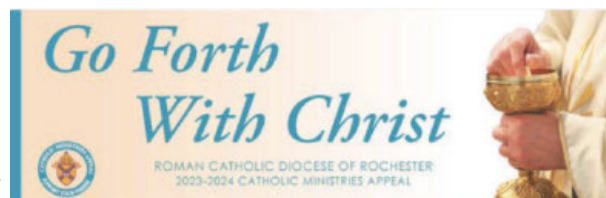


This is the time of the year when we pledge to the annual diocesan Catholic Ministries Appeal. The CMA reminds us that we are part of a bigger Church. We are citizens of the Kingdom of God. The faithful are in need of ministry and a vibrant parish life. Our youth and young adults are yearning to learn and grow in their relationship with Christ. Thanks be to God; we have parishioners from both parishes who have been blessed to one degree or another. May we all give with a generous spirit.

The theme of this year's annual appeal is **GO FORTH WITH CHRIST**, reminding us of Christ's eternal presence to us in the Eucharist, and that when we receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we are then able to carry Christ to others. Through His "Great Commission" to the disciples, and to us, He commands us to love, to help and serve our sisters and brothers in Christ, especially the most vulnerable.

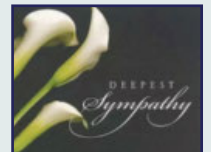

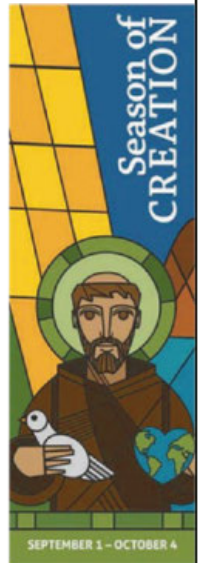

Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, October 4

From Pope Francis' encyclical, *Laudato Si'*: "I believe that Saint Francis is the example par excellence of care for the vulnerable and of an integral ecology lived out joyfully and authentically. He is the patron saint of all who study and work in ecology, and he is also much loved by non-Christians. He was particularly concerned for God's creation and for the poor and outcast. He loved, and was deeply loved, for his joy, his generous self-giving, his openheartedness. He was a mystic and a pilgrim who lived in simplicity and in wonderful harmony with God, with others, with nature and with himself. He shows us just how inseparable the bond is between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace."

INTEGRATING PARISH TITHING WITH VOLUNTEERISM AND OTHER INITIATIVES

At St. Joseph's there is a long history of tithing a portion of our offertory. Currently we tithe 5% to charitable organizations that provide for the basic needs of the poor. Most are local agencies; some are overseas (such as our support for the education of young women in Tanzania.). One criteria for tithing allocations is that the parish is engaged in volunteer work and other ways of supporting the charity.

A letter of thanks from Mary's Place demonstrates this: *"Thank you for your support of Mary's Place Refugee Outreach 2023 Back to School Distribution. Your generous gift of many backpacks [from the Penfield Hope collection] helped us provide a record 413 children with a new backpack and grade-appropriate school supplies for the 2023-24 school year. We also used your generous tithing donation to supplement bags and supplies donors provided. Thank for all of the volunteers you send our way for projects like these, and for our food delivery program. These volunteer opportunities are always available. Without the support of people like you, Mary's Place would be unable to continue serving refugees in Rochester. Thank you so much for allowing us to be a place where all refugees are welcomed with open arms."*

U.S. BISHOPS' PRO-LIFE CHAIRMAN ASKS FOR "RADICAL SOLIDARITY" WITH MOTHERS IN RESPECT LIFE MONTH STATEMENT

Since 1973, the Catholic Church in the US has observed October as "Respect Life Month." This year, Bishop Michael F. Burbidge of Arlington, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Pro-Life Activities invites Catholics to commemorate the 50th anniversary of Respect Life Month by embracing "radical solidarity" with women facing difficult or challenging pregnancies.

Bishop Burbidge echoes Saint John Paul II, who coined the term "radical solidarity" in reference to the care owed to vulnerable pregnant women: "In firmly rejecting 'pro-choice' it is necessary to become courageously 'pro-woman,' promoting a choice that is truly in favor of women.... The only honest stance is that of radical solidarity with the woman."

While our efforts must remain strong to end legalized abortion, Bishop Burbidge affirmed the personal responsibility of all Catholics to "thoroughly surround mothers in need with life-giving support and personal accompaniment."

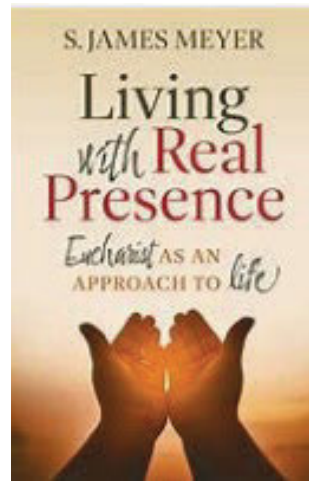

OCTOBER—FEATURED LITURGICAL MINISTRY: MUSIC MINISTRY

CHOIR: Pope Francis says, "Through musical compositions and songs, voice is also given to prayer 'forming a choir', where in unison the praise and glory rises to the Father of all from his people." God has bestowed upon his people the gift of song. Liturgical musicians should be "animators of the song of the whole assembly, not replace it." The assembly is the primary minister of music. Rather than simply listening, through the help of a well-formed choir ministry, the assembly sings the acclamations, psalms, responses, etc. as a united community.

We are blessed to have dedicated people who share their gifts with us. Not all choir members need to be trained musicians, able to read music or experienced in singing with a group. They attend rehearsals, practice their individual parts and then bring them together, each supporting the other. They are respectful of each other and see their music ministry as a blessing in their lives. The choir truly becomes a church family.

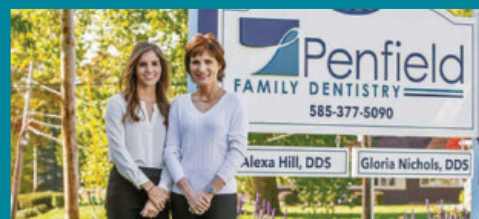

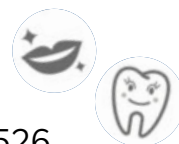

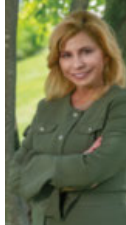
