

# January 19, 2025 - Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### SPIRITUAL EXERCISES OF ST. IGNATIUS



Every Friday, after Mass at Holy Spirit, a small group of us gather to do the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius. It doesn't involve any jumping jacks or push-ups, but a program of prayer.


Ignatius developed the Exercises initially for those who were becoming Jesuits, and for those who wanted to deepen their prayer lives. It was a 30-day program, directed by a spiritual guide, with five or more meditations each day. Today, Jesuits make the Exercises at least twice; to help make the decision whether to become a Jesuit and then, about 10 years

later, to help decide what ministry they will choose. It's a substantial commitment to give 30 days for a retreat and many people, not Jesuits, make the Long Retreat to this day.

However, not everyone has the time to take 30 days off. Ignatius knew that, and he provided directions for folks who might want to make the Exercises in their daily life. That's what we are doing on Friday mornings. We do the same prayers and Bible readings as the 30-day version, just spread over 40 weeks. We pray 30-60 minutes each day, all of us doing the same meditation each day; then we gather every Friday to talk about how it went. There is also the opportunity for questions and advice about your prayer. Sometimes the retreatants need to learn about the topics for the next week's prayer, so there might be some instruction.

The retreat is divided into parts: first we look at sin; second, go through the life of Christ; third, walk with Christ through his passion; then the resurrection and on. This week (Dec. 28-Jan 3) we are meditating on the Shepherds and the Wise Men. We began in October and go to May.

It's a challenging but fruitful experience. I've led a half-dozen groups in three parishes through the process—it's a joy every time. Maybe the next time it'll be for you.

#### THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME January 25-26, 2025 Lk 1-4; 4:14-21

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received.

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.

Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."



### HOMELESS OUTREACH WALK

Our next Homeless Outreach walk will be on Tuesday, Jan 28th at 6:30 AM. The Homeless Outreach gives us a chance to encounter the homeless. "Walking" in a homeless person's shoes for a morning can have an impact on us all. Listening to understand the homeless and what is happening in our community can be a beneficial encounter for all.

When we encounter the homeless, we offer them food and hygiene packs. During this encounter staff from PCHO (Person Center Housing Options) and other organizations work with these individuals to pursue permanent housing for them. These workers will set up appointments for these individuals to help them find housing and other needs. During the interactions with the homeless individuals the volunteers talk and visit and get to know these individuals.




