

## September 26, 2021 - Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### GOD'S SPIRIT EXCEEDS OUR EXPECTATIONS

The scriptures are filled with paradoxes, reversals and surprises. Just when we think we understand God, something totally unexpected occurs and we are forced to recheck our understanding. We like things more predictable, but predictability can be another name for control. Simply stated, we don't like surprises if they interrupt our routines or challenge our expectations.

In today's Gospel, Jesus gets right to the point with his apostles. They don't want outsiders grabbing the glory that belongs to them as Jesus' hand-picked assistants. We can almost imagine them saying to Jesus: "Tell those outliers not to work miracles in your name-- they aren't part of the franchise!"

But Jesus chides them for their smallness with the reminder that the Spirit is always bigger than our group or our plans. God is free to pour out grace and power on anyone who will use it for the common good. Jesus' words echo in our openness or our resistance to ecumenical and interreligious dialogue. There simply are no insiders and outsiders for God because God is free to work through anyone, and often does.

Today's Gospel gathers together other equally radical teachings of Jesus about scandal. Woe to anyone who misleads a little one, whether a child or any innocent person. We can fill in the blanks of this warning with today's victims of seduction, abuse, trafficking, and exploitation. Seldom do we see such fierceness in Jesus as in his words to those whose sins do lasting harm to the most vulnerable. It would be better, Jesus says, to cut off your hand or foot or pluck out your eye than to use it to abuse another human being.

These metaphors are extreme, but they convey the terrible consequences of certain kinds of sin. Better to have a millstone hung around your neck and be cast into the sea than to hurt a child, a woman, a poor person. How explicit would Jesus make his condemnation of modern-day slavery in sweatshops or in the sexual abuse scandal of our clergy?

To turn away or close our eyes to these evils in our own towns and cities is to ignore Jesus' warning about what our hands and feet and eyes are really for. How can we stand by silently and passively when victims all around us cried out for our help?

It's true that the Gospel is for heroes, but it is even more for us when we perform ordinary acts of awareness and compassion. Someone who gives a glass of water to a thirsty brother or sister will not lose their reward, Jesus says. This is a good place to start, for if we can see someone's thirst, we will also see other needs as well. Small beginnings can be the feedstock that leads to transformation.

On judgment day we will learn what we already know, that every human being is part of one family. No one is more "in" than anyone else. Everyone belongs inside the circle and at the table. If each one of us brings just one other person to that table and to God, everyone will be there!

A small cost to pay for getting to heaven, don't you think? Thanks be to God!

The CDC has issued the following guidance: "To reduce their risk of becoming infected with the Delta variant and potentially spreading it to others, CDC recommends that fully vaccinated people wear a mask in **public indoor**

of substantial or high transmission." Due to the substantial Covid-19 infection rate in Monroe County:

- •All Ministers of Communion at Holy Spirit and St. Joseph's are required to wear a mask when serving;
- •Everyone is *encouraged* to wear a mask while indoors at Church, including the vaccinated;
- And per NYS, "Unvaccinated individuals continue to be responsible for wearing masks, in accordance with federal CDC guidance." Therefore, masks and six feet distance are still required for unvaccinated individuals at Mass.

## GOSPEL AND QUESTION OF THE WEEK FOR THE 27th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, October 3

HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK

Mark 10:2-16

The Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, "Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?" They were testing him. He said to them in reply, "What did Moses command you?" They replied, "Moses permitted a husband to write a bill of divorce and dismiss her."

But Jesus told them, "Because of the hardness of your hearts he wrote you this commandment. But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate."

In the house the disciples again questioned Jesus about this. He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery."

And people were bringing children to him that he might touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this he became indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." Then he embraced them and blessed them, placing his hands on them.

In these faces, I see hope for a bright future that would be unimaginable without a St. Mary's education. These girls were in Form 2 at the time the picture was taken. They are now in Form 5, with less than 2 years to go before graduation and application for university study. Their chances of going on to university to continue their study are high because, as Father Damian reported in his recent Mission Letter, St. Mary's ranks 29th among all 3956 Secondary Schools nationwide. So, these are the faces of future doctors, lawyers, engineers and teachers. And who knows, perhaps even a future President of Tanzania.

The role of a Stephen Minister is to provide emotional support, to pray with and for their care receiver, and to walk with the person for the duration of the crisis. Stephen Ministers are there to listen and care. A Stephen Minister typically meets with his or her care receiver on a predetermined schedule for about an hour. Stephen Ministers keep everything their care receivers say, even their identity, confidential.
