DARKNESS TO LIGHT As the winter finally becomes spring, I think of the similarities to Holy Week into Easter and our daily lives. For myself, winter is difficult. It is dark and cold. Many animals slumber away, or only come out to find food. People seem to stay in more. I can't help but feel sad.

However, there is so much beauty in the winter, the fresh snow on the ground and on the trees, the beautiful silence of the season.

When spring arrives, everything begins to bloom. The birds are singing, the sun is shining more. Rain seems to wash away the darkness. My overall mood improves! It is like a fresh start for the world.

One of my favorite experiences of our Lenten journey is our Taizé Prayer at St. Joseph's. Join us as we gather once again this coming Monday, March 27 at 7pm at St. Joseph's. The Taizé Prayer is also posted on all our media platforms. Find a quiet place and create a place of prayer. Tell the kids to give you an hour. Close your eyes. Listen to the music and readings. Connect with God. All are welcome at our liturgies. Come & be in the presence of our God. May your Holy Week and Triduum be blessed.



As Jesus was willing to carry his cross, shameful and horrible and lethal as it was, he calls upon us to carry our own painful and difficult crosses. Remember, the cross he carried was not for himself. He carried his cross for everyone else—for Peter and Judas; for Lazarus, for the woman at the well and the man born blind; for Pilate, Barabbas, and the revolutionaries crucified with him; for you and for me.

In whom am I challenged to see Jesus? How can I help carry Christ's cross by carrying my neighbor's cross?





PASCHAL: associated with the Hebrew Passover; referring to Jesus as the Lamb of God TRIDUUM: derived from the Latin for three days

The Paschal mystery has two aspects: by his death, Christ liberates us from sin; by his **Resurrection**, he opens for us the way to a new life.

The Paschal Triduum bridges the seasons of Lent to Easter.

In the Sacred Triduum. the Church solemnly celebrates the greatest mysteries of our redemption, keeping by means of special celebrations the memorial of her Lord, crucified. buried, and risen. The Roman Missal

HOLY THURSDAY:

"Jesus gives himself to us as food and, in the washing of feet, teaches us the need to serve others."

GOOD FRIDAY:

"In the mystery of Christ's death on the cross, we contemplate that undying divine love which embraces all mankind and summons us in turn to love one another in the power of the Spirit."

HOLY SATURDAY:

"The day of God's silence - invites us not only to solidarity with all who are abandoned and alone, but also to trust in that faithful love which turns death into life."

Our sacrifices lead us to the Resurrection.

Lent can feel like a long time. Sometimes we'd like to skip right to Easter! But just like studying for a test, practicing a sport, or saving money, we often must do difficult tasks, make sacrifices, and overcome obstacles to reach a worthy goal.

The 40 days we spend praying and doing penance help us prepare to celebrate the Church's greatest feast day. Jesus had to go through his passion and death before he could rise. Our sacrifices enable us to experience—in a small way—Christ's suffering, and they lead us to the joy and wonder of his resurrection.

Over the last few weeks, we've learned how people in Honduras, the Philippines and Kenya made sacrifices so their families and communities can thrive. In Honduras, Rony fixed his reservoir and installed a low-cost system to water his fields. Although this work took time and effort, Rony's hard work allowed him to provide food for his family and is helping his son achieve his soccer dream!

In the Philippines, Raul and Rhodora changed their jobs to ensure their granddaughters can be healthy and finish school. It was challenging for them to learn a new and different type of work—raising fish—but it was worth it to help support their granddaughters.

In Kenya, Rebecca learned how to use a new water system and different ways to farm. She also taught others in her community to use these new techniques. Rebecca spent time learning and teaching, but her sacrifice is now benefiting her family and entire community.

How are you doing with your Lenten resolutions? How are your prayer, fasting and almsgiving going? Reflect on your Lenten journey and what you would like to accomplish or do differently during the final weeks of Lent to prepare for Easter.



Youth Ministry: there is still time for you to participate as a reader and/or singer. The commitment will require a few rehearsals before the Good Friday presenta-


