In the Gospel, Jesus demonstrates this overabundance of love in His first miracle of love. He changes water into the finest wine. He creates an abundance of wine so that the wedding feast at Canna can go on. Jesus is likewise working in our lives. He is pouring an abundance of love into our lives. Sometimes, this is hard to understand and feel because of the trials we are going through but we can be assured, in this day, we have God's abundant love being poured into us. Let us be strengthened and transformed by this abundant love.

### MASS & CONFESSION SCHEDULE NYS MASK REQUIREMENT

New York State has implemented a new mask mandate that applies to our parishes. We fall under the "Business/Venue Mask-Wearing Requirement" because we do not require proof of vaccination for entry. All people age two and over who are participating in Mass, or attending any other



indoor gatherings, meetings, athletic events, practices, or rehearsals are required to wear a mask; extra masks will be made available for those who do not bring their own. Since the NYS mask mandate is in effect until February 1, 2022, we will revisit these protocols again next month.

#### GOSPEL AND QUESTION OF THE WEEK Third Sunday in Ordinary Time January 23 Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received. Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.

Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them,

"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."


