

October 13, 2024 - Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

PROPOSITION 1



Part of our duty as Catholics is to stand up against injustice when we are confronted with it. Sometimes that means making our voices heard in the democratic process. St. Paul talks about the need to be good citizens in whichever nation we live, and for us here in the United States, it means using our conscience to vote on candidates/proposals in elections based on Catholic teaching. One of those proposals that the bishops are calling on the faithful to vote 'NO' on is Proposition 1.

The proposition is being referred to as the Equal Rights Amendment. While that sounds nice on paper (everybody wants equal rights), if you look into the language of the prop-

osition, there are many problematic implications of putting it into practice. The new language includes adding "age", "gender identity", "pregnancy", and "reproductive health" into the list of "protected" groups. These additions cause a series of problems.

First, this change could bring into question age-appropriate discrimination. We discriminate due to age all the time. Children cannot drive, drink, vote, etc. They cannot enter into relationships with adults (for obvious reasons). On the other side, we have things like senior housing and senior discounts that could be in jeopardy, since we would no longer be able to discriminate based on age.

Another evil that would come from this is that it would enshrine even more fully into law the right to have an abortion, up to the time of birth. New York is already one of the states with the least restrictions on abortion, but this amendment would make it even more difficult to not only bring an end to abortion, but even scale it back with some restrictions. The right to life is one of the most important tenents of our faith, and with every passing year, the rights of the unborn are more and more being stripped away.

Because of the removal of age-discrimination, there is a huge issue of parental rights. If kids can be treated as adults, this law would allow children to make a life-altering medical decision without parental consent. If kids are dealing with mental issues, like depression, or gender dysmorphia, schools would not have to tell parents what is going on. This cannot be tolerated, as the relationship between parents and children is sacred. No one cares about children more than parents, and children need to have parental guidance to avoid making decisions that they end up regretting in the future.

With the Church fundamentally opposing these newly created "rights", there is a danger that we and other religious organizations could lose protections that we currently have under the First Amendment. Because of religious liberty, we are allowed to believe what we want to believe and practice how we want to practice. If our beliefs go against this law, the Church could be in serious danger and become a target.

Also, the group "Coalition to Protect Kids-NY" has even more information on the ramifications of this new law, and why we need to vote "No" on it. As disciples of Christ, we have to make our voice heard in society, and one month from now, we need to use our voice to stand against this dangerous legislation.




