

Morning Mass at St. Paul's Church 8:15 a.m. Mon., Tues., Wed., Fri.

- Receiving the Eucharist at daily Mass strengthens your spiritual life and makes it easier to fight the temptation to sin.
- Going to daily mass creates a structure in your life based around a time when you know you will have the opportunity to pray.
- Don't worry about your hectic schedule. Daily Mass is shorter on weekdays, so it's easier to fit into a busy schedule. There's only one reading before the Gospel and there's usually no music, which cuts down on time a lot more than you might think. Unless it's a holy day of obligation, daily Mass is around 20 to 30 minutes.

After morning Mass on Tuesdays, we pray the Devotion of the Divine Mercy and you are invited to join us.



### Make one change for God this year

When making New Year's resolutions this year, consider one change that will bring you closer to God. Here are some ideas other Catholics have used to strengthen prayer, serve the poor, and evangelize our faith ...

Norma felt her prayer life growing stale, so when her parish asked for adorers for the perpetual adoration chapel, she jumped at the chance. Now, Mondays at midnight, Norma can be found in the presence of the Eucharist. She said, "I really look forward to my peaceful hour each week. It's just me and Him."

Peter's law practice is incredibly busy, but he takes an afternoon off every month to work at the local soup kitchen serving hot meals to the homeless and working poor. When asked why he said, "Jesus said, 'When I was hungry, you gave me to eat."

JoAnn's children are grown, yet she teaches a religious education class at her parish. "What better way to spread our faith than to children? That's where I can do the most good," she said.

From Scripture....Matthew 4:12-23, The common call.

The way Jesus gathered his followers seemed almost casual. For example, he passed the Sea of Galilee, saw Andrew and Simon and called to them. It sounds as if the men dropped what they were doing, left their homes and livelihoods to follow Jesus after very little thought. There must have been something very arresting about Jesus and his call to them.

Scripture makes it clear that discipleship means leaving everything behind and surrendering to the will of God. He will provide whatever a disciple needs to follow him but nothing comes before our relationship with God and his call to us. The compelling part of his call is the chance to serve him and be close to him.

Jesus chose twelve special people to be his closest followers and he became their leader. They went where he told them and did what he asked, and accomplished amazing deeds in Jesus' name.

Jesus is still calling people to be his disciples and work amazing deeds in his name. In fact, he has called each of us to be his disciple.


