated individuals at Mass.

Mass registration is no longer required.

In all matters related to Covid-19 and the Mass, we are encouraged to use prudential judgement.



## Readings for The Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time -- July 25

### **2 Kings 4:42-44**

A man came from Baal-shalishah bringing to Elisha, the man of God, twenty barley loaves made from the firstfruits, and fresh grain in the ear. Elisha said, "Give it to the people to eat." But his servant objected, "How can I set this before a hundred people?" Elisha insisted, "Give it to the people to eat. For thus says the LORD, 'They shall eat and there shall be some left over.'" And when they had eaten, there was some left over, as the LORD had said.

### **Ephesians 4:1-6**

Brothers and sisters: I, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace: one body and one Spirit, as you were also called to the one hope of your call; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

### **John 6:1-15**

Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee. A large crowd followed him, because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick. Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. The Jewish feast of Passover was near. When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little." One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined,

about five thousand in number. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat. When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone.

### **Nicene Creed**

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.




