

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those that are excused from fasting and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses, such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.

March 16-17, 2024 John 12:20-33

Some Greeks who had come to worship at the Passover Feast came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus.

Jesus answered them,

"The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me. "I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again."

The crowd there heard it and said it was thunder; but others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered and said, "This voice did not come for my sake but for yours. Now is the time of judgment on this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself." He said this indicating the kind of death he would die.



Paschal Triduum

The Easter Triduum or Holy Triduum is the three-day celebration of the Paschal Mystery: the Passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ

HAL: associated with the Hebrew Passover; referring to Jesus as the Lamb of God TRIDUUM: derived from the Latin for three days

The Paschal mystery has two aspects: by his death, Christ liberates us from sin; by his Resurrection, he opens for us the way to a new life.

The Paschal Triduum bridges the seasons of Lent to Easter.

In the Sacred Triduum. the Church solemnly celebrates the greatest mysteries of our redemption, keeping by means of special celebrations the memorial of her Lord, crucified, buried, and risen.







LAUDATE DEUM: CONVERSATIONS IN THE SPIRIT

Week Three

Parishioners have been gathering to enter into dialogue about Pope Francis' latest Apostolic Exhortation on the climate crisis, *Laudate Deum*. Monday is the final session though there is much to be done! If you would like to read the exhortation, it can be found on the Vatican website.

This week we continue to talk about and experience what it means to have "conversations in the Spirit," a new form of dialogue introduced at the Synod in Rome. Many have commented that while it is challenging, it is a great exercise in learning to listen better — to listen to understand rather than listening to reply.

In this third session on *Laudate Deum* we focus on the sixth chapter of *Laudate Deum* (paragraphs 61-73). Pope Francis writes: "I ask everyone to accompany this pilgrimage of reconciliation with the world that is our home and to help make it more beautiful, because that commitment has to do with our personal dignity and highest values. At the same time, I cannot deny that it is necessary to be honest and recognize that the most effective solutions will not come from individual efforts alone, but above all from major political decisions on the national and international level." (LD69)

For your reflection and prayer this Lent, the questions are posed:

After reading Pope Francis' paragraph 69, respond to the quote: "...the most effective solutions will not come from individual efforts alone, but above all from major political decisions on the national and international level." Has Laudate Deum inspired you to make changes in your own life? How so? Or why not?

NOTES FROM FEBRUARY 13, 2024 JOINT PARISH COUNCIL MEETING (Part 2) Synodal Church in Mission

This was a follow-up to the November meeting where Council members responded to: how can our parish and diocese be more synodal? Responses fell into a few categories: Listening/

Communication, Community-Building, and Engaging Families in Church.

As a follow-up to the passion and energy around engaging families all were asked: What calls/motivates you and your family to come to Mass? What is your experience of the Mass?

Reponses center around the power of the Eucharist and God's desire for us to be at Mass, community, belonging, involvement/participation:

- Families have to make Mass a priority but it isn't always easy.
- Participation, a sense of involvement, is very important, such as bringing up the gifts, singing, lectoring, etc.
- Mass is an anchor in our family's week.
- The love I feel from our parishes keeps me coming back even when I feel judged and hurt by the Vatican.
- Renewal and worshipping with people from all walks of life; energy comes from working with RCIA.
- For parish staff, Mass is where we can be with people, worshipping, listening to the Word, in community.
- My family is unmotivated but that doesn't stop me. I love the sense of family, renewal, peace, and belonging.
- This is where God wants me to be, it's where I can be myself.
- Music brought my family to Church when I was a child and has been a motivator for my family.
- It's not easy as a single divorced person to come to Mass but here I have found a place where I belong.
- Parishioners are family and friends, and our Worship team is trying to involve families every way we can.
- I love the Mass, I come for Jesus. I feel closer to Christ at Mass in the Eucharist, the Word, the People.
- God wants us at Mass so there must be a reason. The Eucharist connects us as a community.
- Eucharist is amazing. Reading the Bible brings more depth.
- I come wanting the Eucharist, to hear more, to learn more. There is a timelessness.
- Following the sudden death of a family member, I committed myself to going to Mass and being involved.
- Standing in for Christ in the Mass there are no words. Celebrating the Sacraments is the best part of being a priest, said Fr. Mike. I want to be there with Jesus, where he is calling us to be.
- Can't do anything without Him. Through Mass, I more feel the presence of Jesus in daily life.
- It's one of the Commandments. And the music is very moving.
- Obligation, duty, family, community, continuity.
- It's a highlight of the week. Involvement provides a sense of community.
- The pandemic taught me the power of the Body of Christ and that being in community is so essential.

Fr. Jim concluded: "Listening to others' faith stories is inspiring!...The highpoint of my prayer life as a priest is in the Sunday Eucharist. To know yourselves enlivens my prayer life. Our Church is a big tent. We are called to love our neighbors, no exceptions. Being pastor is a humbling privilege – thank you for being part of the story of our faith community."


